Olga,

Suggest:

- The OFA has been charging 25bps for RPP/FH since 2005 (note: without checking each and every renewal since 2005, we assume it's always been +25bps).
- The OEFC has been charging the IESO +50bps for corporate activities
- Based on verbal discussions we understand the spreads to mainly account for a) administrative and b) generally the smaller and volatile IESO's debt \$ amount draws may require more capital debt-market management which can cause minor slippages in pricing and so the spread is assist for no impact to the OFA/OEFC.

2005 section 3.4:

Section 3.4 Interest on Advances.

Section 3.4 Interest on Advances.

- (1) The OFA shall pay interest on the unpaid principal amount of each Advance in accordance with this Section 3.4 from and including the date of such Advance until the principal amount of such Advance is repaid in full.
- (2) Interest shall accrue on the principal amount of each Advance from and including the date of the Advance to but excluding the Repayment Date of such Advance, at an annual rate equal to the Province's cost of funds for borrowings with a similar term as determined by the OFA plus 0.25 percent per annum, before as well as after the date such principal amount or interest thereon becomes due hereunder and both before and after default and shall be payable on the Repayment Date for such Advance. Any amount of interest arising hereunder which is not paid when due shall bear interest at the same rate compounded monthly at which it accrued from the due date for payment until the date of actual payment. The amount of interest payable on an Advance will be calculated by the OFA by dividing the interest rate applicable to the Advance by 365 or 366, as the case may be, and multiplying the result by the principal amount of the Advance and further multiplying the result by the number of days in the period from the date of the Advance to the Repayment Date of the Advance.
