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GASOLINE REPORT

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The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending October 24, 2011.

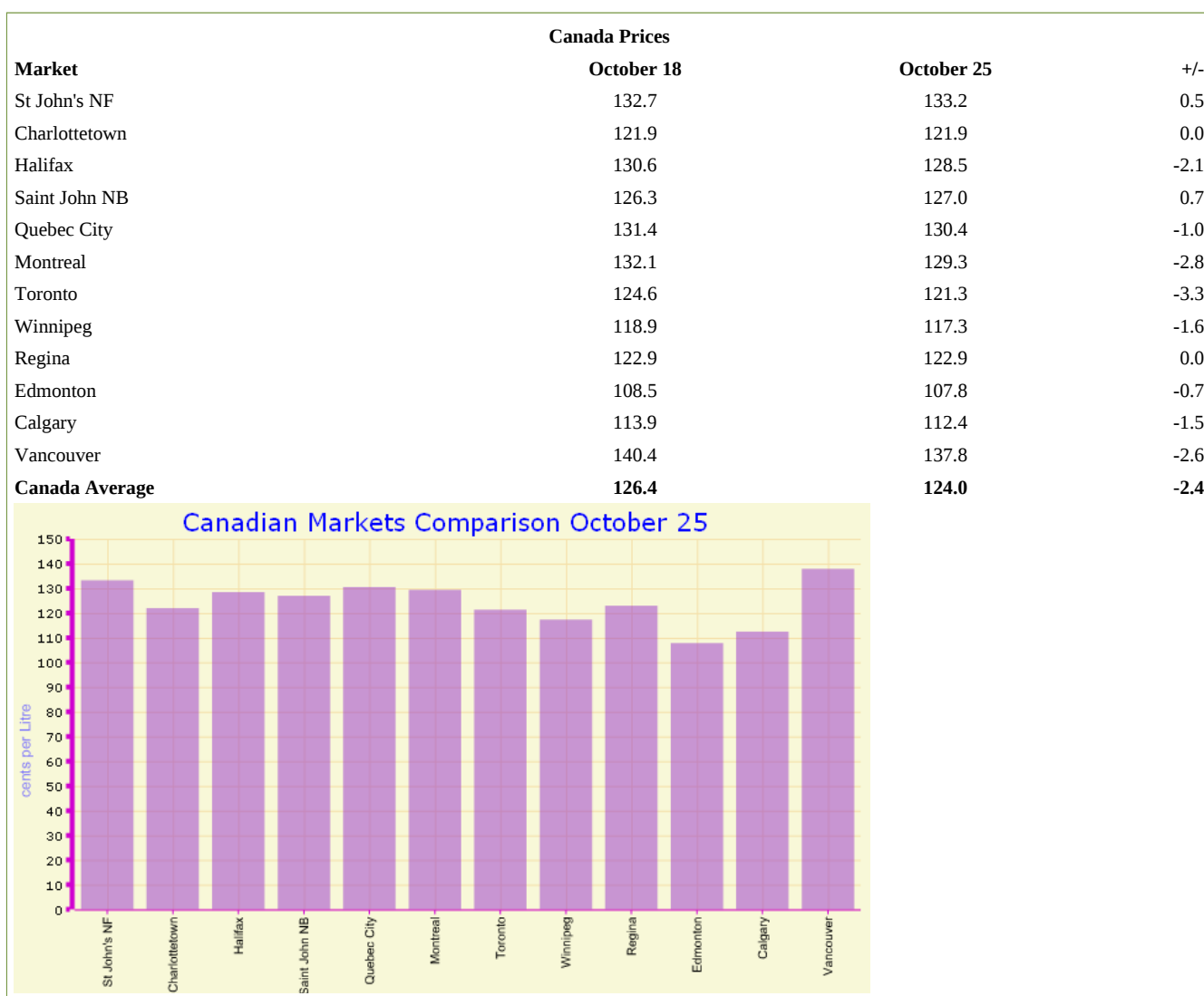
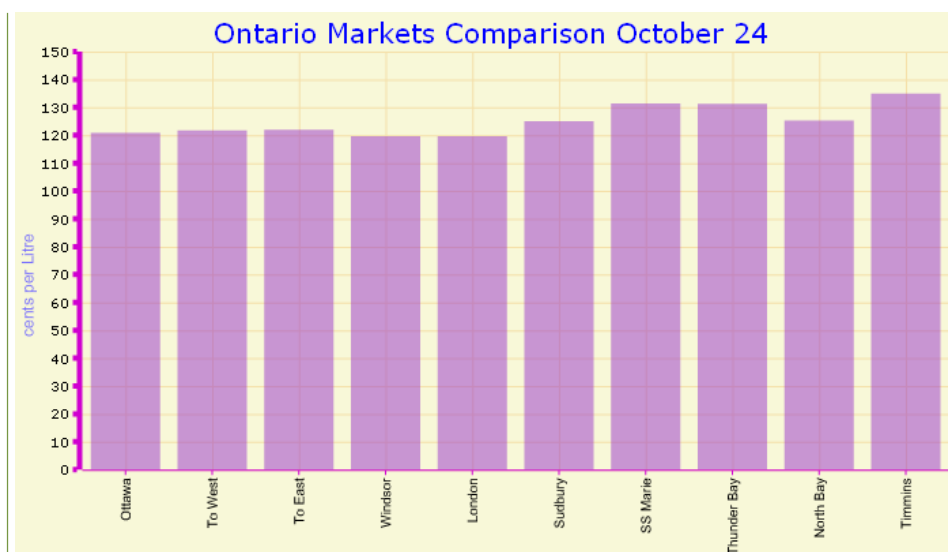
The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline, after increasing three straight weeks, declined by 5.0 cents to 122.1 cents a litre, a four-week low, reflecting lower North American wholesale prices.

Prices fell by 6.0 cents in Ottawa, 5.2 cents in Toronto, 5.1 cents in London, 4.6 cents in Sudbury and North Bay, 2.6 cents in Windsor, 2.0 cents in Timmins, and less than a cent in Thunder Bay (to a two-month low) and Sault Ste. Marie (from a two-month high). Windsor had the lowest average price (tied with London) for the third straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened from 4.8 cents to 7.5 cents, a four-week high. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 1.9 cents to 125.9 cents, a six-month high.

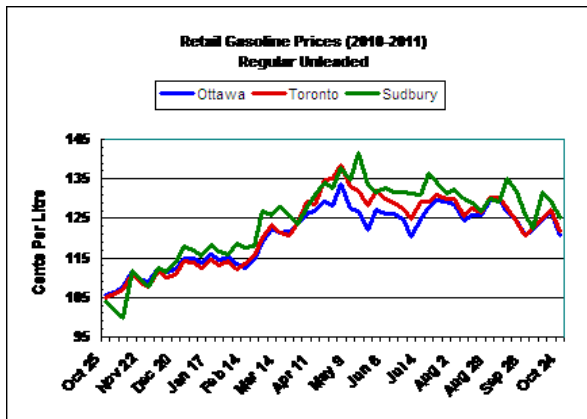
The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after increasing two straight weeks, declined by 2.4 cents to 124.0 cents. Prices fell by 3.3 cents in Toronto (to a seven-month low), 2.8 cents in Montreal (to a five-month low), 2.6 cents in Vancouver (from a 37-month high), 2.1 cents in Halifax, 1.6 cents in Winnipeg (from a two-month high), 1.5 cents in Calgary, 1.0 cents in Quebec City, and 0.7 cents in Edmonton. Prices rose by less than a cent in Saint John and St. John's. The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 1.3 cents to 128.8 cents, its highest level since September 2008.
