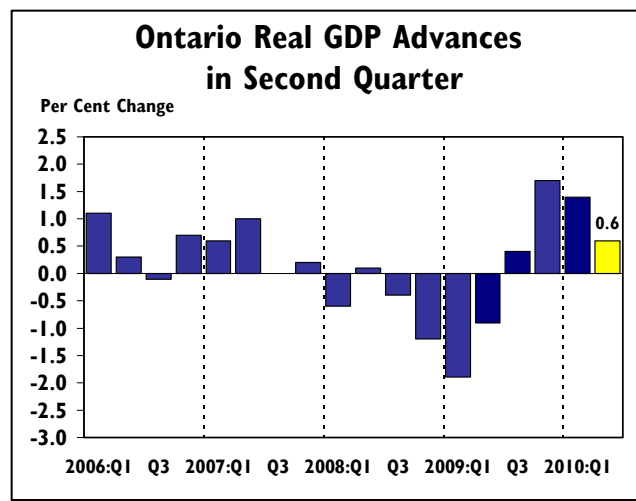


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SECOND QUARTER 2010 SUMMARY

- Ontario's real **Gross Domestic Product** (GDP) advanced 0.6% in the second (April to June) quarter of 2010, the fourth consecutive quarterly gain. Canadian real GDP rose 0.5%, while that of the United States grew 0.4%.



- Consumer spending** rose 0.6%, following a 0.8% gain in the first quarter. Consumers increased their purchases of motor vehicle parts, fuels, food and non-alcoholic beverages, and furniture and appliances. Spending on services increased 1.0% in the second quarter, after rising 0.8% in the previous quarter.
- Business investment spending on plant and machinery** jumped 5.5% in the second quarter, after rising 4.0% in the first quarter. **Investment in machinery and equipment** gained 6.9% while **non-residential construction spending** increased 1.2%.
- Investment in residential construction** edged down 0.5%, the first decline since the first quarter of 2009. A sharp (-12.0%) decline in ownership transfer costs more than offset increases in spending on new housing construction (+4.4%) and renovation activities (+1.2%).
- Government capital spending** remained at a high level, advancing 1.1% in the second quarter, after rising by an average of 7.0% in the previous five quarters. **Government current spending** (+0.1%) remained steady, after a 0.5% increase in the previous quarter.
- Businesses increased **inventories** by \$4.6 billion (\$2002), following a small (\$0.3 billion) accumulation in the first quarter.
- Imports** increased by 4.0%, outpacing a 2.6% increase in **exports**. As a result, the real trade deficit widened to \$10.5 billion (\$2002).
- In **current dollars**, **GDP** increased by 0.8% in the second quarter, following a 2.1% first quarter gain. Economy-wide prices, as measured by the **GDP implicit price index**, edged up 0.2%, slowing from a 0.7% increase in the first quarter.
- On an industry basis**, economic production increased 0.6%. Production by goods-producing

industries increased by 1.3%, while services-producing industries posted a 0.4% advance.

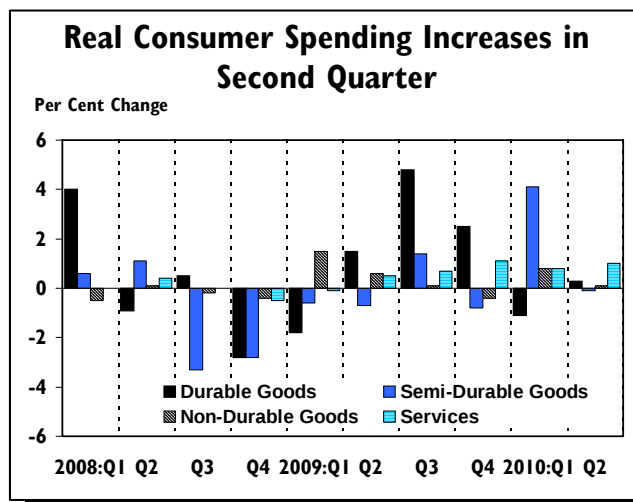

EXPENDITURE AND INCOME DETAILS

CONSUMER SPENDING CONTINUES TO STRENGTHEN

Real consumer spending, which contributes more than 60% to real GDP, increased 0.6% in the second quarter, marking the sixth consecutive quarterly gain.

Spending on consumer **durables** increased moderately by 0.3%, after declining 1.1% in the previous quarter. Spending on motor vehicles (-0.4%) fell for the second consecutive quarter. The lower spending on motor vehicles was more than offset by higher spending on motor vehicle parts (+2.6%) and furniture and appliances (+0.5%).

