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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending September 26, 2011.

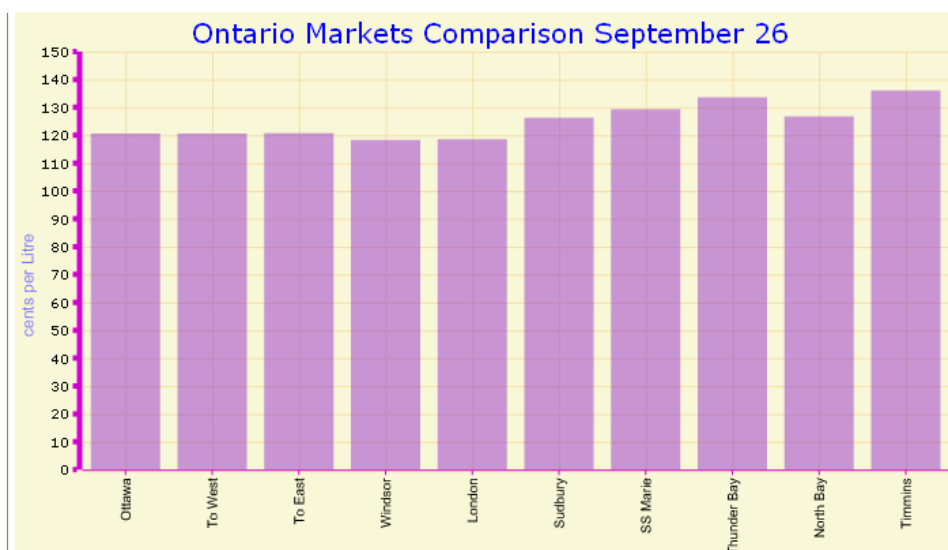
World crude oil prices below US\$80 a barrel and lower North American wholesale prices caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline for the third straight week, by 3.4 cents to 121.4 cents a litre, a six-month low.

Prices fell by 5.6 cents in Sudbury (to a six-month low), 4.9 cents in North Bay, 4.2 cents in Windsor, 3.9 cents in Ottawa (to a three-month low), 3.5 cents in Toronto (to a six-month low), 3.2 cents in London (to a seven-month low), 1.9 cents in Timmins (to a six-month low), and less than a cent in Thunder Bay and Sault Ste. Marie. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 0.3 cents to 123.0 cents, a four-week low. In the third quarter of 2011, the Ontario gasoline price averaged 127.8 cents, up 26.1 cents from the same period in 2010, and the Ontario diesel price averaged 123.3 cents, up 23.9 cents.

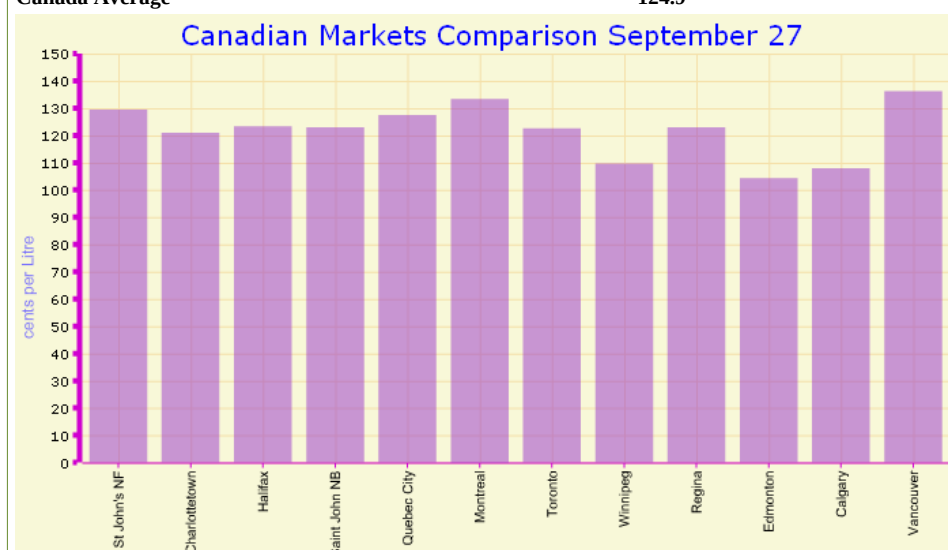
The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the third straight week, by 1.0 cents to 123.9 cents, a six-month low. Prices fell by 5.0 cents in Calgary (to a seven-month low), 4.4 cents in Edmonton (to a seven-month low) and Saint John, 3.6 cents in Regina (to a six-month low), 3.3 cents in Halifax and St. John's, 3.2 cents in Winnipeg (to a three-month low), 1.4 cents in Vancouver (from a four-month high), and 0.9 cents in Quebec City. Prices rose by 2.0 cents in Montreal (to a two-month high) and 0.1 cents in Toronto (from a six-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price rose by 0.4 cents to 124.0 cents. In the third quarter of 2011, the Canadian gasoline price averaged 126.9 cents, up 24.2 cents from the same period in 2010, and the Canadian diesel price averaged 123.1 cents, up 24.2 cents.

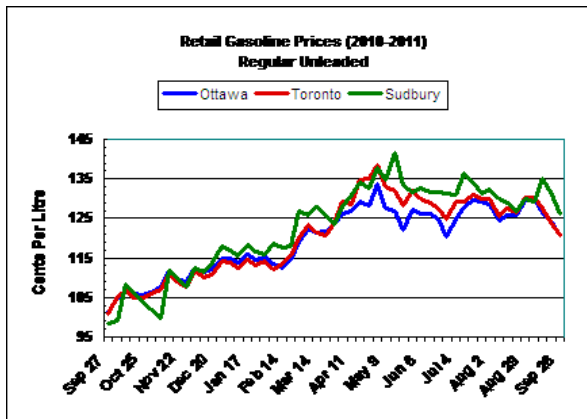
