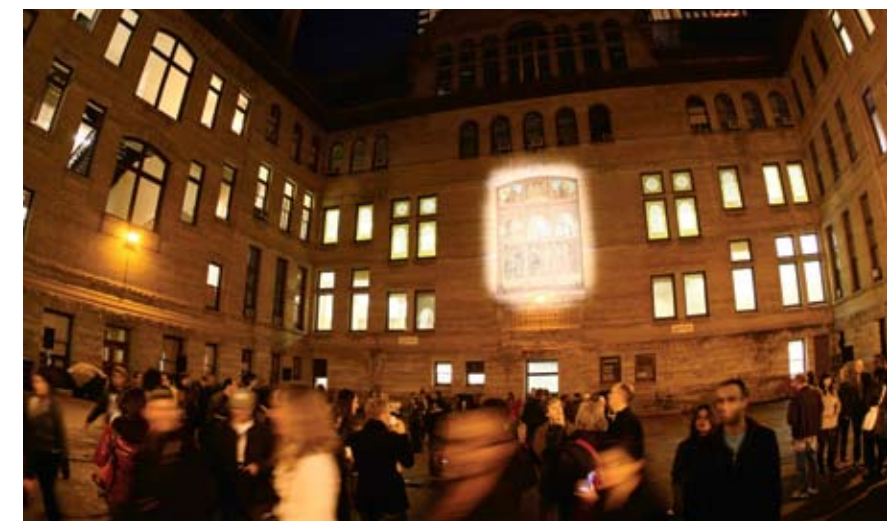
THE REST IS HISTORY