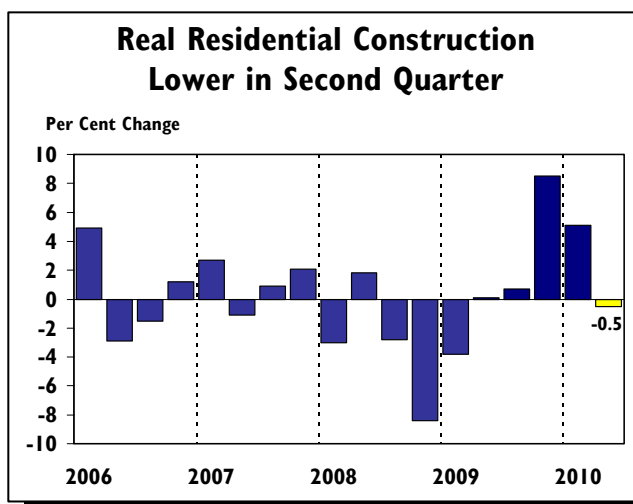


Spending on **semi-durables** edged down 0.1% in the second quarter, after advancing 4.1% in the first quarter. Consumer spending on **non-durables** (+0.1%) was little changed in the quarter. Higher spending on food and non-alcoholic beverages and fuels was offset by lower expenditures on electricity and natural gas.

Household spending on **services** increased 1.0%, after advancing 0.8% in the previous quarter.

RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION SPENDING LOWER

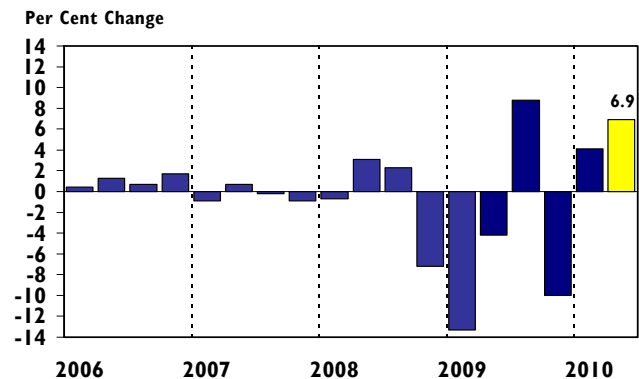
Real residential construction investment spending declined 0.5%, following a 5.1% first quarter gain. Spending on new housing construction (+4.4%) and renovation activity (+1.2%) both rose. Home-ownership transaction costs fell 12.0%, reflecting a softer home resale market.



BUSINESS INVESTMENT HIGHER

Capital spending by Ontario businesses increased 5.5% as **real machinery and equipment** spending rose 6.9%, following a 4.1% gain in the first quarter. Despite these gains, real machinery and equipment investment expenditures are still 16.0% below the most recent peak recorded in the third quarter of 2008. **Real non-residential construction** spending was up 1.2%, the second consecutive quarterly gain.

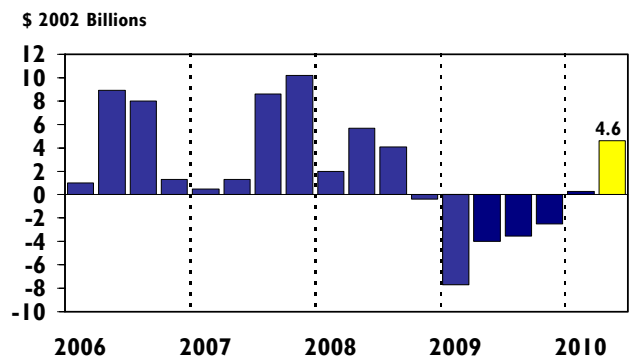
Real Machinery and Equipment Investment Advances in Second Quarter



INVENTORY LEVELS RISE

Ontario businesses increased their inventories in the second quarter, adding \$4.6 billion to stocks, following a small (\$0.3 billion) accumulation in the first quarter. Ontario's manufacturing, wholesaling and retailing sectors all recorded inventory gains in the quarter.

Business Inventories Rise in Second Quarter

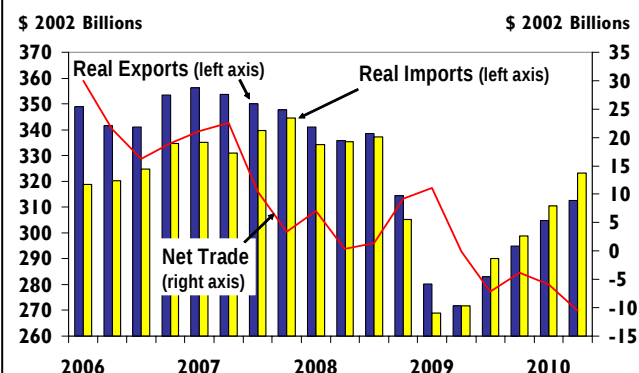


EXPORTS AND IMPORTS POST GAINS

Both real **exports** (+2.6%) and **imports** (+4.0%) increased in the second quarter.

