South Coast Road Trip

Drive along Canada's southernmost coastal route, bursting with cuisine, culture and fall colours – something for every autumn adventurer.

DAY 1

Start your road trip with a tour of Windsor's **Canadian Club® Heritage Center**, highlighted by a stop in Hiram's Sampling Room and Canadian Art Gallery. Then grab a Deux Chevaux burger made of fresh, house-ground AAA beef at **Motor Burger**. Throw dice at **Caesars Windsor** and see if you can beat the odds, then stay for a live show with acts like The Scorpions and Train. Sleep soundly at the **Stonecroft Inn**, Windsor.

DAY 2

Wind around the shoreline to **Serenity Lavender Farm and Winery** in Colchester and inhale the aroma before picking up lavender bergamot soap and body butter. Further down the shores of Lake Erie, pluck harvest's bounty at the **Kingsville Community Farmers Market** or **E&B Medel Orchards** in Ruthven for snacking later in the day.

Picnic at **Point Pelee National Park** among migrating monarch butterflies, then follow the historic **Talbot Trail**, originally built in the 1820s, before stopping in Port Stanley to spend the night.

Check into a waterfront-view room at **Inn on the Harbour**, and unwind with an in-room massage.

DAY 3

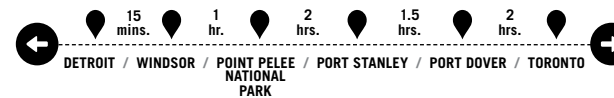
Devour a homemade breakfast at **Killer Desserts & Café**. Continue east to get your heart thumping with a zipline excursion at **Long Point Eco-Adventures** or stroll the grounds of **Bonnieheath Estate Lavender & Winery** and finish off with a wine sampling.

Meander to Port Dover for local farm-to-table fare at **Schofield's Bistro** and follow the back roads to La Salette and find **Ramblin' Road Brewery Farm**, the beer pros that grow their own hops.

