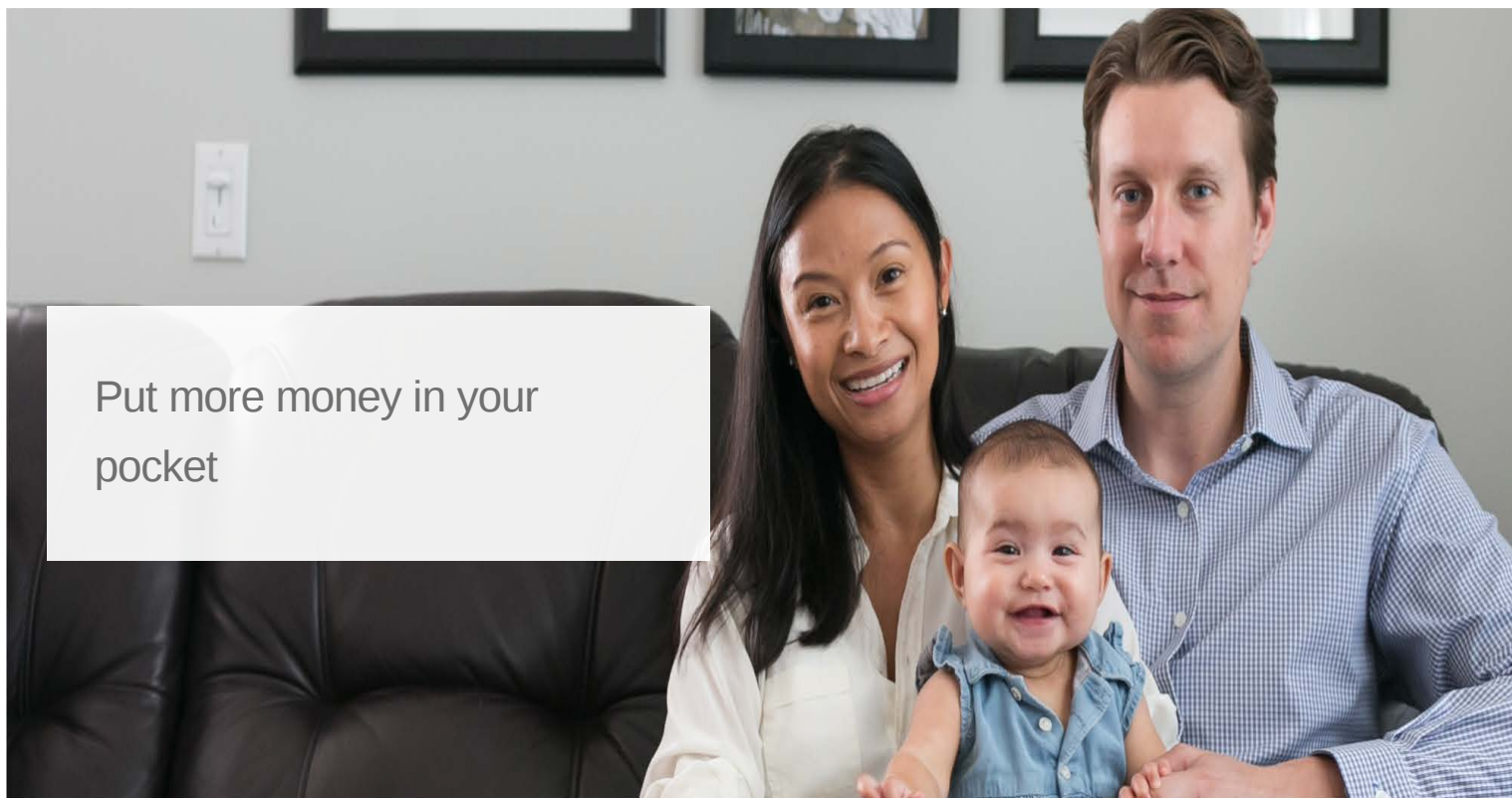

Too many people feel excluded from the system. It's time to change that. We're going to restore faith, accountability and trust in Ontario's public institutions and public finances.