International merchandise exports rose for the fourth consecutive quarter, increasing 4.0% in the second quarter. Exports have risen at an average 6.2% quarterly rate over the last four quarters as global economic growth resumed. Despite these increases, international merchandise exports remain 9.8% below the most recent peak recorded in the third quarter of 2008. Exports of automotive

products, machinery and equipment, agricultural commodities and other consumer goods all contributed to export growth in the second quarter.

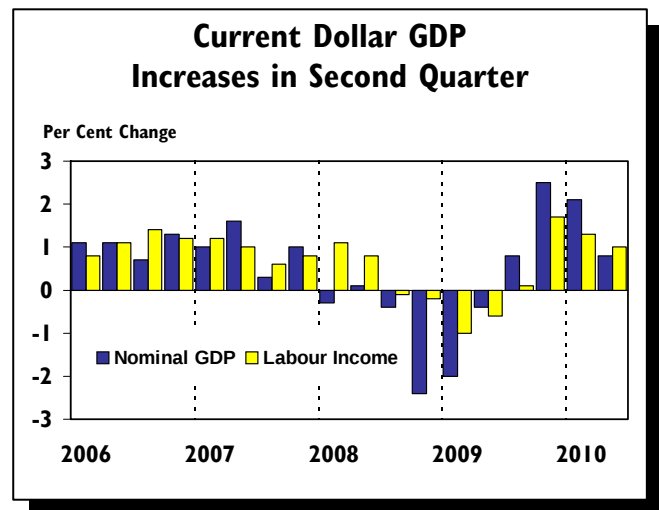
International merchandise imports advanced 5.6%, marking the fifth consecutive quarterly gain. Gains in imports of machinery and equipment, industrial goods and materials and automotive products contributed to the overall increase.

Ontario's real trade deficit widened to \$10.5 billion (\$2002), reflecting the relatively strong pace of import growth.

NOMINAL GDP HIGHER

Gross Domestic Product measured in current dollars increased by 0.8% in the second quarter. Gains in labour income and unincorporated business income were the main contributors to the increase.

Labour income, the largest component of household income, rose 1.0%, reflecting a 1.2% increase in employment. **Personal disposable income** advanced by a strong 3.6%, as personal direct taxes dropped 11.7%, reflecting in part increased refunds to the 2009 tax year received in the second quarter. In current dollars, personal spending rose by a moderate 0.7%. As a result, the personal savings rate* jumped to 4.6% from 1.9% in the previous quarter.



Corporate profits, on a national accounts basis, grew by a modest 0.2% in the second quarter, after rising by an average 10.1% over the previous three quarters. Despite these gains, corporate profits are still 28.3% below their pre-recession level in the second quarter of 2008. Higher profits in banks, manufacturing, real estate and leasing and information and cultural industries contributed to the rise.

***Note:** Personal savings is calculated in the System of National Accounts as the difference between the amount households receive as income from current production and employment and their expenditures on taxes and personal consumption.

PRICES RISE MODESTLY IN SECOND QUARTER

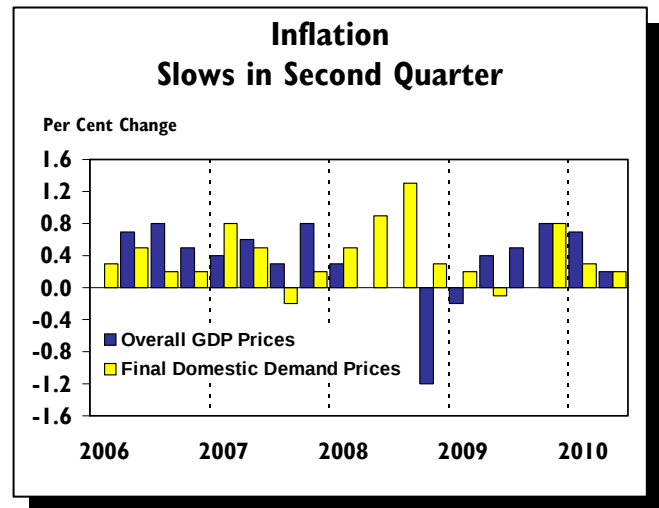
Economy-wide prices, as measured by the **GDP implicit price index**, increased by a modest 0.2% in the second quarter, following a 0.7% gain in the first quarter.

