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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending January 10, 2011.

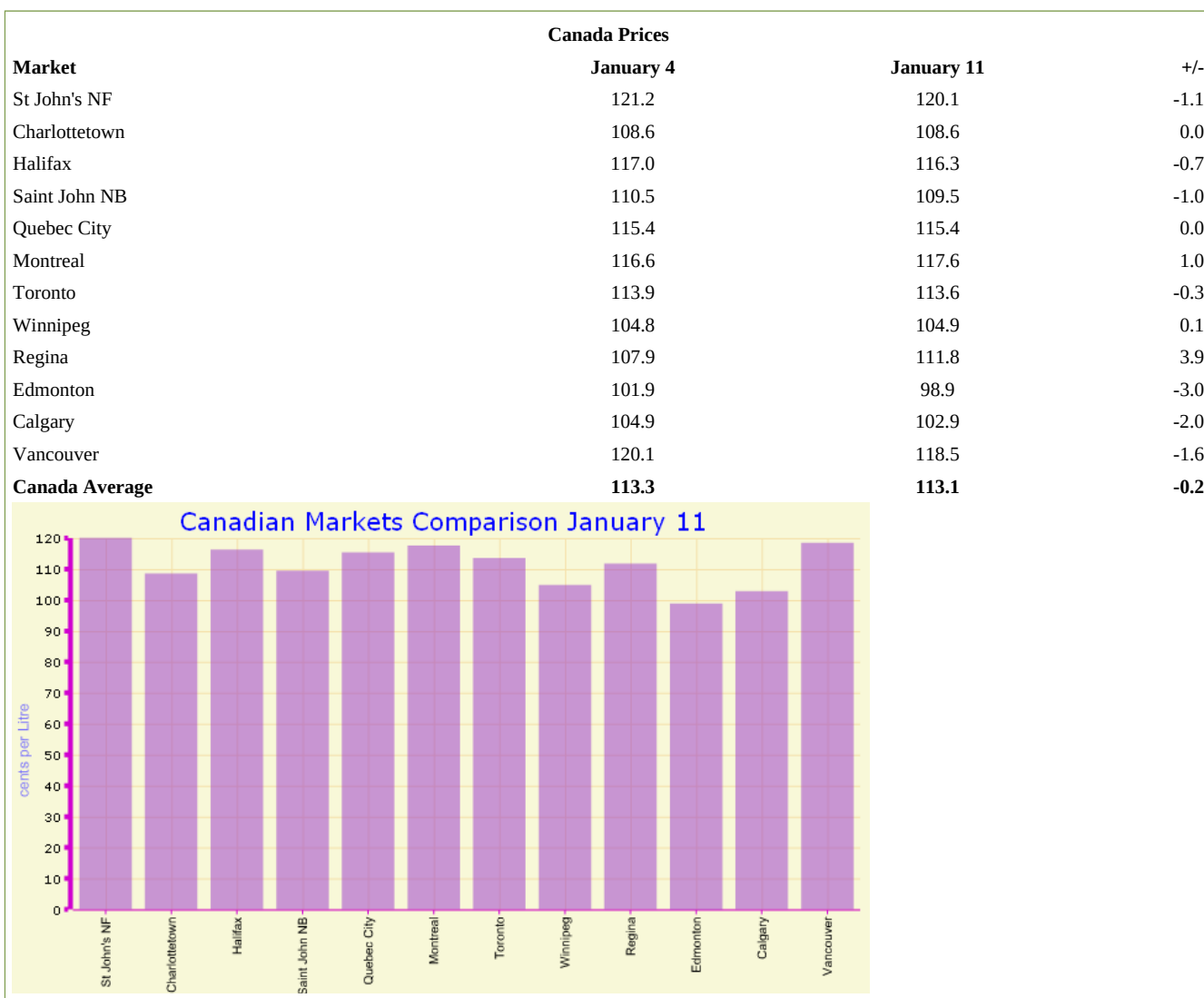
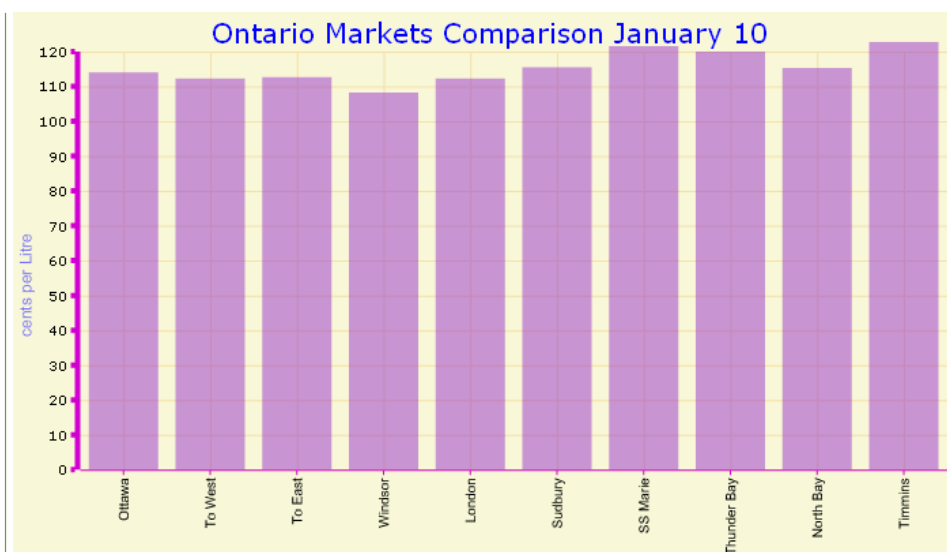
Despite higher domestic wholesale prices, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined for the second straight week, by 1.0 cents to 113.2 cents a litre.

Prices fell by 1.3 cents in both Toronto and Sudbury, 1.1 cents in both London and North Bay, 1.0 cents in Timmins, and less than a cent in Ottawa and Sault Ste. Marie (the latter from a 27-month high). Prices rose by 1.1 cents in Windsor (to a 27-month high), but remained the lowest in our survey for the 27th straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario, after shrinking two straight weeks, widened slightly to 6.0 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the fifth straight week, by 0.6 cents to 113.7 cents, its highest level since October 2008.

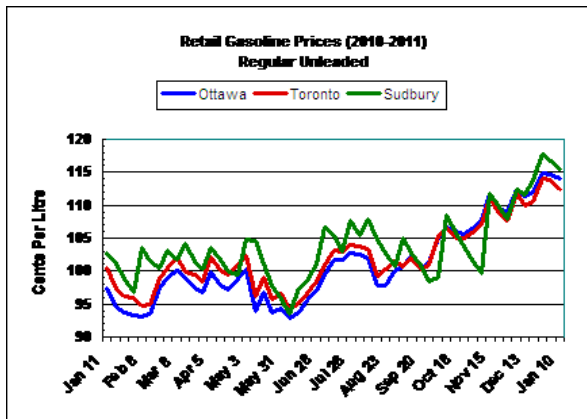
The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after increasing three straight weeks, declined by 0.2 cents from a 27-month high to 113.1 cents. Prices fell by 3.0 cents in Edmonton, 2.0 cents in Calgary (from a 27-month high), 1.6 cents in Vancouver, 1.1 cents in St. John's (from a 27-month high), 1.0 cents in Saint John (from a 27-month high), and less than a cent in Halifax (from a 27-month high) and Toronto. Prices rose by 3.9 cents in Regina (to a 27-month high), 1.0 cents in Montreal, and 0.1 cents in Winnipeg (to a 27-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the sixth straight week, by 0.3 cents to 114.0 cents, its highest level since November 2008.
