Good Afternoon:

By now most legal staff / Legislative Counsel have been informed that we are no longer tracking for introduction on 4 May. Best chance now is to time-shift by one week to 11 May.

That actually also helps to gain time on the Leg. Drafting side because we don't have another LRC window and this would likely mean taking Legislation direct to Cabinet on 10 May. That is best, since it gives them even more time before new, official "pens down". [Recall that previously, we were tracking to a Monday LRC, so that had advanced the legal drafting schedule even further. Anyway, my point being that days (and hours) count as large bonus.]

Need us to land on your ideal cabinet tracking path forward to help me organize officialdom towards this next goal.

A. We've just budged on introduction date, so Leg. Counsel staff may be emboldened further. We shall need to hold firm to 11 May and best not waver. Energy legal much more comfortable today than they were last Thursday, although still caveat everything.

B. TB/MBC ?? This still appears like a good idea (if not necessary initial step, given the crafting of the original cabinet Minute on the fair Hydro Plan). Suggesting, please : can we do Tuesday after caucus on the 9th with a fast track to Cabinet / on 10th, please? IE. Special TB/MBC Meeting at 3pm on Tuesday 9 May, please to take up OFHP.

C. Cabinet on 10th - Direct to Cabinet on Legislation (unless we want to do a special LRC meeting?)

D. Caucus Meeting - We already have booked time on 2 May to discuss some of the rollout / on-bill messaging, etc. And so will plan to do a high-level overview of the more important aspects of the Legislation that day. Carol has advised we can have 90 mins. Dare say, we will need it.

E. Beckie/ GHLO is hard at work on a new calendar for passing the legislation, etc. After Energy forced her to scrap the previous plan. From a trajectory perspective, I think it would be wise to push forward to get 2nd reading done before the May break week and then force committee to take up this cause during the next constituency week (May 2-4) . Not for nothing, but given that we are pushing some of the implementation into reg. making powers to enable a smoother legislative drafting, we start to come up against a problem about getting reg's drafted, posted, and then passed before 1 July. Anyway, working backwards from calendar is such that it would be awesome if the bill reported back to the Chamber on the Monday the house returned from may constituency week so that you can do

3rd reading as soon as possible (Tuesday 30 May?) Then you will also need to prime LG for a speedy Royal Assent. Circle that last cabinet in June = 22nd? As a large REG package to enable the full, final implementation of the package in time for 1 July deadline, per our communications. ENE MO has already informed LDC's that they should get ready as though all of the above is pre-ordained.

Good Evening:

For your records and information – a few measures have been taken to ensure the expedited implementation of the Ontario Fair Hydro Plan.

- A. Legal Comfort Letter to Ontario Energy Board (MC-2017-688) : This has been brokered among internal / external & OEB legal counsel to provide comfort and clarity for the upcoming (May 1) Retail Price Plan (RPP) / residential TOU prices adjustment. Note that the OEB has struck a full adjudicative panel to review this matter and is due to issue its decision late next week. As with all OEB rulings, Government is not notified, or privy to the details of the ruling prior to a few hours before the release.
- B. MPP Correspondence (MC-2017-628-B) : Sample of letter Minister Thibeault has dispatched to each Member of the Ontario Legislative Assembly. Key point: second page highlights several aspects of the Ontario Fair Hydro Plan that do NOT require legislative changes for implementation.
- C. Legal Letter to Ontario Power Generation (MC-2017-750) : This has been brokered among internal / external & OPG legal counsel to provide guidance on next steps regarding Ontario Fair Hydro Plan implementation without producing a full shareholder resolution to force them to do it. Recall discussion regarding

consolidation risks, this measure and the intended OPG reply will help continue to support the case for non-consolidation of the Global Adjustment debt / special purpose vehicle (OPG Trust Co.).

These represent some really important, early milestones that will help us along the way.

Obviously, the next step is finalizing the Legislation and pleased to report that is well underway with MAG / ENE Legal as well as Blakes (ENE External Legal), Oslers (Dealers / Syndicate) & Tory's (OPG) teams on a work-plan to keep at it during this long weekend.