Prices for **personal consumer expenditures** on goods and services edged up 0.1%. Lower prices for motor vehicles and parts, motor fuels and services helped contain overall consumer price gains.

Prices for **business investment expenditures**

moderated in the second quarter, edging up 0.1%, after rising 0.4% in the previous quarter. **Machinery and equipment** prices declined 0.5%, falling for the fifth consecutive quarter. **Non-residential construction prices** advanced 1.0%, following a 1.7% rise in the previous quarter. **Residential construction prices** increased 0.1% in the quarter, reflecting a moderate decline in prices for sales of existing homes.

Export prices declined 0.6%, the fifth decline in the past six quarters. **Import** prices also fell in the second quarter, down 0.5%, the sixth consecutive quarterly decline.



ONTARIO PRODUCTION BY INDUSTRY

HIGHLIGHTS

Output by industry advanced 0.6% in the second quarter, the fourth consecutive quarterly increase. Output was higher in both the service (+0.4%) and the goods-producing (+1.3%) sectors.

Sectors posting notable second quarter gains include manufacturing (+1.7%), professional and administrative services (+1.6%) and construction (+1.4%). Production by the utilities sector declined 3.1% in the second quarter.

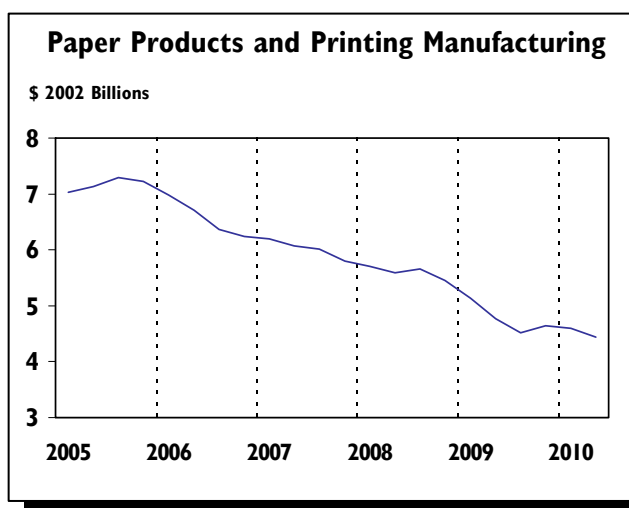
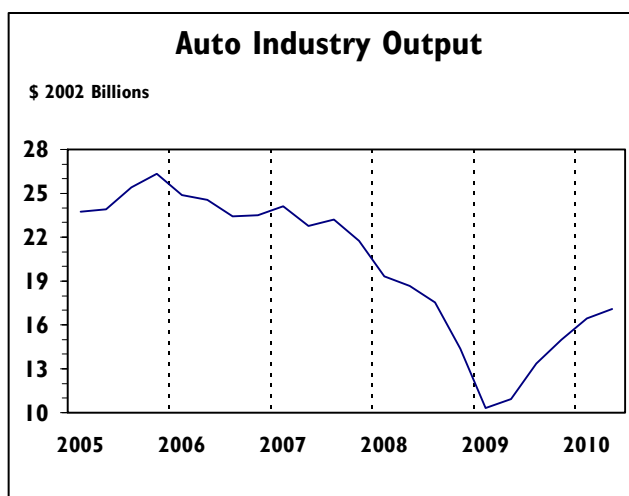
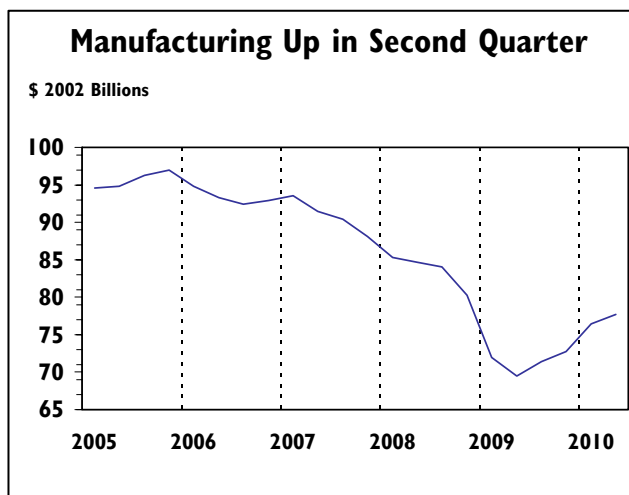
MANUFACTURING OUTPUT RISES

The manufacturing sector's output advanced 1.7% in the second quarter, decelerating from a 5.0% increase in the first quarter. The second quarter gain marked the fourth consecutive quarterly increase for the sector. Eight of the eleven manufacturing industries included in the Ontario Economic Accounts expanded production in the second quarter.

