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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending July 18, 2011.

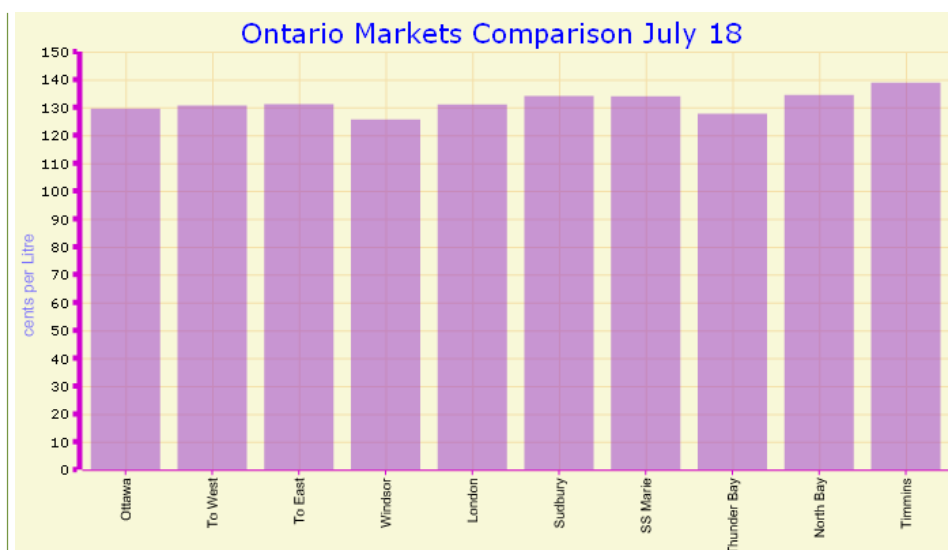
Despite a modest decline in domestic wholesale prices, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the third straight week, by 1.4 cents to 130.6 cents a litre, a two-month high.

Prices rose by 6.4 cents in Sault Ste. Marie , 2.4 cents in Windsor, and 1.6 cents in Ottawa, London, and Toronto (all to a two-month high). Prices fell by 2.5 cents in Sudbury (from a two-month high), 2.0 cents in North Bay (from a two-month high), 1.8 cents in Thunder Bay, and 0.9 cents in Timmins. Windsor had the lowest average price for the fourth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed from 4.5 cents to 2.3 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 0.3 cents to 123.7 cents, a four-week high.

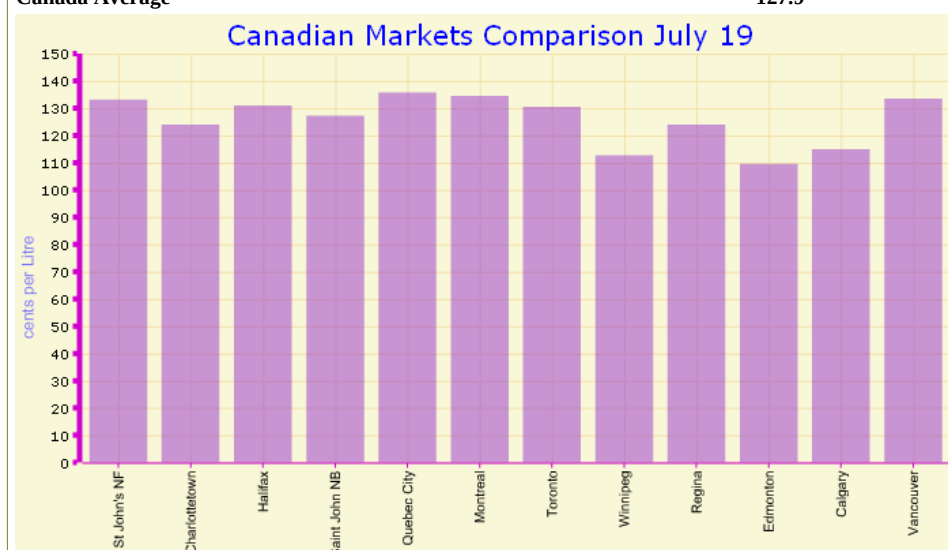
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the third straight week, by 0.5 cents to 128.4 cents, a two-month high. Prices rose by 6.0 cents in Charlottetown (to a two-month high), 5.2 cents in Halifax (to a two-month high), 4.3 cents in St. John's (to a two-month high), 4.1 cents in Saint John (to a two-month high), 3.3 cents in Quebec City (to a two-month high), and less than a cent in Toronto (to a two-month high), Vancouver and Calgary. Prices fell by 2.7 cents in Edmonton, 2.1 cents in Winnipeg, and 0.6 cents in Montreal (from a two-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 0.9 cents to 123.5 cents, a four-week high.

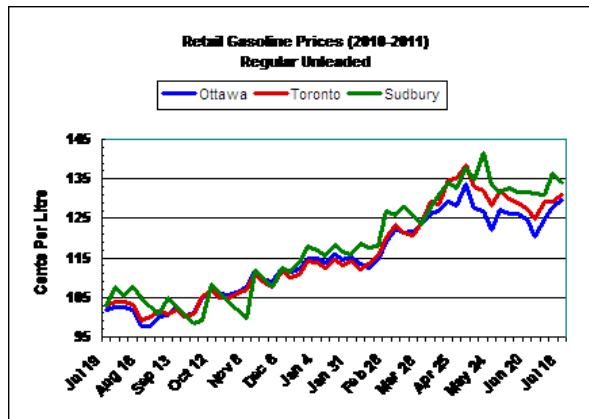
