CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

As I complete my second and final term as Chairperson of the Board of Directors for the Catfish Creek Conservation Authority, I feel a surge of pride in the accomplishments of the staff and numerous volunteers who have worked hard to make the watershed a healthier and more beautiful place in which to live. Most particularly, it is gratifying that the CCCA has made strong efforts to connect with the communities who rely on the Authority for water and land management programs and services, the development of wildlife habitat and the environmental education of hundreds of young people who will inherit the natural wealth of the watershed and preserve it for future generations.

During my tenure, the Authority began development of the Yarmouth Natural Heritage Area, and continues to make it a total habitat where deep forest birds and animals can thrive and live protected.

The Authority has been working closely with our community partners to identify and protect threatened species of plants and animals found on the property, and improve the cold-water fishery potential in Catfish Creek.

Water issues have become a top priority since the

tragedy in Walkerton. The CCCA is currently involved in the delivery of three new provincially driven water initiatives announced in 2001. The Municipal Groundwater Studies, Provincial Groundwater Monitoring Network, and Ontario Low Water Response Programs will help produce the monitoring data which is essential for sound planning and management of our local groundwater and surface water resources.



Fisheries Enhancement – Yarmouth Natural Heritage Area

Public Meetings have been held more frequently than ever over the past few years, to provide a forum for the Authority to respond to interested and involved citizens as never before. Two of the most recent meetings concerned the Mill Creek Sub-watershed Study and the Yarmouth Natural Heritage Area Life Science Inventory Report and Management Strategy.

I leave my successor with new challenges to face, but supported by our strongest fundraising ever, and by a talented and dedicated workforce within the Authority itself. The future has never been brighter, because our vision remains clear and filled with purpose. Our second half-century of service has begun with strength and is offering great promise.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2001

WATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

- continual monitoring of stream flow and watershed conditions
- maintenance and operation of four water level gauges and one weather station
- channel sounding and map production to determine potential dredging sites to reduce flooding
- removed approximately 6000 cubic yards of material from Catfish Creek in Port Bruce for flood control purposes
- Ice Monitoring and Assessment Program
- regular inspections, operation, and maintenance of the Springwater Dam
- participated in the Federal Great Lakes Water Level Emergency Response Program with local marina operators
- completed a Channel Streamlining Assessment Study for a section of Catfish Creek in Port Bruce
- implemented the Ontario Low Water Response Program locally and issued a Level 1 Situation because of the drought conditions in the watershed
- assisted with the implementation of the Provincial Groundwater Monitoring Network Project
- active partner in the Healthy Futures "Clean Water Project"
- participated in the provincially funded Municipal Groundwater Studies Project
- completed data collection for Phase IV of the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Municipal Drain Classification Project

ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING

- provided technical support and policy development to local municipalities and proponents by reviewing and commenting on over 91 Planning Act applications and development proposals
- received and provided comments on 36 Municipal Drain Reports and Drain Maintenance Requests
- reviewed 20 proposals including issuance of 18 permits relative to fill placement, construction or alteration to watercourses in accordance with Section 28 of the Conservation Authorities Act
- provided responses to over 25 property inquiries (legal, real estate, and general information requests)
- protected fish habitat and mitigated impacts to aquatic ecosystems in partnership with Fisheries and Oceans Canada
- completed the Mill Creek Subwatershed Study, including a Public Meeting in Sparta to discuss the Final Report
- arranged a Public Open House to review the Life Science Inventory completed for the Yarmouth Natural Heritage Area

EXTENSION SERVICES

(Tree Planting/Woodlot Management/Soil Conservation)

- 19,000 trees planted throughout the watershed
- supplied and planted native trees at various Conservation Areas through the Community Forest Program

- provided certified staff to approve Managed Forest Tax Incentive Program Plans for private landowners
- delivered large stock hardwoods to municipalities for roadside planting
- managed a 15 acre White Pine plantation for Imperial Tobacco Leaf Inc.
- assisted with several erosion control and fisheries rehabilitation projects on private and municipal owned lands
- received approval from Ontario Power Generation to plant 75,000 seedlings over the next three years
- contracted by local municipalities to carry out vegetation and erosion control measures along municipal roadsides and drains

CCCA OWNED LANDS

- assisted the National Wild Turkey Federation's Elgin Chapter with the release of 14 wild turkeys from Tennessee
- completed upgrades to the electrical services and began improvements to the entrance at the Springwater C.A.
- provided support to the Aylmer Kinsmen Club during the planning and installation of a new footbridge at the Ivan Steen Conservation Area
- erected signage and access gates at the Hawkins Property
- worked in partnership with the Aylmer Kinsmen Club and the Ontario Trillium Foundation to restore the North Shore Trail in the Springwater Forest
- constructed two major fisheries enhancement projects at Springwater and the Yarmouth Natural Heritage Area
- completed an inventory of the Small Whorled Pogonia
- finalized construction of the Waterlily Trail



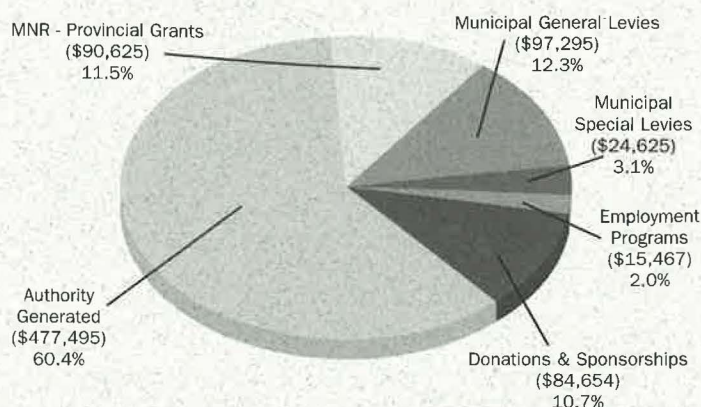
North Shore Trail – Springwater Forest

COMMUNITY INFORMATION/EDUCATION

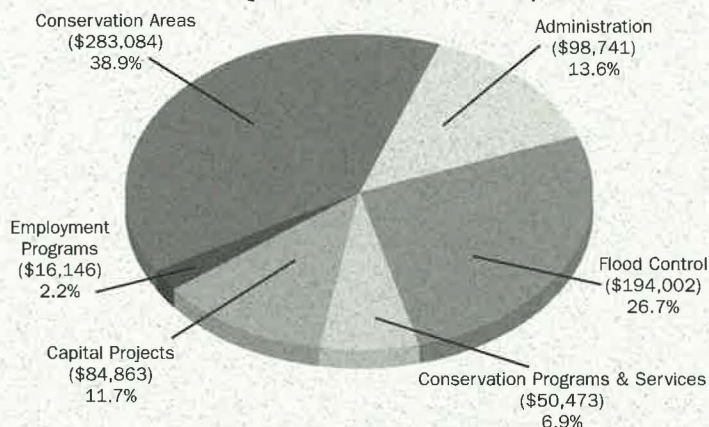
- member of the Southwestern Ontario Leave A Legacy Program and Volunteer Elgin
