The Liberal government and the auditor general are once more in disagreement. This time, the two sides just can't agree on how to value pension assets, which has repercussions for the province's bottom line. Meanwhile, the Liberal government's eight-per-cent electricity bill rebate isn't enough for some voters and the feds have announced their vision of a national carbon price, one that will surpass Ontario's in short order.
