Subsection: Launching Ontario's Fair Hydro Plan Page Number: 3	Let's go with the bigger number; \$35B figure used a lot in the past	Since 2003, this government has supported investments of more than \$50 billion in electricity infrastructure across the province, to ensure that Ontarians can benefit from a cleaner, more modern and more reliable system.
Subsection: Launching Ontario's Fair Hydro Plan Page Number: 3		The much-needed restructuring of the electricity system resulted in rapidly rising rates for many customers, and a financial burden that has unfairly fallen disproportionately on the shoulders of today's ratepayers. Through consultations across the province, the government heard clearly that relief from high electricity bills is a priority concern for all Ontarians and that this relief must be long lasting and built on real change to the electricity system.

In March, the government announced further action under Ontario's Fair Hydro Plan, which, starting this summer, would lower electricity bills by a combined 25 per cent on average for residential consumers in the province, including the eight per cent rebate.

Subsection: Providing Further Support for Rural and Remote Communities Page Number: 5		The Province proposes to expand the RRRP to provide distribution charge relief to about 800,000 customers served by Local Distribution Companies (LDCs) with the highest rates: Hydro One R2 and R1 customers, Northern Ontario Wires, Lakeland Power (Parry Sound service territory), Chapleau PUC, Sioux Lookout Hydro, Innpower, Atikokan Hydro and Algoma Power.

Subsection: Expanding Access to Natural Gas Page Number: 7		Ontario is investing \$100 million in the new Natural Gas Grant Program to expand access to natural gas for communities that do not currently have service, including those in rural and Northern Ontario as well as First Nations communities. The program will support the building of natural gas infrastructure. Natural gas is consistently less expensive than alternative sources of energy. By enabling more communities to access natural gas, Ontario will attract new industry, make commercial transportation and agriculture more affordable, provide a cleaner source of energy, and reduce costs.
