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## GASOLINE REPORT

### Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending April 11, 2011.

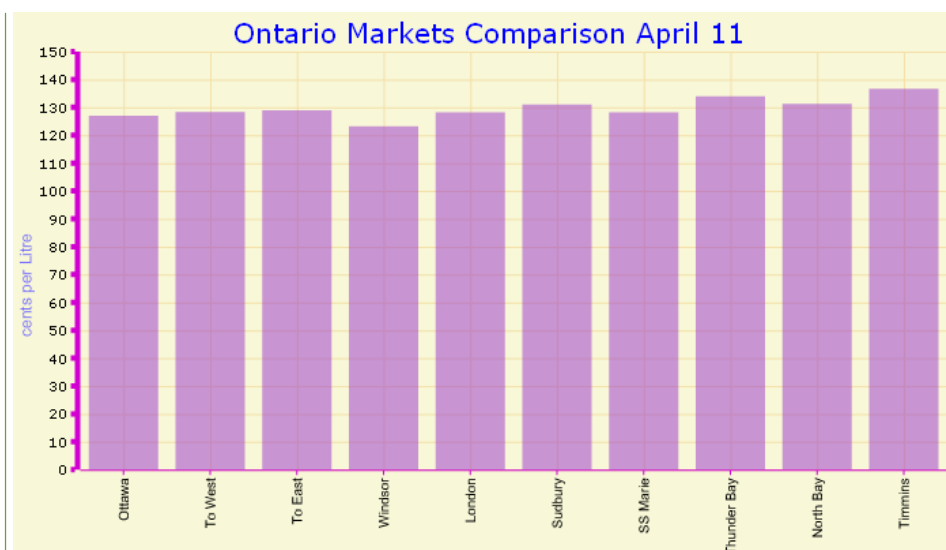
**West Texas crude oil prices above US\$112 a barrel and higher North American wholesale prices helped push up the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline for the third straight week, by 0.3 cents to 128.4 cents a litre, its highest level since September 2008.**

Prices rose by 5.6 cents in Windsor (to a 31-month high), 4.1 cents in North Bay (to a 31-month high), 3.6 cents in Thunder Bay (to a 31-month high), 3.2 cents in Sudbury (to a 31-month high), 1.9 cents in both Sault Ste. Marie (to a 30-month high) and Timmins (to a 31-month high), and 0.8 cents in Ottawa (to a 31-month high). Prices fell by 0.7 cents in Toronto and London (both from a 31-month high). The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the seventh straight week, by 1.0 cents to 130.1 cents, its highest level since August 2008.

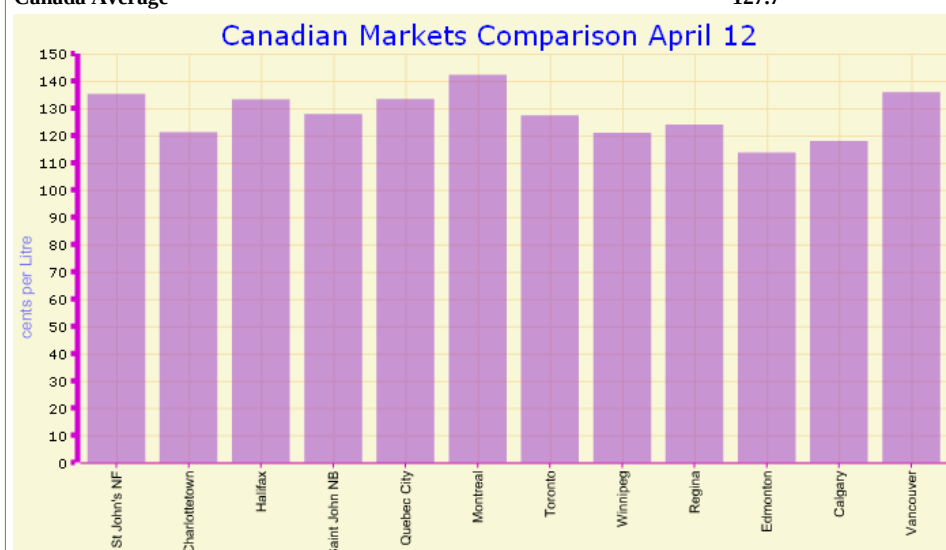
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the third straight week, by 2.0 cents to 129.7 cents, its highest level since September 2008. Prices rose by 7.7 cents in Winnipeg and Calgary (both to a 30-month high), 7.5 cents in Edmonton (to a 30-month high), 4.0 cents in Quebec City (to a 31-month high), 2.8 cents in Halifax and Montreal (both to a 31-month high), 2.4 cents in St. John's and Saint John (both to a 31-month high), 1.3 cents in Regina (to a 30-month high), and 0.9 cents in Vancouver (to a 31-month high). Prices fell by 0.6 cents in Toronto (from a 31-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the seventh straight week, by 0.6 cents to 128.1 cents, its highest level since September 2008.

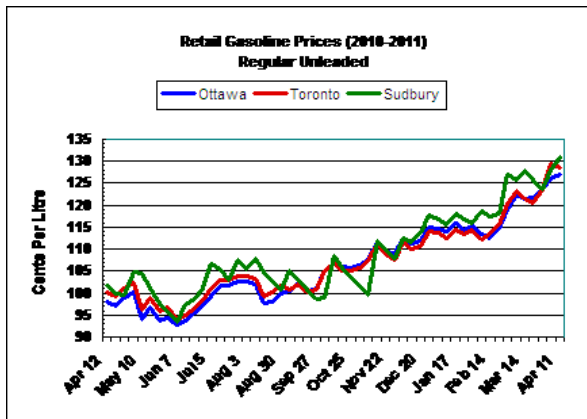
