Good Evening:

Please find enclosed products for Monday morning's meeting. One Deck + two separate documents:

1. Three options / scenarios that seek to solve for the level of reduction discussed at last Wednesday's meeting. Note, to hit the 33% threshold, it is very difficult to do via borrowing alone, so we have started to assume incremental fiscal funds to be able to meet that benchmark in some scenarios.
2. Two options regarding GA smoothing mechanism. A) Entity, continuing to review the accounting and control provisions and B) Early research regarding using the IESO. Again, hope and goal here is to preserve the accounting treatment we desire.
3. Distribution / Delivery : Some evolving direction coming from CO late Friday, so please note the two separate documents.

Note that none of our cost charts / residential price curves take account of any Distribution / Delivery line item reductions given that the permutations are both complex and could result in dozens of options. So we should probably aim for a principled conversation and narrow our policy options on this item soon.

Finally, on the cost charts / tables (slide 4, 6, 8) include a slightly higher starting point than what we had used last meeting. Many reasons for the delta from last Wednesday; but rest assured that these tables have been checked against most appropriate data sets and reflect the costs within the system.
