- 1) A debate is brewing about the size of Ontario's debt after a disagreement between the provincial government and the Auditor General over accounting standards in regards to provincial pension plans.
- 2) Haiti and Jamaica are bracing for a hurricane.
- 3) A formerly homeless man had \$65,000 in fines dropped by a judge.
- 4) A teacher is seeking permission from parents to take away children's cellphones and electronic devices for 24 hours. But parents and children are pushing back.
- 5) Mayor Tory and the Toronto Police launched Phase 2 of program using paid-duty officers to direct traffic at busy intersections. If the program is successful, he plans on asking the province for permission to have trained civilians direct traffic.
