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INTRODUCTION

The young workers of today are the leaders of tomorrow. Focusing on young workers and making safety an integral part of young workers' lives is just one of the ways the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB) is working to make Ontario's workplaces safer – now, and in the future. The WSIB is committed to preventing workplace injuries and illnesses and plays a key role in the province's occupational health and safety system. By targeting young workers, the WSIB is helping to foster a workplace safety culture in Ontario workplaces.

Twelve years ago, the WSIB started a public awareness campaign aimed at workers under the age of 25. Young workers often lack the experience to recognize and avoid workplace hazards. Promoting awareness of workplace safety and understanding of workplace rights and responsibilities among young workers is the first step towards preventing injuries, illnesses, and fatalities on the job. Through partnerships with organizations throughout the province, including the Ministry of Labour, the WSIB continues to implement effective solutions that will lead to the elimination of all workplace injuries and illnesses.

This is the seventh publication of the *Young Worker Statistics*. Allowed young worker claims information presents injuries, illnesses, and fatalities covered by the WSIB of Ontario for this demographic over the five-year period (2006 to 2010).

The numbers presented for each year include lost time and no lost time claims allowed as at March 31 of the following year, and match the numbers as reported in the WSIB's *Statistical Supplement to the 2010 Annual Report* document. Two age groups (15-19 years and 20-24 years) are included for young workers under 25 years of age.

Traumatic fatalities reported over the five-year period in this document are WSIB allowed fatalities by year of death of workers from traumatic injuries or other immediate causes where the employers have coverage under the *Workplace Safety and Insurance Act* (WSIA). Fatalities only include those caused by the original traumatic injury. These particular numbers cannot be compared to the WSIB's *Statistical Supplement to the 2010 Annual Report* document or to the 2010 Health & Safety Statistics due to differences in the reporting criteria.

ALLOWED CLAIMS PROFILES (2006 to 2010)

Tables 1 and 2

Table 1 presents the total number of allowed lost time and no lost time claims as reported in the WSIB's *Statistical Supplement to the 2010 Annual Report* document. The total number of allowed lost time claims for young workers include the "15-19 years" and "20-24 years" age categories. The total number of allowed lost time claims for workers of other ages has been consolidated and reported as "Other age groups."

Overall, young workers 15-24 years of age accounted for approximately 16% of Ontario's allowed lost time and no lost time claims covered by the WSIB from 2006 to 2010. During this five-year period, young worker lost time claims represented approximately 13% (46,134) of all allowed lost time claims, and young worker no lost time claims represented approximately 17% (133,946) of all allowed no lost time claims.

Table 2 presents WSIB allowed traumatic fatalities by year of death of workers from traumatic injuries or other immediate causes where the employers have coverage under the *Workplace Safety and Insurance Act* (WSIA). Fatalities only include those caused by the original traumatic injury.

From 2006 to 2010, there were 32 allowed traumatic fatalities for young workers under 25 years of age. This represented approximately 9% of allowed traumatic fatalities covered by the WSIB.

YOUNG WORKER LOST TIME CLAIMS PROFILES (2006 to 2010)

Tables 3 to 13

Tables 3 to 13 present detailed claims profiles for allowed lost time claims for young workers 15-24 years of age. Claims by workers who have lost wages as a result of a temporary or permanent impairment are lost time claims.

Summary

During the years 2006 to 2010:

- Young workers sustained 46,134 allowed lost time claims with workers 15-19 years of age accounting for 29% (13,334) and workers 20-24 years of age accounting for 71% (32,800).
- The industry sectors with the highest number of allowed lost time claims were Services and Manufacturing.
- The most common work-related injuries included Sprains and Strains, Cuts/Lacerations/Punctures, and Bruises/Contusions.
- The Lower Back and Finger(s)/Fingernail(s) were the parts of body most frequently affected.
- The majority of allowed lost time claims occurred when young workers were Struck by Objects and Equipment or due to Overexertion.
- Persons, Containers/Boxes/Barrels/Packages, and Structures were the most frequent sources of injury.
- Young workers employed in occupations such as Sales and Service, Transport/Equipment Operators, and Labourers in Processing, Manufacturing and Utilities had the highest number of allowed lost time claims.

Summary

During the years 2006 to 2010:

- Young workers sustained 133,946 allowed no lost time claims with workers 15-19 years of age accounting for 31% (41,482) and workers 20-24 years of age accounting for 69% (92,464).
- The industry sectors with the highest number of allowed no lost time claims were Services and Manufacturing.

- Young workers employed in occupations such as Construction Trades and Transport Equipment Operating had the highest number of allowed traumatic fatality claims.
