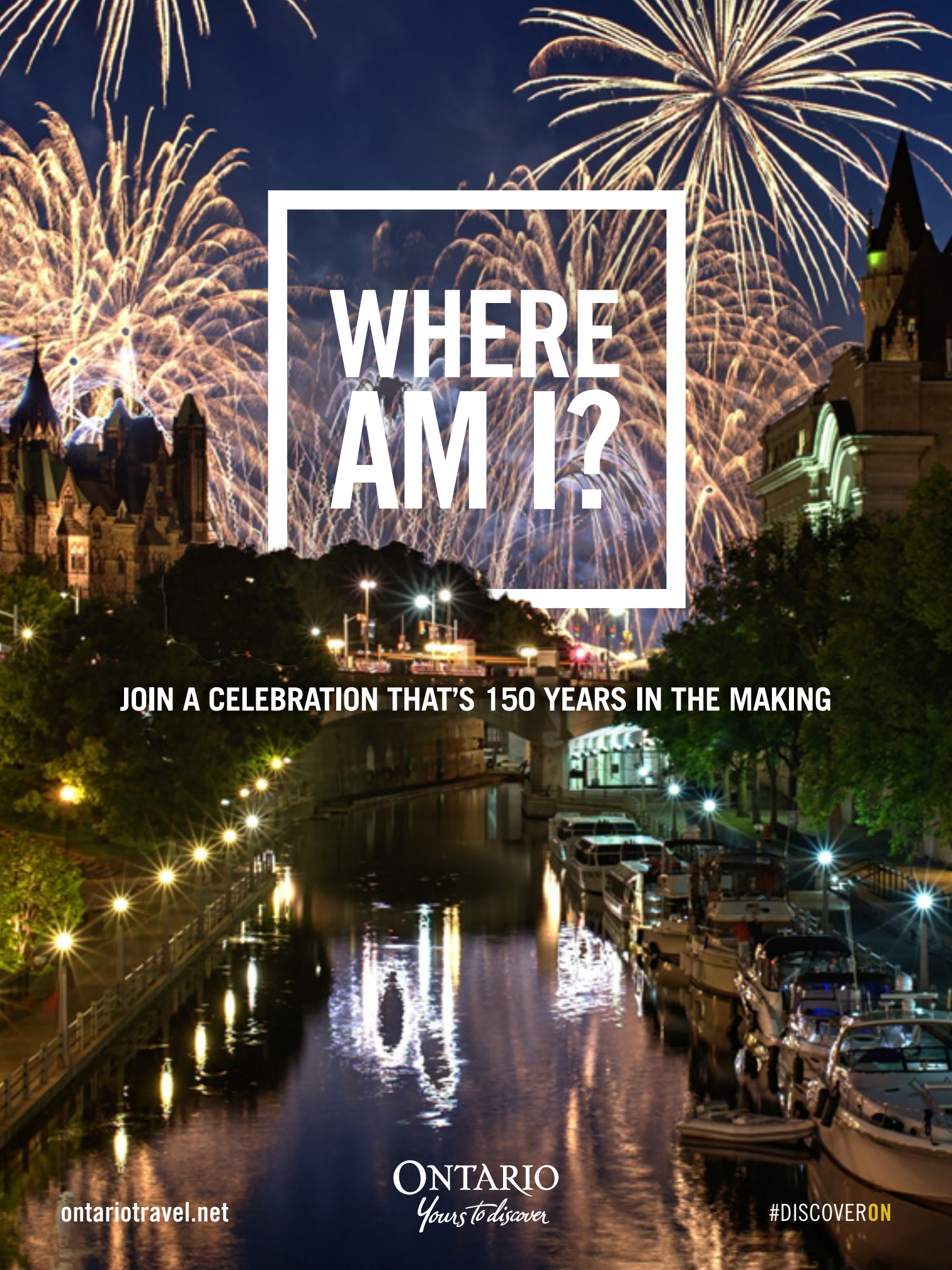

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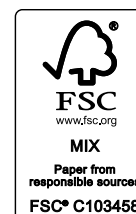

150 IN THE CAPITAL 3 DAYS: OTTAWA

Ottawa is THE place to be this year to celebrate Canada and Ontario's 150th Birthday!

The national capital is packed with once-in-a-lifetime events and experiences to enjoy all-year long. Visit for exceptional live music, unique dining experiences and the country's biggest Canada Day party in 150 years! It's going to be big and it's going to be bold, so what are you waiting for? Come see Ottawa like you've never seen it before.

DAY 1

- **MosaiCanada:** Stroll through one kilometre of living artworks made with plants at Jacques-Cartier Park, Gatineau, July 1 – October 15.
- **Canadian Museum of History:** See the world's largest collection of totem poles and visit the new Canadian History Hall, opening July 1. Also see the special exhibit, *Hockey*, March 10 – October 9.
- **National Gallery of Canada:** Be one of the first to visit *Canada's Masterpieces: Our Stories* exhibit, including the newly redesigned Canadian and Indigenous galleries, the largest exhibition of Canadian art in the world, opens June 14.

