> Steve passed your note along. Thanks for sharing your view on an issue that has proved vexing for the Province, given that our Auditor General has taken a sudden opposing view to recognizing the surplus as an asset.
>
> We are in the midst of finalizing an external legal opinion through Oslers this weekend. They are looking to render advice on how the government can have access to the surplus, and your knowledge and expertise about OTPP would be valuable to ensure a sound understanding of not only the co-sponsors' fundamental rights, but also the role of the FMP.
>

> Speaking as a "non- accountant", I think that you have a defensible position.
>

> I think PS3250.050 (the italics which indicate that it is the over riding para) gives you the right to recognize the asset.
>
> AG hangs its hat on the gov't not having unilateral right to use surplus because gov't needs the agreement of the OTF. But they fail to recognize the raison d'être for the Funding Management Policy between the gov't and OTF that sets out exactly how any surplus is to be used (reduce future contributions or apply against future deficits) if there is no other agreement. In other words there is no question that gov't will realize the benefit – only a question of when and in what form. I believe that is what PS3250.052/055 is trying to say.
>
> The discussion around PS3250.059 whether or not the surplus is "withdrawable" is simply a red herring.
>

> So it really turns on the enforceability of the FMP.
