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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending February 22, 2011.

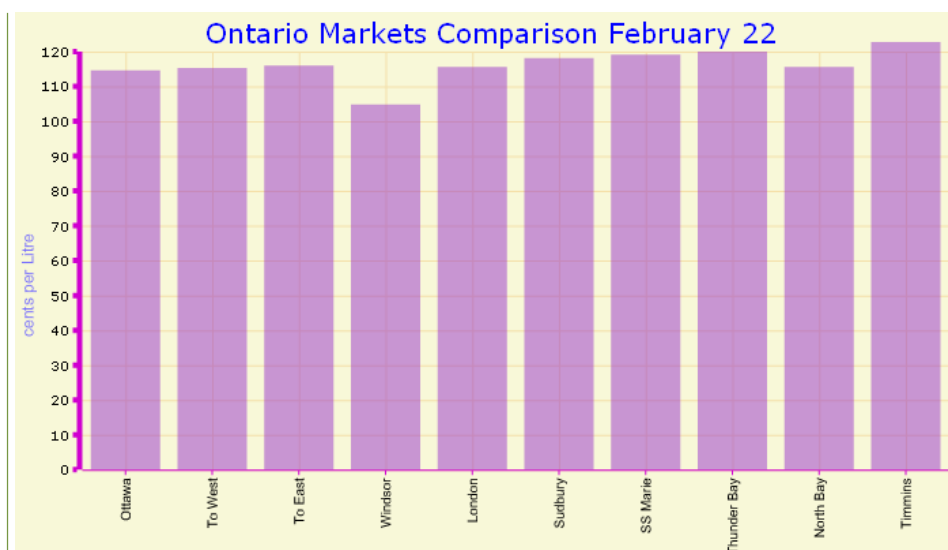
The first serious unrest to hit a major OPEC oil exporter (Libya) helped push up the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline by 1.7 cents to 115.3 cents a litre, its highest level since September 2008.

Prices rose by 2.2 cents in London and Toronto (both to a 29-month high), 2.0 cents in Ottawa (from a two-month low), and less than a cent in Sudbury and Thunder Bay (the latter from a three-month low). Prices fell by 1.7 cents in North Bay, 1.5 cents in Windsor (to a two-month low), and less than a cent in Timmins and Sault Ste. Marie (the latter to a two-month low). Windsor had the lowest average price for the 33rd straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed for the second straight week, from 6.2 cents to 4.1 cents, a three-month low. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after rising ten straight weeks, declined by 0.3 cents from a 29-month high to 120.1 cents.

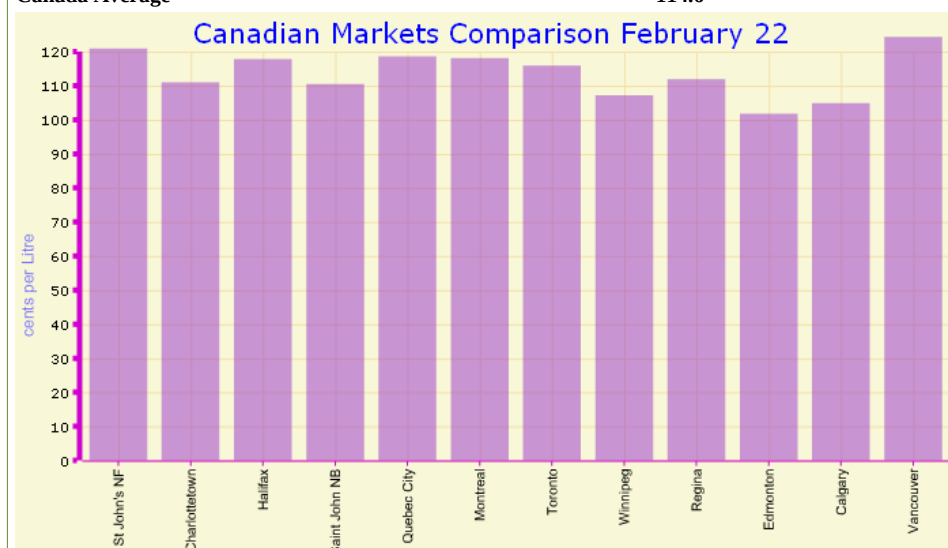
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the second straight week, by 0.5 cents to 115.1 cents. Prices rose by 2.9 cents in Edmonton, 2.5 cents in Vancouver (to a 29-month high), 2.2 cents in Calgary (from a two-month low), 1.3 cents in Halifax (to a 29-month high), 1.0 cents in Saint John (to a two-month high), and less than a cent in St. John's and Toronto (the latter to a 29-month high). Prices fell by 1.5 cents in Quebec City and less than a cent in Montreal and Winnipeg. The Canadian average retail diesel price, after rising eleven straight weeks, declined by 0.1 cents from a 28-month high to 118.5 cents.

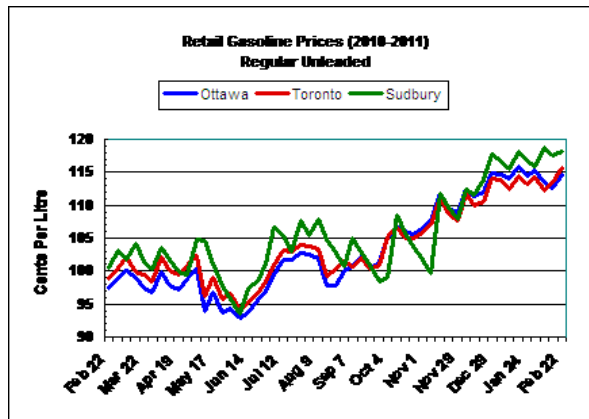