- **Inspiration Village:** Stop by this edgy installation of shipping containers in Ottawa's historic ByWard Market area for special exhibits, performances and events.
- **Afternoon Tea:** Savour fresh scones, homemade jam and Devonshire cream in the atrium at Zoe's Lounge, Fairmont Château Laurier.
- **Kontinuum:** Experience a world-first underground multimedia show at the Lyon Light Rail Transit station, end of June – September.
- **View from above:** Grab a cocktail, relax and enjoy sweeping city views from the rooftop lounge at Copper Spirits and Sights, Andaz Ottawa ByWard Market.

- **Changing of the Guard:** Start your day on Parliament Hill for the ceremonial Changing of the Guard with regimental band and pipers, 10 a.m. daily, June 25 – August 26.
- **Parliament Buildings:** Get a bird's-eye view of the Ottawa Valley from the Peace Tower, which celebrates its 90th birthday.
- **Centennial Flame:** Stop for a picture at the centennial flame which celebrates 50 years in 2017.
- **Yoga on Parliament Hill:** Bring your yoga mat for a free session at Parliament Hill, Wednesdays 12:00 noon, May – September, weather permitting.
- **Bank of Canada Museum:** Discover the history of Canadian currency and see a three-dollar bill, opens summer 2017.
- **Indigenous Walks:** Join a walking tour for a contemporary Indigenous perspective on downtown Ottawa.
- **Canadian Museum of Nature:** Explore the new permanent Arctic Gallery, opens June 21.
- **Sens House:** Watch pianists face off at the Duelling Pianos show, Saturday nights, ByWard Market.

- **Rideau Canal:** Walk or cycle along the picturesque Rideau Canal, which celebrates 10 years as a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- **Ottawa Welcomes the World:** Experience the world at events held by embassies and high commissions at the Aberdeen Pavilion and the Horticulture Building, Landsdowne.
- **Brewery Tour:** Let Brew Donkey Tours help you find the best local brews to celebrate Canada's 150th.
- **Taste of Wellington West and Hintonburg:** Discover a foodie paradise with C'est Bon Cooking's gourmet tour of up and coming culinary hotspots.
- **Canada Aviation and Space Museum:** Take a scenic flight in a vintage 1930s open-cockpit biplane for unrivalled views of Parliament Hill and Gatineau Park.
- **Fireworks Competition:** See the Ottawa skyline lit up with fireworks during the Casino du Lac-Leamy Sound of Light's pyromusical shows, Canadian History Museum, August 5 – 19.

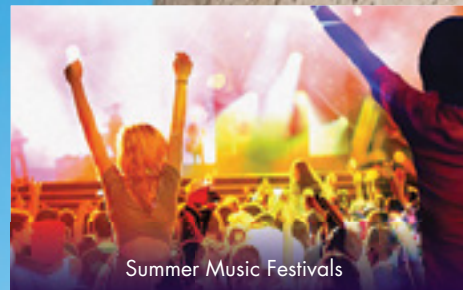

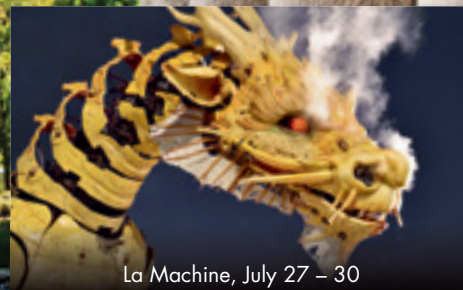

INSPIRED LAND

3 DAYS: SAULT STE. MARIE – ST. JOSEPH ISLAND – ALGOMA COUNTRY

Treat your family to a journey along the majestic Lake Superior shoreline and the mixed forests of the Canadian Shield. Visit galleries and museums that tell the stories of Indigenous peoples, Jesuit missionaries and explorers. See first-hand the rugged landscapes that inspired the art of the Group of Seven.

DAY 1: Sault Ste. Marie – St. Joseph Island

- **St. Marys River Boardwalk:** Take a picturesque riverside stroll.
- **Art Gallery of Algoma:** Discover local Indigenous works and Group of Seven paintings.
- **Canadian Bushplane Heritage Centre:** Climb aboard vintage aircraft and learn how airplanes work.
- **Ermatinger Clergue National Historic Site:** Visit the interactive Heritage Discovery Centre.
- **Northern Superior Brewing Company:** Stop for Northern Ontario memorabilia and brews.
- **Fort St. Joseph National Historic Site:** Explore the candlelit ruins on the southern tip of St. Joseph Island.

DAY 2: Algoma Country

- **Agawa Canyon Tour Train:** Enjoy a spectacular back-country day tour alongside pristine lakes and mixed forests of the Canadian Shield.
- **Agawa Canyon Wilderness Park:** Explore scenic park trails and waterfalls, part of the Agawa Canyon Tour Train. Climb 300 stairs to the lookout, perched 76 metres above the Canyon floor for dramatic panoramic views.