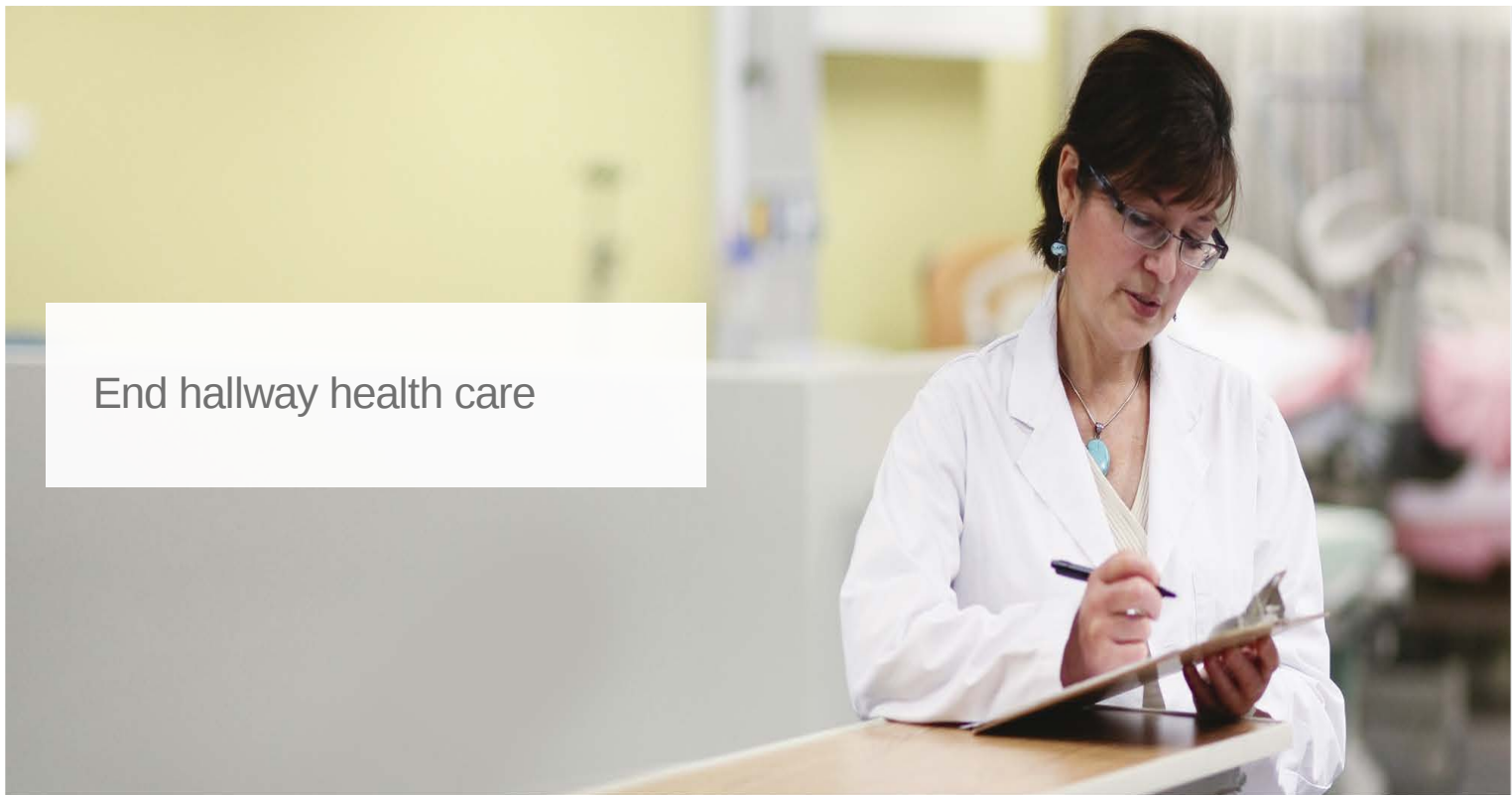
Promises made

End hallway health care

We are taking action to:

- create 15,000 new long-term care beds over the next five years