The transportation equipment sector advanced 3.7% and was the leading contributor to overall growth in the second quarter. Auto industry production continued to improve, increasing 4.1% - the fifth consecutive quarterly gain. Output in both the motor vehicle assembly and auto parts industries increased in the second quarter. Despite the recent gains, auto industry production remains 29% below the level posted in the first quarter of 2007.

Significant output gains were also recorded in the *other manufacturing** (+8.2%), primary metal and fabricated metal products (+2.1%) and electrical and electronic product (+1.5%) industries.

The output of the paper products and printing industry declined 3.3% in the second quarter, continuing a steady downward trend since 2006. The current level of production in the paper products and printing industry is 39.1% below the peak posted in the third quarter of 2005.

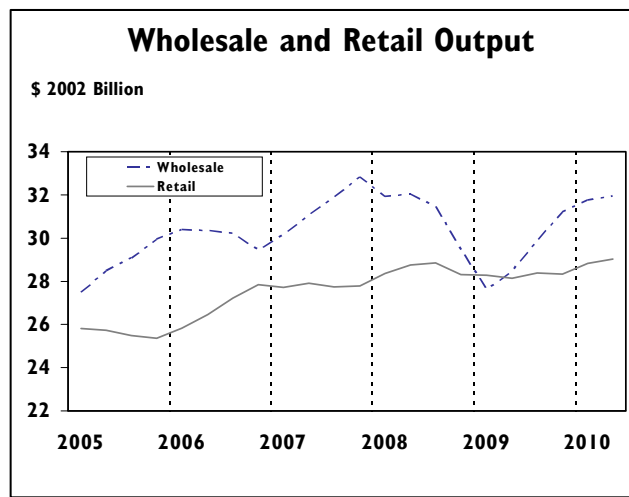

WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

Wholesale trade output increased 0.6%, following a 1.8% gain in the first quarter. Strong sales gains by food, beverage and tobacco and machinery equipment supplies wholesalers led the way in the second quarter.

Retail trade activity advanced 0.7%, following a 1.7% gain in the first quarter. Motor vehicle and parts dealers led the overall growth in the retailing industry.

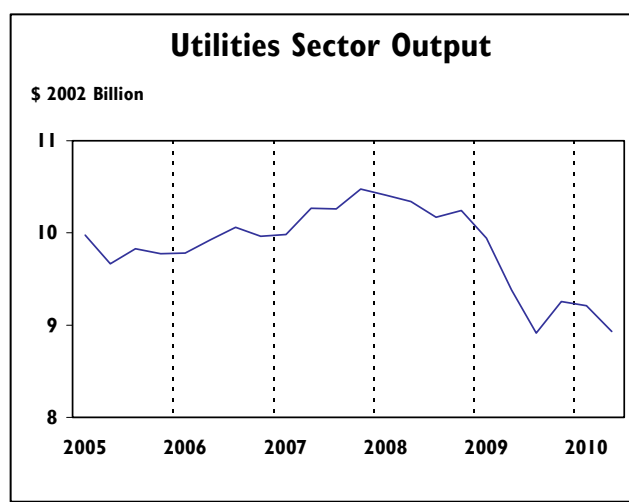
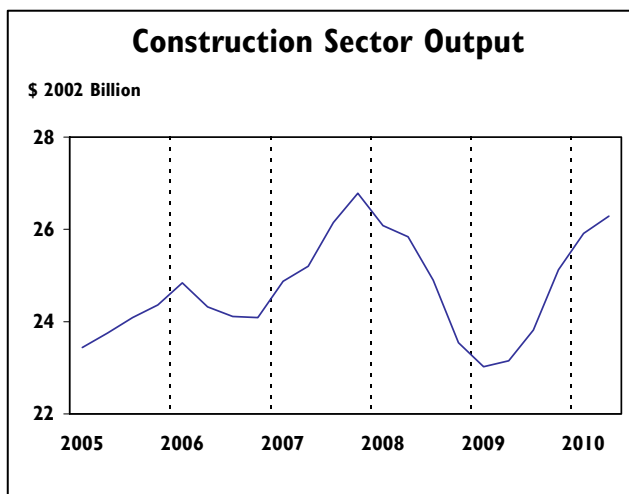


CONSTRUCTION, UTILITIES AND RESOURCES

Construction sector output increased 1.4% in the second quarter, advancing for the fifth consecutive quarter. Both residential (+2.7%) and non-residential and engineering construction (+0.6%) activity increased in the second quarter.

Utilities output dropped 3.1% in the second quarter. Electric power output fell 4.3%, due to a warmer than normal spring, more than offsetting a 1.6% gain in natural gas and water distribution.