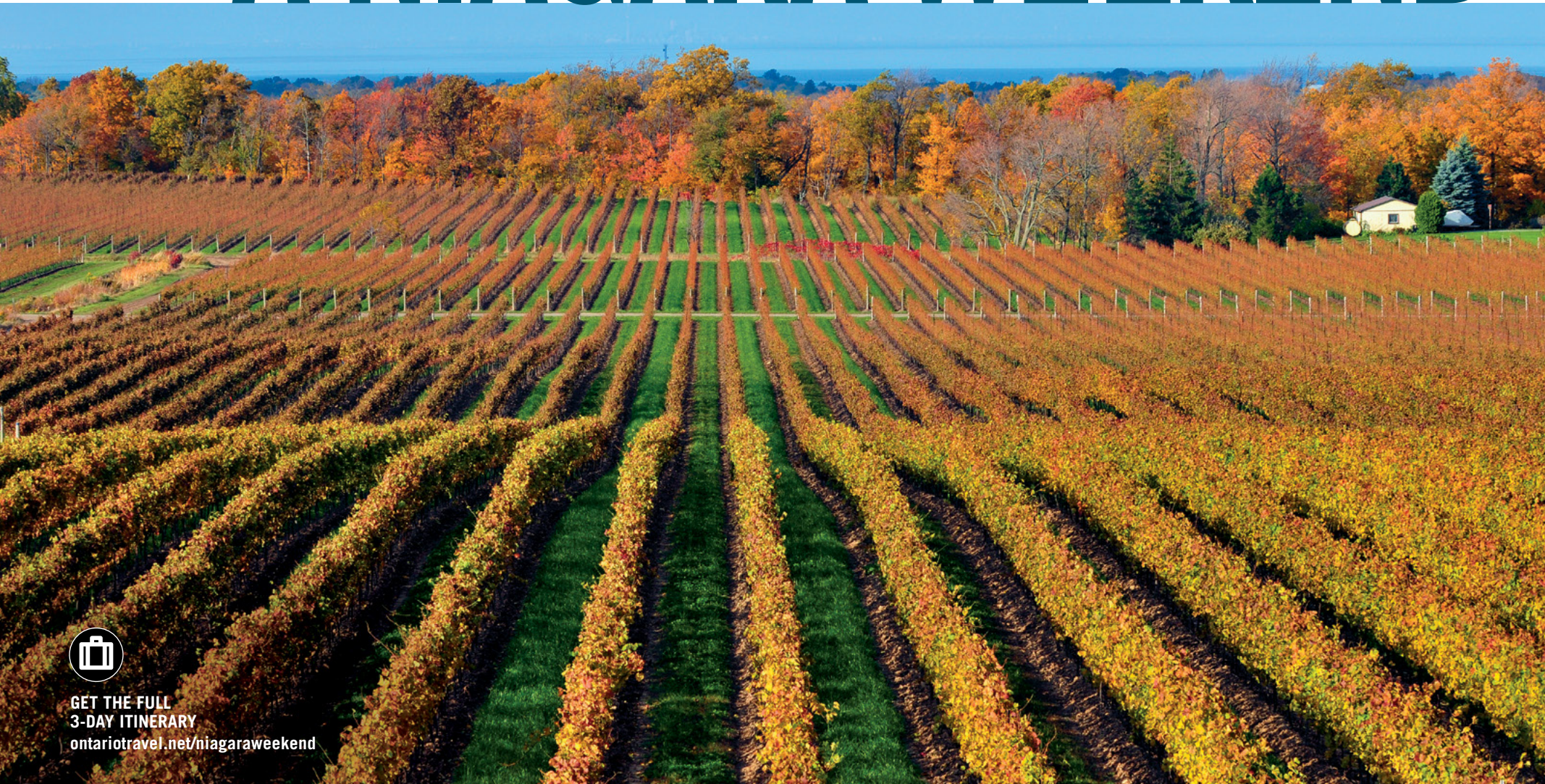

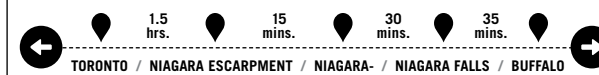

NIAGARA ESCARPMENT AND TWENTY VALLEY

Begin your grape escape at some of the 85+ wineries that dot the rolling terrain from the Niagara Escarpment to Lake Ontario and the sloping Beamsville Bench. Local favourites include the limited-production **Thirty Bench Wine Makers** for a vineyard tour that includes a Govino stemless wine glass; the organically farmed **Redstone Winery** with its seasonal and locally inspired restaurant menu; and **Vineland Estates Winery** for an ‘all access’ photo safari to capture historic buildings and an underground barrel cellar.

If you’re more of an ‘on the rocks’ person, book a private tour of **Dillon’s Small Batch Distillers**, then sample vodka made from a base of 100% local grapes.

Combine your love for specialty-store shopping, 19th-century heritage and colourful Carolinian trees in **Jordan Village**. Stroll the streets, then find peace on a trail following the rippling **Twenty Mile Creek**.

NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE

Dive into this town’s unique mosaic of culture, weaving together deep history, specialty shopping and quaint inns.

Everything’s close by in Niagara, so use pedal power rented from **Zoom Leisure Bikes** and pick ‘n choose from dozens of wineries to explore. Or tap into the six-brewery **Niagara Beer Trail** and have a seat in the **Silversmith Brewing Company’s** grand Beer Hall, housed in a converted vine-covered church, and savour a pint of Black Lager, based on a recipe dating back to the 1300s. Devour warm, soft pretzels and seared beef meatball sliders at the **Niagara Brewing Company**.

Soothe your soul and skin with wine therapy at Niagara’s first vinotherapy spa, the **Shaw Spa**, then cool off at **The Ice House Winery** with the newest way to experience Icewine: the N’Ice Slushie.

“Cheers” your peers with organic small batch wine at **Ravine Vineyard Estate Winery** before heading out to listen to the thundering roar of **The Horseshoe Falls** in Niagara Falls.

STRATFORD FESTIVAL

Inspired by the works of William Shakespeare, the Stratford Festival shows 13 classical and contemporary plays this season, including *The Taming of the Shrew* (through October 10) and *The Sound of Music* (through November 1).

8 Apple-Lover's Adventure

Follow the crunch along the southern shores of Georgian Bay – breathe in the aroma, shop for locals' favourite apple varieties and shake hands with the growers.



TAKE A BITE OUT OF THE APPLE PIE TRAIL

Pies are just the beginning! It's an apple foodie's dream, where you can pick 18 varieties that can be baked, juiced, crushed and, if you're the generous type, shared. Start with some good old-fashioned hospitality at **Grandma Lambe's Apples and Apple Products** in Meaford.

