I've done some checking and we don't know what "conference" is referenced in this e-mail below.

We have offered continued and multiple attempts at expanded conservation savings approaches (in fact, Glenn's Loblaw event this week in Sudbury was in part, to showcase the value of participating in such programs).

We need to recognize that we are now talking about a category of consumer for whom electricity is an incidental, not an input (difference w/ manufacturing). Most do not own the space they occupy and profits are not entirely dependent on such costs.

All said, this continues to be part of our ongoing effort to find more savings for what will remain of "Class B" customers (after 1 July), but some will never be satisfied.