Mining output increased 0.8%, boosted by increased activity in copper, nickel, lead and zinc ore mines for a second consecutive quarter. Labour disputes in the nickel mining industry have hampered production since the third quarter of 2009. The current level of output in the mining sector remains almost 40% below the most recent peak recorded in the third quarter of 2008.

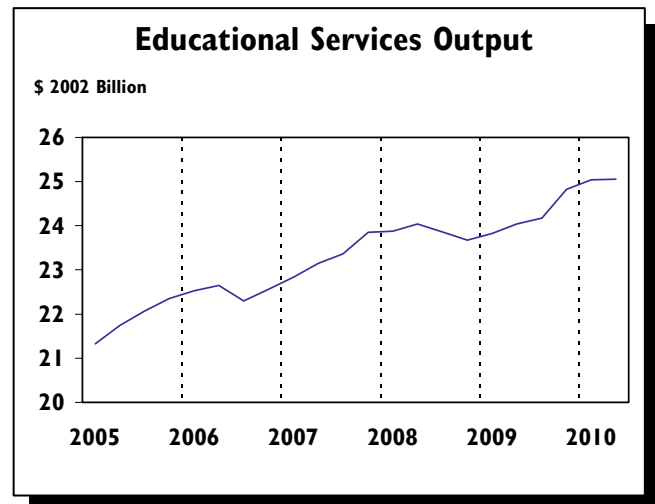


Note: Construction industry output is measured by the value added of the industry. Construction investment, as reported in the expenditure-based GDP accounts, measures the spending on new construction projects.

EDUCATION, HEALTH CARE AND PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

Production in both the education and health care and social service sectors edged up 0.1% in the second quarter, decelerating from stronger first quarter gains.

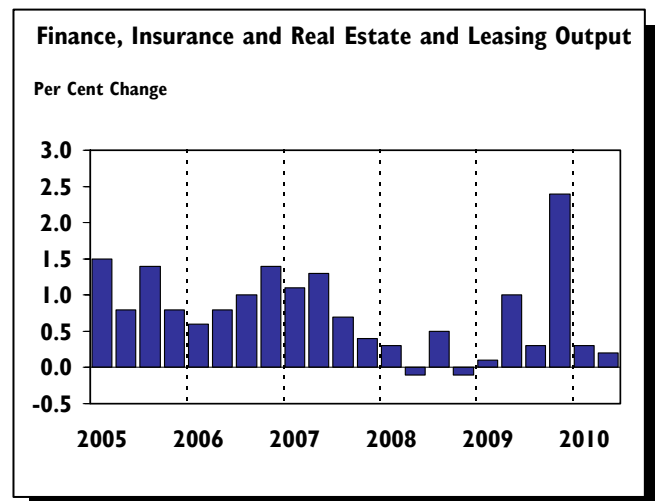
Public administration output slipped 0.2%, reflecting a modest decline in employment. This was the first quarterly decline in almost four years.



FINANCE, INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE AND LEASING*

Output in the finance, insurance and real estate and leasing sector rose 0.2% in the second quarter, following a 0.3% gain in the first quarter.

Gains in a number of industries – including banking (+1.9%) – more than offset a sharp decline in the other financial services category (-2.9%) (which includes activities of real estate agents and brokers) and reflects the recent softening in sales of existing homes.



*This sector (NAICS 5A) includes the finance, insurance, real estate and renting and leasing and management industries.

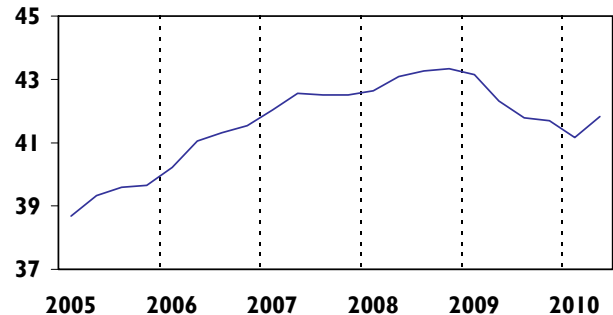
OTHER SERVICE SECTOR INDUSTRIES

Output of professional and administrative services increased 1.6% in the quarter, as net employment increased by more than 8,400 (+1.4%). The second quarter gain in production follows five consecutive quarterly declines for the industry.

In the information and culture sector (which includes telecommunications), production increased 0.8% while output in the arts, entertainment and recreation industry fell 2.2%.

