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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending March 14, 2011.

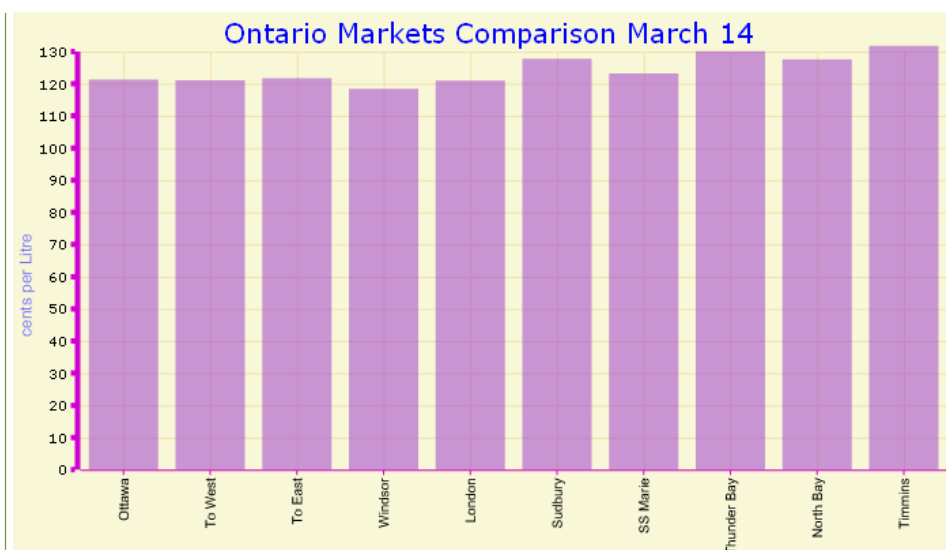
After rising four straight weeks, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined by 1.1 cents from a 30-month high to 121.9 cents a litre, reflecting lower world crude oil and North American wholesale prices.

Prices fell by 2.2 cents in London (from a 30-month high), 2.0 cents in Toronto (from a 30-month high), 1.1 cents in Ottawa (from a 30-month high), 1.0 cents in Timmins (from a 29-month high), and 0.7 cents in Sault Ste. Marie. Prices rose by 4.4 cents in Windsor, 3.9 cents in Thunder Bay, 2.3 cents in North Bay, and 2.1 cents in Sudbury (all to a 30-month high). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened to 6.9 cents from a three-month low of 3.5 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 0.3 cents to 128.0 cents, its highest level since September 2008.

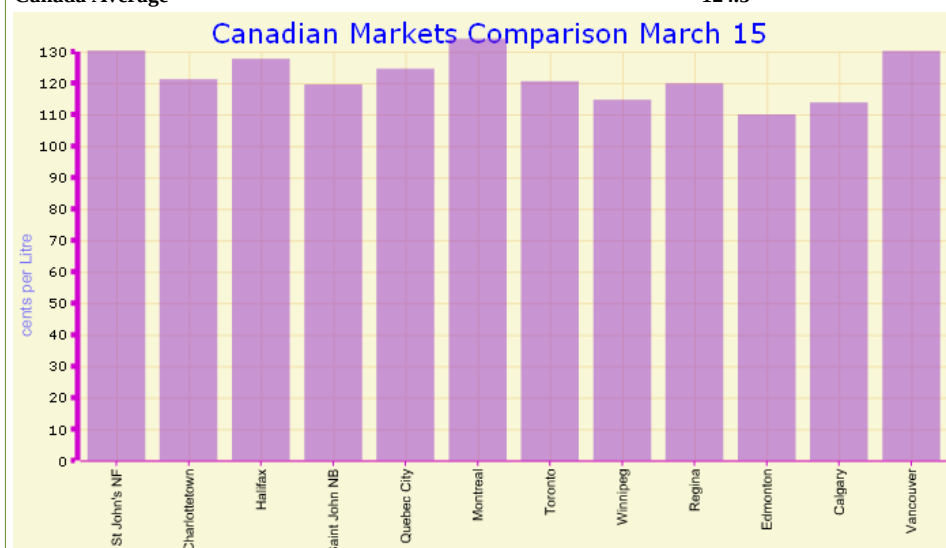
The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after increasing four straight weeks, declined by 1.0 cents from a 30-month high to 123.5 cents. Prices fell by 2.0 cents in Toronto (from a 30-month high), 1.8 cents in Winnipeg (from a 29-month high), 1.6 cents in Montreal (from a 30-month high), and less than a cent in Edmonton (from a 29-month high), Quebec City, Vancouver (from a 30-month high), and Calgary (from a 29-month high). Prices rose by 5.3 cents in Charlottetown, 2.7 cents in St. John's, 2.6 cents in Saint John, and 1.9 cents in Halifax (all to a 30-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price rose for the third week, by 2.0 cents to 126.4 cents, its highest level since October 2008.

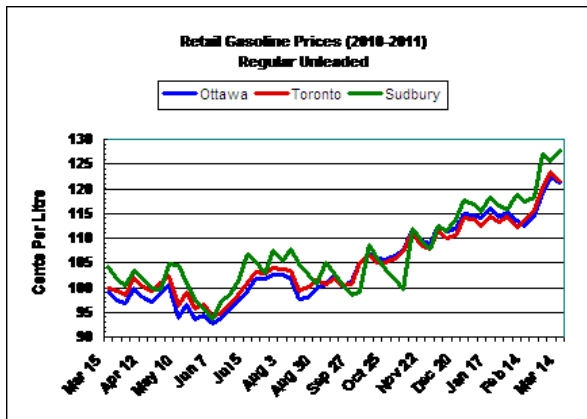
