

Thursday, Jan. 19 – Possible changes to delivery charges first reported after Premier's meeting with resident Libby Keenan.

From The Canadian Press: Wynne told (Keenan) she is specifically looking at rural customers' delivery charges.

"They are going to produce an answer on what can be done on the rates we're paying for hydro, we're specifically aiming at the delivery charges that rural customers are paying," Libby Keenan told reporters after her meeting with the Premier.

CTV's Paul Bliss said in his report: "The delivery charge will either get a makeover or be subsidized by general revenue."

Premier's Quotes: "There have been decisions made about what would be paid on the rate base, in other words, what would go on people's electricity bills, and what would be paid out of general revenue, government revenue. We have to look at whether we've got that balance right as well."

"(A resident) wrote to me about delivery charges that make up 50 per cent of his bill," Wynne told a business audience in downtown Toronto. "He has every right to be angry; that shouldn't be happening. At the end of the day, what people like Lloyd should be paying for is the electricity that they use."

Questioned by reporters after her speech, Wynne affirmed that delivery charges are on her radar. Premier's quotes:

"The delivery charge is something that comes up repeatedly," she said. "I am hearing it consistently as I talk to people across the province."

"There are so many people who'd like us to deal with the delivery charge, but we've not necessarily landed on how to do that."

"We have to really pull that apart and figure out how do we make sure that there's a fairness across the province in terms of the costs that people are bearing. We actually have not made those decisions, so I am not going to pre-empt that process. We are going to be bringing forward some of the changes that we are going to make before the budget."