Devour the sticky knots at the **Thornbury Bakery Café** to appease your sweet tooth, then head across the street to the **Cheese Gallery** for applewood smoked cheddar to melt on apple pie.

Drive along the shoreline of Georgian Bay to Collingwood and learn how to turn your apple haul into a culinary creation at the **Collingwood Cooking Academy**.

NAKED CHOCOLATE

Ignite your passion for chocolate at **NaKeD Chocolate** in Peterborough. Take a hands-on class teaching you how to create mouth-watering masterpieces.

PETROGLYPHS PROVINCIAL PARK

Show respect to the Ojibway spirits at the sacred site known as 'The Teaching Rocks' and see the largest collection of Aboriginal rock carvings in Ontario.

STAY: Check into **Black River Retreat**, an intimate, private lodge on the Black River, complete with hot tub, fire pits and personal chef. Or nestle beside a therapeutic spring lake at the **Grail Springs Retreat Centre for Wellbeing**, to restore your inner and outer being. Then do some detoxifying yoga and lakeside lounging.

EAT: Learn to love native foods during the **Yours Outdoors Wild Edibles Forage and Lunch**, when expert guides join you on a two-hour foraging adventure, followed by lunch. Come dinner, go to the **Blue Roof Bistro** in Bancroft, for a romantic dinner for two and enjoy a meal made with locally sourced ingredients. Admire original oil paintings of the surrounding landscapes, painted by the owner herself.

DO: Take a leisurely stroll on a **Walk in the Clouds Canopy Tour** at the Haliburton Forest & Wild Life Reserve. Then gaze up, and peer into the Milky Way from the **Nutwood Observatory** near Bancroft.

10 LAKESIDE GET-TOGETHER

Hit the road with friends and check into an Ontario resort in the heart of Muskoka and Parry Sound for some fall colours and fresh air fun – golfing, biking, hiking or whatever floats your boat.

STAY HERE

Sure, you can play all three championship courses at **Rocky Crest Golf Resort** in MacTier, but the local insider secret is the trail network. Scoop up a map and stroll past a grove of hemlocks and untouched wetlands.

Or stay lakeside at one of the six waterfront chalets at **Trillium Resort and Spa** in Huntsville. Grab a mountain bike and take to the trails or just relax with your friends at the on-site spa.

ENJOY THE VIEW

Be “wowed” by the spectacular view from **High Rock Lookout Park** in Sundridge, then tour the walking trails to enjoy the fall colours up close. Climb **Tower Hill** in Parry Sound and get a spectacular view of Georgian Bay. Drive north, then rent a canoe and paddle alongside the 100-metre (328-foot) high Stormy Lake Bluffs at **Restoule Provincial Park**. Or take a private cruise aboard the restored steamship **SS Bigwin** and enjoy the view from the water.

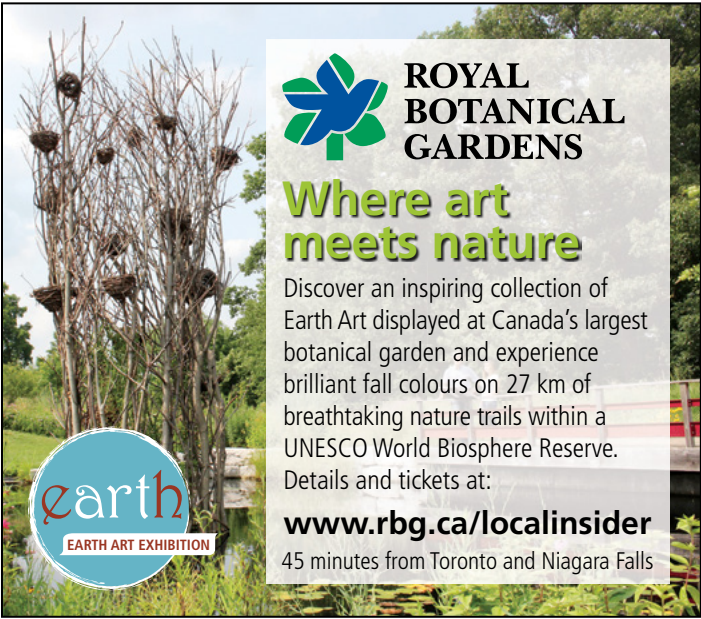
