As many of you are aware we have been advocating for changes in the affordability of electricity in Ontario. The changes announced today, along with changes already announced, along with changes still to be developed go a long way to addressing affordability.

OESP -> increases by 50%. Min grant per month will be \$45. More people will also be eligible as income levels are rising.

Affordability Fund -> whereas before you could only apply for insulation etc through the HAP program for natural gas, that is extending to electrical users. We don't have the details yet on how etc, but it's an expansion of HAP that's been long needed

The redefining of the Global Adjustment is a responsible plan. Lessening the ongoing costs to make it affordable makes sense. Personally I had to do an 8 year car loan to make it fit in my budget. It increased the total what I paid, but when you have no choice

All of this will take time for computers to be reprogrammed, for criteria to be set etc