Toronto is more than a destination, it's an experience. Get into the arts scene, discover local design, visit iconic attractions and sample the culinary gems of 'Canada's Downtown'. - **Helicopter Tour:** Look down on the CN Tower with Toronto Helicopter Tours.
- **The Roundhouse:** Enjoy a world-class Steam Whistle pilsner on the patio at this former Canadian Pacific Railway locomotive facility.
- **Ossington Village:** Head west to this hipster strip for delicious food, drinks and entertainment.

- **Queen Street West:** Voted one of the coolest streets in the world by *Vogue Magazine*, visit art galleries and browse new and vintage design and décor shops.
- **Kensington Market:** Browse eclectic shops, funky boutiques and diverse cafés in this multicultural neighbourhood.
- **Nathan Phillips Square:** Take a selfie with the giant TORONTO letters, complete with a new maple leaf to commemorate #Canada150.

- **St. Lawrence Market:** Savour fresh produce and delicious cuisine from over 120 vendors, merchants and artisans.
- **Toronto Food Tours:** Shop, cook and dine with Chef Scott, sign up for the Friday Night Market Feast class.
- **Distillery Historic District:** Enjoy a pedestrian-only village in the restored Gooderham & Worts whisky distillery.
- **Segway Tour:** Discover the spooky side of the Distillery Historic District with Go Tours Canada ghost tour.
- **Mill Street Brewery:** Dive into Toronto's brewing history on a tasting tour.

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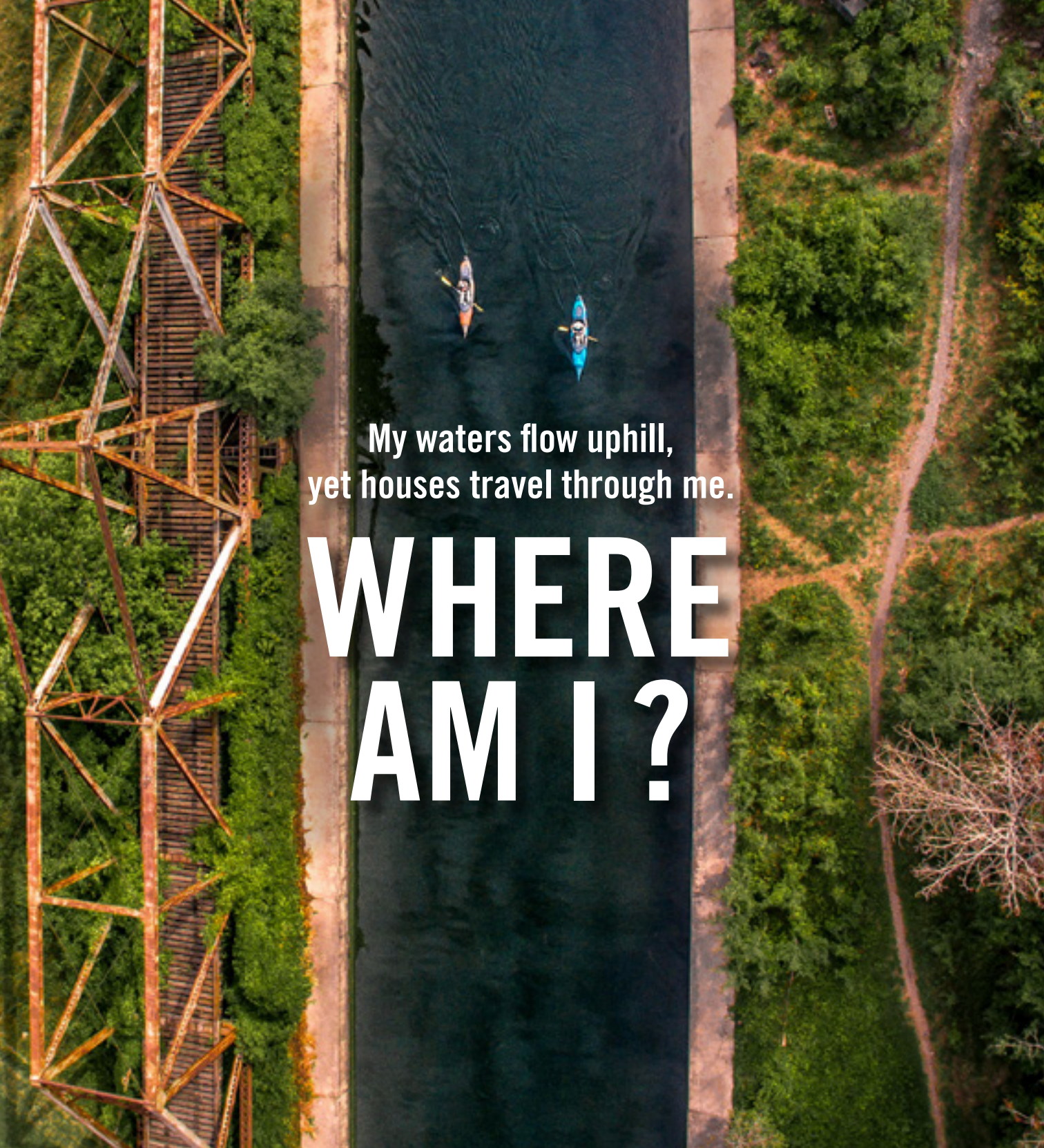
