1	The price of electricity is expected to dominate the new session at Queen's Park today. All party leaders heard complaints from voters about hydro bills while touring the province during the winter break. Government sources tell CBC News the Liberal government is considering a plan that would moon across the board cuts to hydro costs in the range of 8%. Premier Kathleen Wynne says there will be targeted relief for people struggling the most with electricity bills, such as rural and northern residents.
