Ontario's Fair Hydro Plan

- *Electricity bills lowered by 25 per cent on average for all residential consumers*
- *Rates increases held to inflation for the next four years*
- *As many as half a million small businesses and farms would also benefit from this reduction*
- *Lower-income Ontarians and those living in eligible rural communities would receive even greater reductions, as much as a 40 to 50 per cent cut*

Specific benefits would vary slightly for individual consumers depending on consumption and service territory. These measures include the eight per cent rebate introduced in January and build on previous initiatives to deliver broad-based relief on all electricity bills.
