Health Care Matters

Our Community Engagement Framework

Integrated Health Services Plan

As mentioned in the last newsletter, a Steering Committee and three Geographic Teams have been established to assist in developing the Integrated Health Services Plan, which identifies the health care priorities for the LHIN over the next 3 years. The groups have each had their initial meeting, have been reviewing health information on each of the geographic areas, and started initial discussions on the issues for their community.

As a baseline for data, we have been fortunate to have the reports prepared by the former Essex, Kent and Lambton District Health Council: the Health System Monitoring Report, and Painting the Picture Reports on each of the communities. Each of the groups has been reviewing these reports, and the data is in the process of being updated.

Celebrating Innovations in Health Care Expo

The Ministry of Health and the Local Health Integration Networks co-sponsored the "Celebrating Innovations in Health Care Expo" that was held in April in Toronto. The purpose of the Expo was to showcase innovative health care solutions that are happening across the province.

For our LHIN, there were five excellent projects submitted. Congratulations to our Innovators for highlighting their creative ways to improve care for patients! A brief synopsis of the projects is presented below.

Tracheostomy Self Care Guide for Patients and their Family/Caregivers

Windsor-Essex Community Care Access Centre (CCAC) - This project demonstrated the collaboration of multiple stakeholders, championed by the palliative care physician, in developing a booklet for the care and maintenance of a tracheostomy in the home environment. This booklet was developed as a teaching tool and resource for patients, families and other caregivers.

Discharge Case Management

Bluewater Health - and the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) have partnered to develop a model of discharge planning and care where the planners are based in the community. The goal is to provide seamless access to community based services in a timely manner. CMHA will work with the Bluewater Health staff and patients with a mental illness to help them move from the hospital to the community.

References and Guidelines for Utilization of Symptom Response Kits

Windsor Essex County Community Care Access Centre - Community home care nursing agencies, community pharmacists, palliative care physicians, and the CCAC developed Symptom Response Kits (SRK) to enable the patient to remain at home during the end of life. The kit ensures that the appropriate medications are in the home for the caregiver to administer in a timely fashion as symptoms and changes in pain level occur. This has been a very successful program that is gradually expanding to other Community Care Access Centre regions.

Ownerships & Partnerships to Optimize Information Technology Benefits

Consolidated Health Information Services (CHIS) - A not-for-profit organization was incorporated to provide Information Technology (IT) services to health care organizations. The company is jointly owned by Windsor Regional Hospital and the Chatham-Kent Health Alliance with the goal of optimizing current IT strengths in each of the organizations, to expedite the journey to an electronic health record and to gain efficiencies through consolidation of IT staff, services and systems.

Chatham/Kent & Sarnia-Lambton CCAC Leadership Development Program

Chatham-Kent & Sarnia-Lambton Community Care Access Centres - Recognizing the importance of leadership development to an organization, the CCACs have developed an in-house program to support their managers who are often called upon to inspire staff to move forward and change. Using a combination of internal and external expertise, managers are able to learn together, in an inter-disciplinary approach, the skills needed to lead the health care organization to success despite a challenging environment.

Plan to Improve Access to Critical Care Services

Dr. Michael Sharpe has been named as the Critical Care Leader for the Erie St. Clair and South West LHINs. The Critical Care Leader will help implement the province's plan to improve access to critical care services.

As Critical Care LHIN Leader, Dr. Sharpe will work with the LHIN to develop plans on the best use of critical care resources in the area. Dr. Sharpe will also work with the other Critical Care Leaders across the province to provide advice to the government on critical care issues.

Dr. Sharpe is currently a full-time intensivist at London Health Sciences Centre's, University Hospital and a professor of anesthesia and perioperative medicine at the University of Western Ontario.
