- 1) Heat warnings remain in place for much of southern Ontario as Toronto and the GTA continue to break temperature records. Toronto Public Health says the heat and humidity has prompted concerns about air quality.
- 2) The Toronto-bound lanes of the QEW have reopened following a fatal motorcycle crash on the Burlington Skyway this morning.
- 3) The defence in the gas plant trial is pushing for a retired OPP detective to be disqualified from being a key witness, citing a lack of impartiality.
- 4) New documents obtained by the NDP show the Ontario government has allocated \$5.5 million in public money to advertise its Fair Hydro Plan.
- 5) The price of orange juice is expected to rise in the months ahead due to extreme weather in the U.S.
