Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending April 18, 2011.

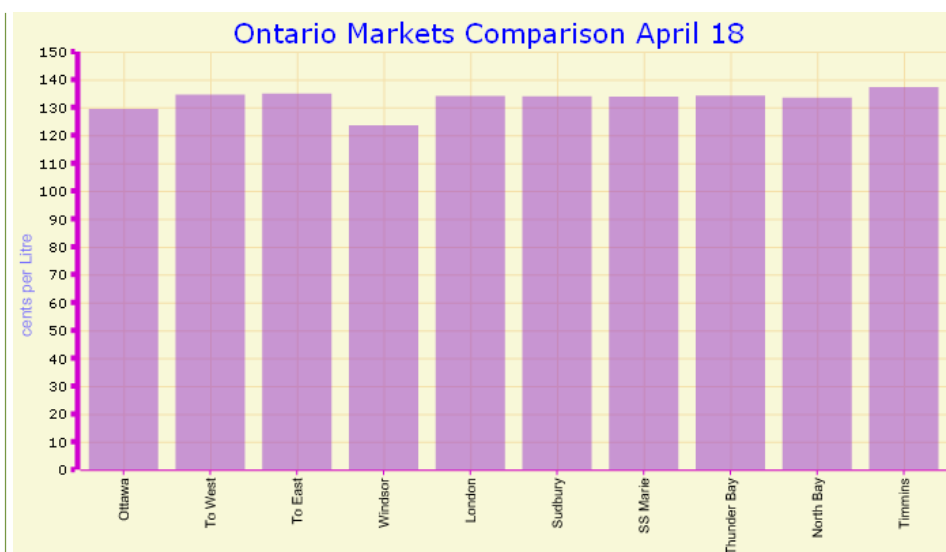
The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the fourth straight week, by 4.7 cents to 133.1 cents a litre, its highest level since September 2008, reflecting higher North American wholesale prices.

Prices rose by 6.1 cents in Toronto, 5.9 cents in London, 5.6 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, 2.9 cents in Sudbury, 2.4 cents in Ottawa, 2.3 cents in North Bay, and less than a cent in Timmins, Windsor, and Thunder Bay (all to a 31-month high). Windsor had the lowest average price for the third straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed from 3.9 cents to 1.3 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after increasing seven straight weeks, was unchanged at 130.1 cents, its highest level since August 2008.

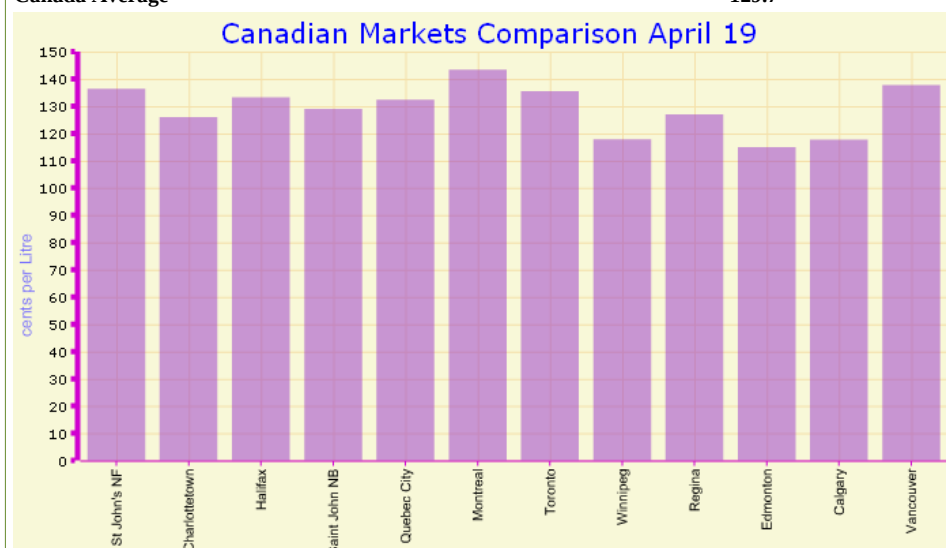
The Canadian average gasoline price increased for the fourth straight week, by 3.7 cents to 133.4 cents, its highest level since September 2008. Prices rose by 8.2 cents in Toronto (to a 33-month high), 4.8 cents in Charlottetown (to a 31-month high), 3.0 cents in Regina (to a 31-month high), 1.9 cents in Vancouver (to a 31-month high), 1.2 cents in both Montreal (to a 31-month high) and Edmonton (to a 30-month high), and 1.1 cents in St. John's and Saint John (both to a 31-month high). Prices fell by 3.1 cents in Winnipeg (from a 30-month high), 1.1 cents in Quebec City (from a 31-month high), and 0.2 cents in Calgary (from a 30-month high). The Canadian average diesel price increased for the eighth straight week, by 0.4 cents to 128.5 cents, its highest level since September 2008.

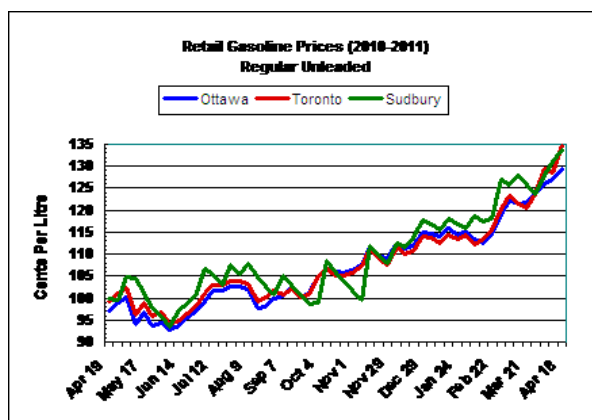
