North East LHIN Health Service Provider Profiles Now Available On-Line

The North East LHIN has developed a comprehensive set of Health Service Provider Profiles to inform and support health system planning across 6 planning areas in the North East including: Algoma, Cochrane, Manitoulin - Sudbury, Timiskaming, Nipissing and Parry Sound.

The profiles are intended as an inventory of existing programs and services delivered by both LHIN funded and non-LHIN funded Health Service Providers and include basic contact, financial and service information.

LHIN-funded providers include: hospitals, long-term care homes, community support

services, mental health and addictions agencies, Community Care Access Centre (CCAC) and community health centres.

Non-LHIN funded providers/partners include: ambulance services providers, public health units, family health teams and nursing stations. Not all non-LHIN funded programs were invited to submit a profile in this first phase of the Health Service Provider Profiles inventory. Additional programs will be added as resources permit.

The HSP Profiles will more fully reflect the range of programs and services provided in the North East LHIN as more HSPs submit their organization's information. If you have not yet submitted information for your organization, watch for future invitations to do so. However, the current document is a valuable tool for planning, community engagement, and integration initiatives.

The profiles can be accessed through the **Health Service Provider Portal** accessible from the "[For Health Service Providers](#)" section on our website at www.nelhin.on.ca. Each health service provider was granted access via ED or CEO login credentials.

A detailed inventory of Aboriginal/First Nation/Métis HSPs profiles is currently being undertaken as part of a broader Environmental Scan and will be added to this document when available.

The Award program has been expanded for 2008, with two \$25,000 and five \$5,000 awards to be granted.
