1) York Regional Police are warning parents to monitor their children's online activities after a 37-year-old man was charged with allegedly accessing child pornography and attempting to lure a teenage girl over Facebook.

2) The OPP are warning motorists against distracted driving. Distracted driving has already claimed 11 lives this year and OPP officers have laid over 2,400 distraction-related charges during their distracted driving campaign last week.

3) Metrolinx and Bombardier were in court today for an injunction hearing over the proposed cancelling of a \$770-million contract for the Eglinton Crosstown LRT. Metrolinx says it will continue to ensure high quality light rail vehicles are delivered on time pending the court ruling.

4) Opposition parties are continuing to criticize the Ontario government for using taxpayer money to fund its Fair Hydro Plan ad campaign. Attorney General Yasir Naqvi defended the campaign and criticized the opposition party's lack of hydro plan.

5) Ontario is asking chiefs of police across the province to follow the lead set by the Ottawa Police Service and audit the use of reinforced gloves by their officers.
