Hi Deputy,

I've taken a stab at rearranging the technical deck and remarks so they fit a bit better with what you'd like to say at the Energy Council of Canada roundtable on Wednesday.

I've tried to cut back on content a bit, but we can cut back more. I think you mentioned wanting to discuss the Great Lakes. The messaging around how our prices compare to the Great Lakes states is included in speaking points for the industrial pricing slide, but ESP is thinking about what a stand-alone slide could look like. For the key themes/initiatives slides, I tried to keep them to what would be most relevant for this event. I think you had mentioned climate change (decarbonisation) and innovation as key items you wanted to discuss. I've also included conservation and energy efficiency as a third, but we could replace that with something else, if you'd prefer.

These still need to go through divisions and comms to finesse some of the language, and to ensure everything is fact-checked, but I wanted to get your feedback to see if this matches with what you want to say on Wednesday. I've attached clean and tracked versions of both the presentation itself, and the speaking points.
