I am writing to you this evening to express my lack of support for Ontario Bill 218. Creating a bill to indemnify the Government of Ontario and all public health officials for enacting edicts and providing direction not backed by verified science is unacceptable to the citizens of Ontario and is in bad faith. The Government of Ontario and all public health officials have been entrusted to act in the best interest of the citizens of Ontario. It appears that the Government of Ontario and its public health unit officials have made a conscious decision to provide direction to the citizens of Ontario outside of sound verified science and instead have chosen to balance the

Ontario economy and the Ontario citizens livelihoods on "good faith efforts", which simply is a way to make "not based on science" sound nice. The appropriate scientific literature has been long available to Ontario's Government and Ontario's public health unit officials. Scientific information regarding efficacy of lockdowns and community masking, information to educate the public on what SARS-CoV-2 testing via PCR actually means (magnifying RNA not testing for live virus, cannot quantify virus, cannot determine if individuals are currently infectious, cannot determine transmissibility of the virus), information relating to PCR cycle threshold values and viable virus detection, information relating to the effects of isolation of individuals and substance abuse, child abuse, spousal abuse and suicide. The effects of lockdowns on developing countries and starvation. The Ontario Government needs to be accountable to the families of the long term care residents whom have perished due to contracting secondary infection caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus. The Government of Ontario needs to provide an explanation to the citizens of Ontario as to why deaths whose primary cause was not deemed to be due to secondary infection caused by the SARS-CoV-2 have been classified as COVID-19 deaths. The Government of Ontario is responsible to the citizens of Ontario to provide a full and complete debrief on it's response to the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic and is also subject to review by a third party(s) with respect to it's response to the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic. The citizens of Ontario are guaranteed the rights and freedoms as set out in the Canadian Charter Of Rights And Freedoms and believe every person, including their elected Government are to be presumed innocent until proven guilty according to law in a fair and public hearing by an independent and impartial tribunal and as such, the Government of Ontario shall not seek to indemnify itself of any and all wrong doing through the creation and subsequent assent of a bill such as the proposed Bill 218 and the Government of Ontario shall accept responsibility for it's actions and shall stand trial for it's actions according to law in a fair and public hearing by an independent and impartial tribunal as set out in the Charter Of Rights And Freedoms. In closing, I as a citizen of Ontario do not support further readings of the proposed Ontario Bill 218 and demand that the proposed Ontario Bill 218 be revoked immediately.
