Jordan - here's what I plan to send to ELT

Earlier today, Doug Ford released details of the PC Party electricity policy:

The details released today focus on electricity rates following closely the policy platform released in November 2017 and includes:

- Keeping the Fair Hydro Plan while promising to review it and an additional 12% reduction in electricity bills (on top of the FHP) starting by 2019 through measures like:
 - Rebating government share of Hydro one dividends to ratepayers
 - Moving conservation funding to the tax base (the November 2017 platform also supported CFF)
 - A moratorium on new energy contracts and renegotiate existing contracts where possible (such as pre-NTP where feasible)

Also, recall that the PC Party committed to release a much shorter and targeted platform than the one released in November 2017. Some priorities that have been released include:

- Commitment to release a costed platform (previously the party would not commit to this)
- Re-prioritizing transportation development of the NWGTA corridor (currently the IESO and MTO are jointly studying transmission uses for the corridor)
- Eliminating all forms of carbon pricing
- Lower commercial/industrial hydro rates