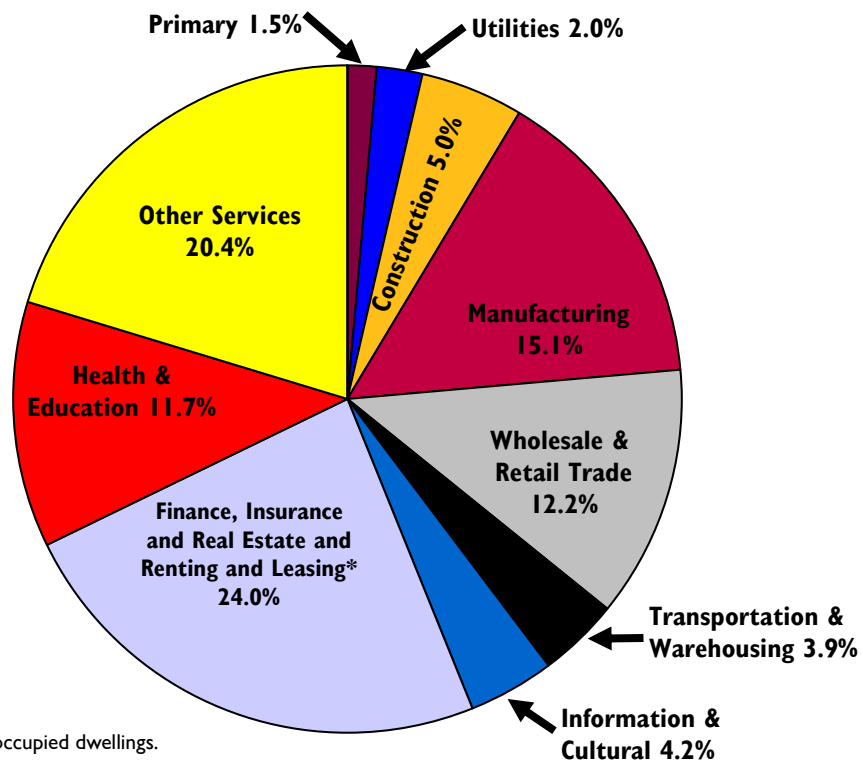
Professional & Administrative Services Output

Business gross fixed capital formation - Residential Structures, Millions of chained (2002) dollars

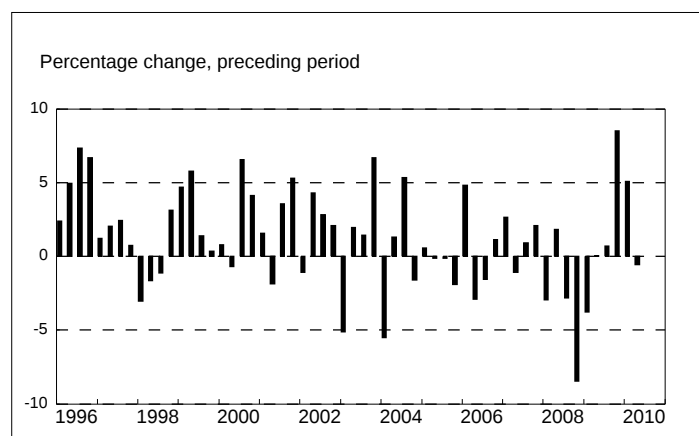

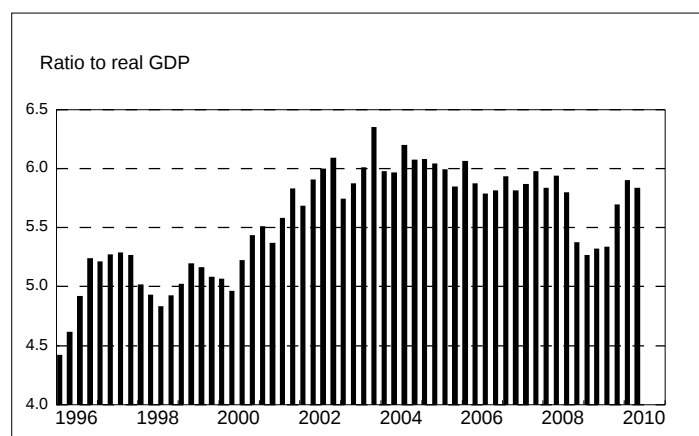

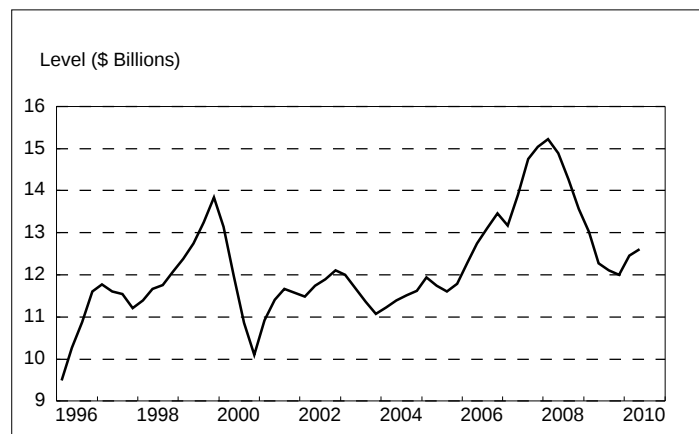

Business gross fixed capital formation - Non-residential Structures, **Millions of chained (2002) dollars**

