Current Context

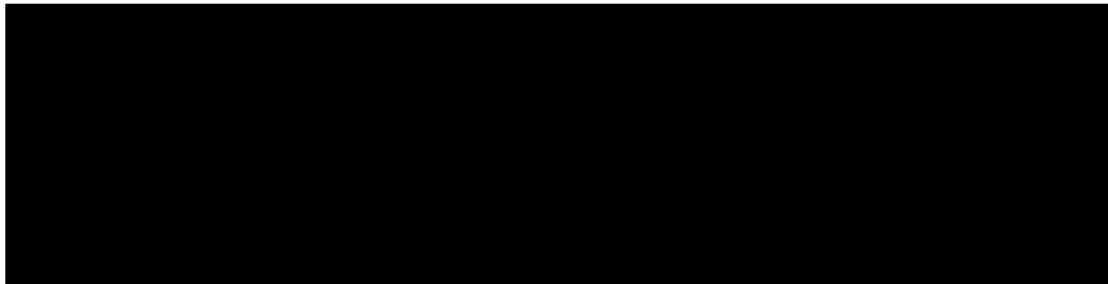
Strong Supply and Rate Mitigation

- Ontario's strong supply situation and commitment to rate mitigation means large scale procurements are not necessary at this time. Any renewable energy investments will need to be ratepayer-neutral and provide value beyond generation alone.
