Ontario Health Study - Call for Sudburians between the ages of 35 and 69

In September 2009, the Ontario Health Study opened an assessment centre in Sudbury – one of only three in the province. As part of a 20-year, long-term study, the centre is looking to recruit participants to examine the risk factors and causes of cancer, cardiovascular disease and prevention of chronic disease.

Four government funded organizations are leading the Ontario Health Study:

1. The Ontario Institute for Cancer Research
2. Cancer Care Ontario
3. The Canadian Partnership Against Cancer
4. The Ontario Agency for Health Protection and Promotion

To date, the community response and interest has been very positive with 1,000 Sudburians that have completed assessments.