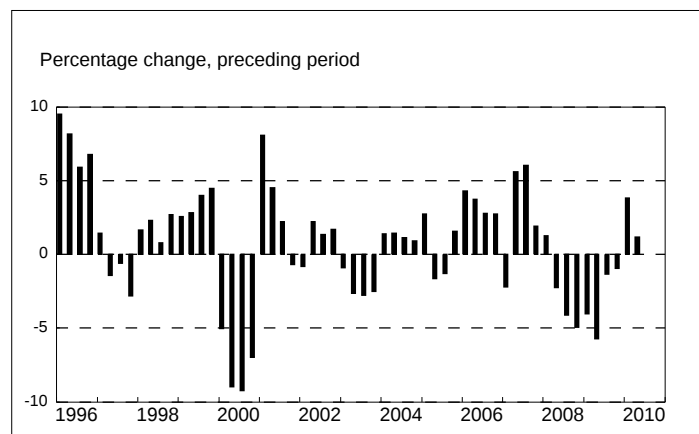

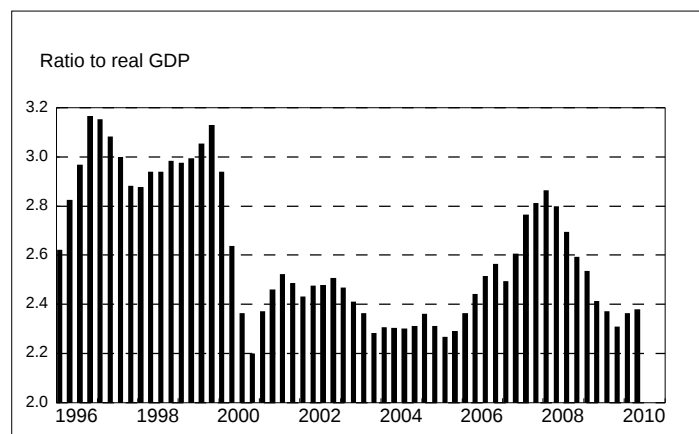

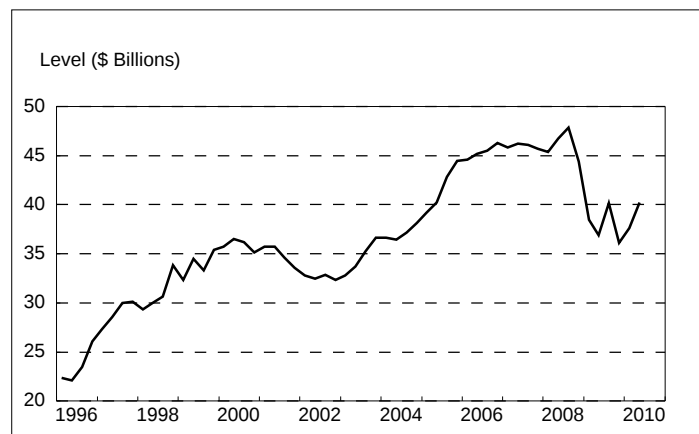

Business gross fixed capital formation - Machinery and equipment, Millions of chained (2002) dollars

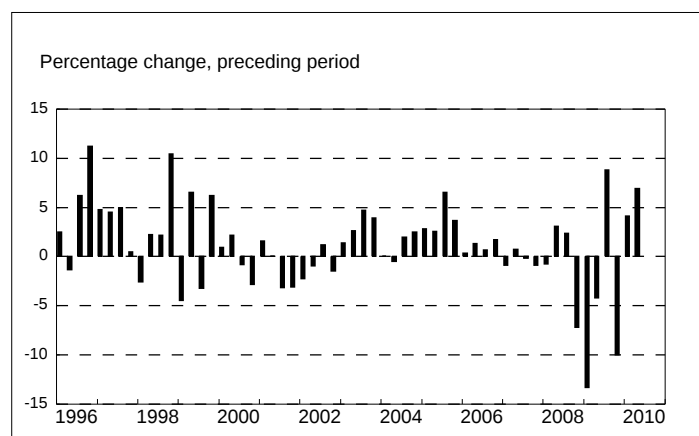
