Joyce -- Let's discuss.

Andrew -- As discussed Joyce will be my rep on this . A few points:

- The sheer number of questions is much greater than in the past and will require significant effort just to compile.
- I understand they are asking for a Dec 8 th response. This is quite unreasonable.
- A significant number of questions will require analysis that has not been done to date. This goes beyond just compiling. (eg Q 5 what has been the impact of the gas relocations? : We do not keep track of that on an on-going basis and the work would need to start from scratch).
- Are we prepared to treat this similar to audits and say no we do not have that.
- Can the questions be prioritised between :
 - Data Available vs needs to be assessed
 - ECO's High priority vs nice to have
- Some questions refer to OPO . This is stale info and it would likely be more appropriate to base all those on the LTEP. Those modules are not yet posted. It would be more appropriate to wait until those are released by the government.

Subject: ECO Report - Information Request

All, we've received an information request from the Environmental Commissioner for field work for their 2018 report.

This year's report is taking a broader look at the results of the "greening" initiatives of the electricity sector over the past decade: the coal phase-out, renewable energy procurement, and utility conservation programs, looking at the impacts of these initiatives on our electricity system, on the environment, and on energy prices.

The information requested is in the attached table. This is quite extensive. I've added in an SME column but you're free to delegate to as needed and to correct me if I've mis-identified an SME. The table is intended to be used to help facilitate gathering the information requested.

What I propose is we convene later this week to review and confirm who owns what information for the purpose of gathering it for the ECO. We should also use the time to identify areas that need scope clarification (e.g. why for some items going back to 2005 is relevant?) to clarify some areas (e.g. they have an oversimplified view of Market Renewal and exports), confirm that we have the information, identify any possible confidentiality concerns, etc. We'll also need to consider the impact/risk of fulfilling certain requests but will likely need to provide it anyway. It's also possible that some of the information requested will be answered through the LTEP modules expected later in December – a moving target.

The ECO has asked for the information **by December 8** but there could be some flexibility for areas that may take more time to compile. The ECO wants to complete fieldwork before the end of 2017. It will also be very helpful if early next week we can meet with ECO staff to review, discuss scope and other clarifications, and to do some simple education in selected areas (e.g. Market Renewal, exports).
