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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending May 2, 2011.

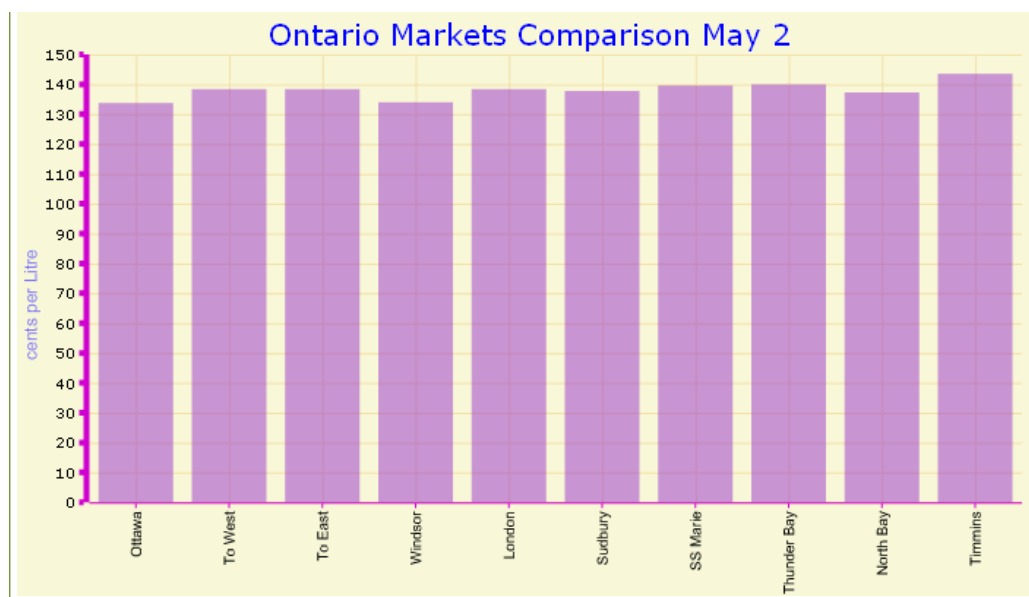
The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the sixth straight week, by 3.7 cents to 137.3 cents a litre, its highest level since September 2008, reflecting West Texas crude oil prices of nearly US\$114 a barrel and higher North American wholesale prices.

Prices rose by 6.0 cents in Thunder Bay (to a 32-month high), 5.4 cents in Ottawa (to a 32-month high), 5.2 cents in Sudbury and North Bay (both to a 34-month high), 3.6 cents in London (to a record high), 3.4 cents in Windsor (to a 32-month high), 3.2 cents in Toronto (to a record high), and less than a cent in Timmins (to a 32-month high) and Sault Ste. Marie (to a 33-month high). The Ontario average retail diesel price increased by 0.1 cents to 130.0 cents.

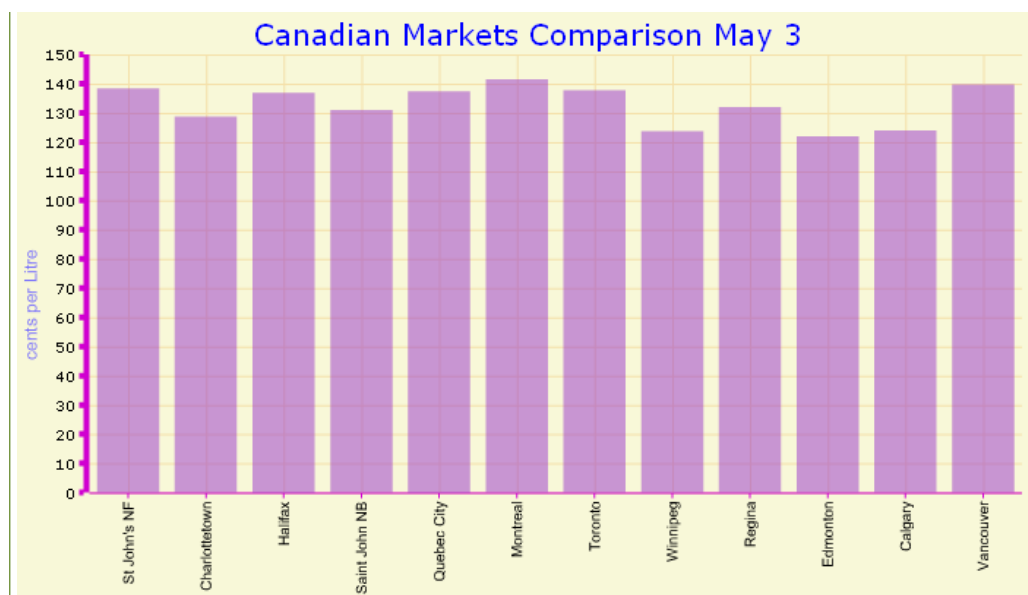
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the sixth straight week, by 1.8 cents to 135.7 cents, its highest level since September 2008. Prices rose by 7.9 cents in Edmonton, 6.2 cents in Calgary, 5.0 cents in Regina, 3.8 cents in Vancouver, 2.7 cents in Charlottetown, 1.8 cents in Toronto, 1.7 cents in Halifax, and 0.1 cents in both Saint John and St. John's, all to a 32-month high except in Toronto, where prices were at a record high. Prices fell by 2.3 cents in Montreal and less than a cent in Winnipeg and Quebec City (all from a 31-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 0.1 cents to 128.3 cents.

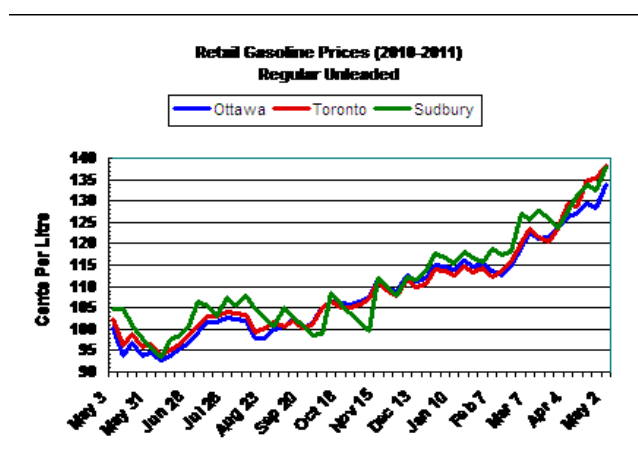
