Opportunity:

- <!--[if !supportLists]--><!--[endif]-->Going into Q2 2018, this presents an opportunity to have senior-level policy discussions with ~40 leaders within industry and government and deliver the IESO’s perspective on specific topics (MRP, broader sector reform, innovation, DER leadership) as well as 2018 platform commitments and broader industry trends
- <!--[if !supportLists]--><!--[endif]-->In the past, we’ve leveraged our participation at this event to engage specific policy experts on matters related to the organization. For example, in 2014, (coming out of the CCRE session) I organized an internal forum with Bob Rae to discuss remote First Nation communities in Northwest Ontario

Recommendation:
