On-reserve Credit

The First Nations Delivery Credit benefits up to 21,500 residential customers living on reserves. The costs are being funded by provincial revenues.

The credit provides much needed relief from the high electricity costs faced by First Nation on-reserve communities and encourages their socio-economic well-being. This is an important step towards reconciliation and the strengthening of Ontario's relationship with First Nations.
