Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending April 25, 2011.

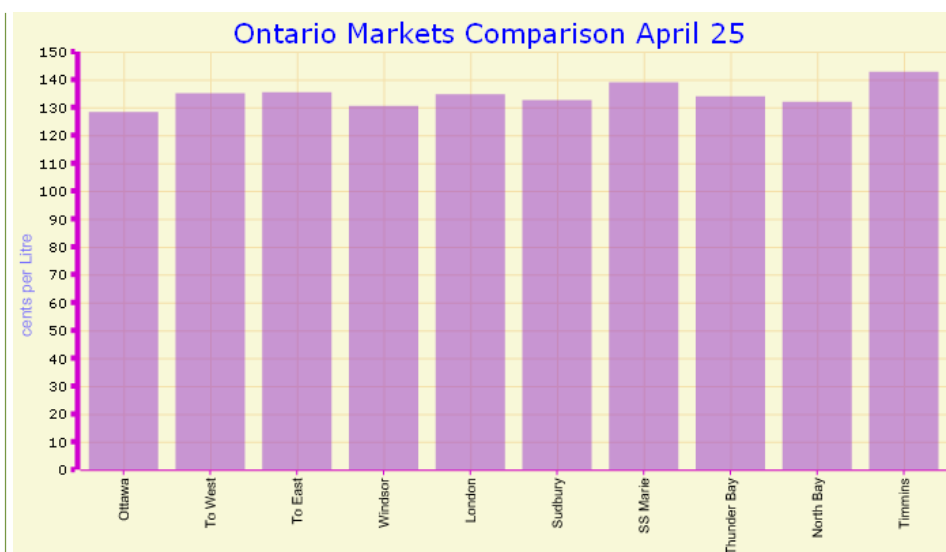
Higher world crude oil and North American wholesale prices caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase for the fifth straight week, by 0.5 cents to 133.6 cents a litre, its highest level since September 2008.

Prices rose by 7.0 cents in Windsor (to a 31-month high), 5.6 cents in Timmins (to a 31-month high), 5.2 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a 33-month high), and less than a cent in London and Toronto (both to a 31-month high). Prices fell by 1.5 cents in North Bay, 1.3 cents in Sudbury, 1.1 cents in Ottawa, and 0.3 cents in Thunder Bay (all from a 31-month high). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened slightly to 1.4 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined by 0.2 cents from a 32-month high to 129.9 cents.

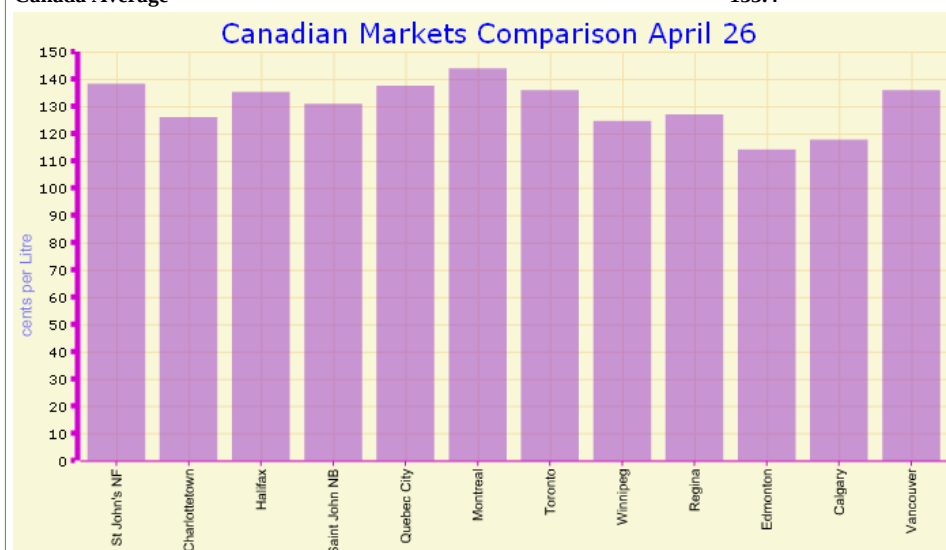
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the fifth straight week, by 0.5 cents to 133.9 cents, its highest level since September 2008. Prices rose by 6.8 cents in Winnipeg (to a 31-month high), 5.2 cents in Quebec City (to a 31-month high), 2.0 cents in Halifax (to a 31-month high), 1.9 cents in St. John's and Saint John (both to a 31-month high), and 0.4 cents in both Montreal and Toronto (the latter to a Kent survey record 135.9 cents). Prices fell by 1.8 cents in Vancouver (from a 31-month high) and 0.9 cents in Edmonton (from a 30-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price, after increasing eight straight weeks, declined by 0.1 cents from a 31-month high to 128.4 cents.

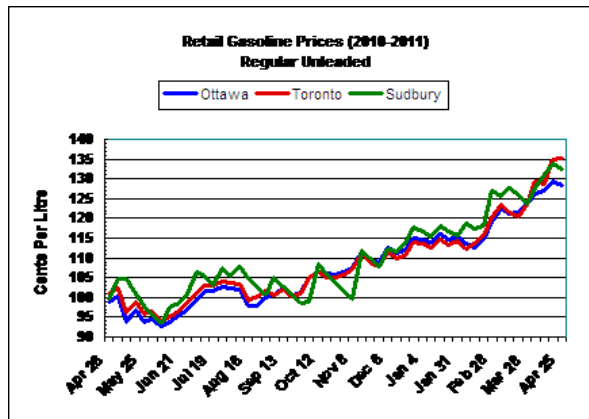
