Variance from Approved Policy

I have examined the draft of the above-referenced item being submitted to Cabinet on November 16, 2016 and have compared that draft with the policy approved by Cabinet on September 12, 2016.

As a result of this comparison, I am able to advise you that the proposed regulations described in the Supporting Rate Mitigation submission correspond to the approved policy with the exception of the variances identified on the attached chart.

The additional \$6.4 million in rate protection would ensure that eligible R2 customers of Hydro One Networks Inc (“Hydro One”) would receive a combined benefit of approximately \$45 per month, as announced by the Ministry of Energy when the <i>Ontario Rebate for Electricity Consumers Act, 2016</i> received Third Reading on October 19, 2016. \$110 million was the initial estimate to provide eligible R2 customers with approximately \$45 benefit per month, including the 8% rebate. Updated information provided by Hydro One indicated that the number of eligible Hydro One R2 customers is greater than originally estimated. The \$6.4 million increase in funding will ensure that R2 customers receive a combined benefit of approximately \$45 per month. RRRP is funded by a charge paid by all electricity consumers. The impact of this increase is minimal and has no material impact on the estimated cost of approximately \$0.60 per month for an average consumer using 750 kWh per month.
