Respectfully and forcefully I am asking this standing committee to completely withdraw from Bill 229 both Schedule 6 and Schedule 8.

Neither of them have any room in an omnibus budget measures bill supposedly meant to 'Protect, Support, and Recover the citizens of Ontario from the ravages of COVID-19. The subject of schedule 6 (proposed changes to the Conservation Authorities Act and consequential amendments) and schedule 8 (proposed changes to the Crown Forest Sustainability Act,1994) need to have serious, extensive consultation with the population of Ontario, including the Indigenous Nations whose land this is.

The measures advocated are a total travesty of protection and support toward recovery.

Please, do not add to the problems your government has already exacerbated for this fragile environment. Withdraw both schedules.
