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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending May 30, 2011.

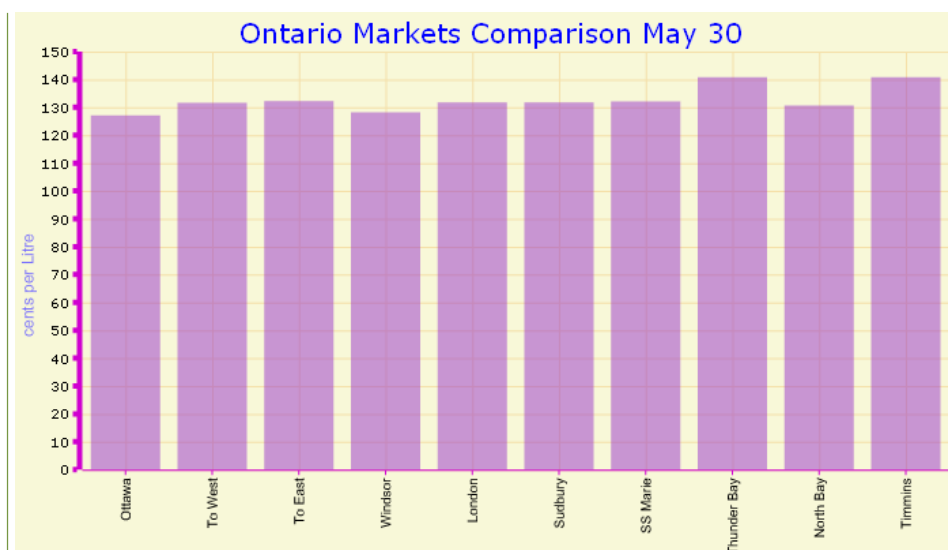
The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline, after declining three straight weeks, increased by 3.3 cents from a two-month low to 131.2 cents a litre, reflecting higher world crude oil and North American wholesale prices.

Prices rose by 5.1 cents in Ottawa (from a two-month low), 3.7 cents in Toronto (from a two-month low), 3.6 cents in London (from a two-month low), and 1.7 cents in Windsor. Prices fell by 2.6 cents in North Bay (to a two-month low), 1.9 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a two-month low), 1.5 cents in Sudbury (to a two-month low), 1.2 cents in Thunder Bay, and 0.8 cents in Timmins. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after declining three straight weeks, was unchanged at a three-month low of 123.8 cents.

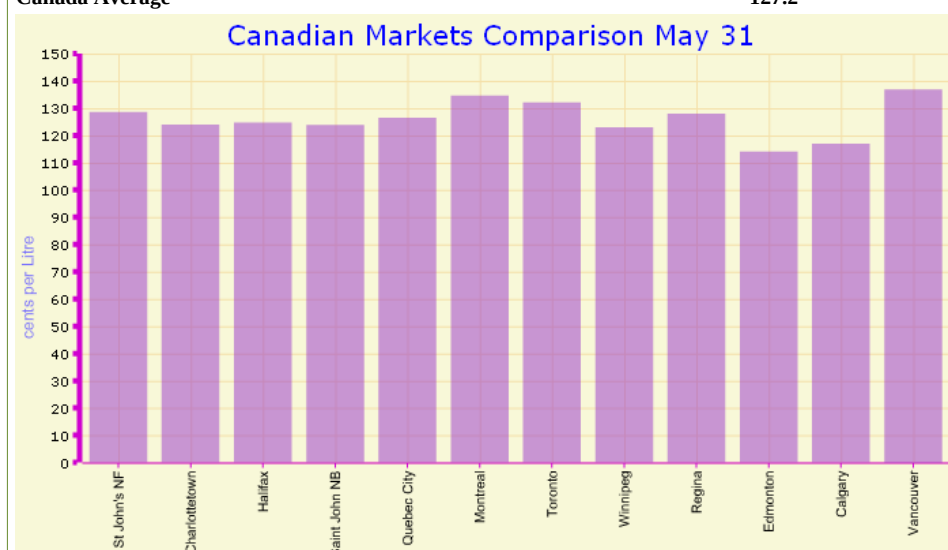
The Canadian retail gasoline price, after declining three straight weeks, increased by 2.7 cents from a two-month low to 129.9 cents. Prices rose by 8.2 cents in Montreal (from a two-month low), 3.7 cents in Toronto, 1.9 cents in Vancouver (from a two-month low), and less than a cent in Charlottetown and Saint John. Prices fell by 3.6 cents in St. John's (to a three-month low), 3.0 cents in Quebec City (to a two-month low), 2.7 cents in Edmonton (to a two-month low), 2.1 cents in Winnipeg, and 2.0 cents in both Calgary (to a two-month low) and Regina. The Canadian retail diesel price declined for the sixth straight week, by 0.4 cents to 124.0 cents, a three-month low.

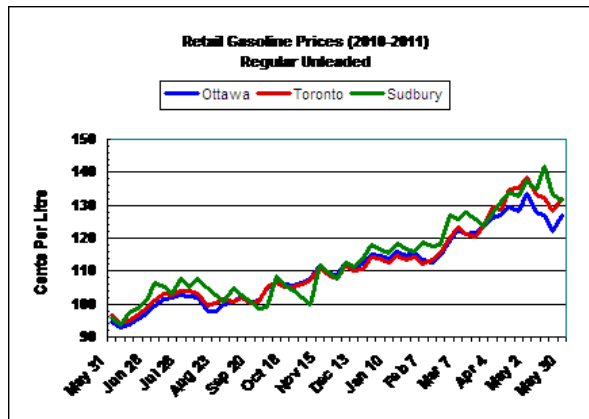
