Ontario Economic Accounts



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Note to Users of the Ontario Economic Accounts

On November 30, 2012 Statistics Canada released the third quarter 2012 Canadian Economic Accounts based on a new revised international standard – the SNA 2008 (System of National Accounts). This new standard includes major conceptual, classification and methodological improvements. The release included new quarterly estimates back to 1981, with real GDP rebased from 2002 to 2007 dollars. Statistics Canada has also released revised annual Provincial Economic Accounts (PEA) estimates for 2007 to 2011, consistent with the revisions to the Canadian Economic Accounts. Statistics Canada will release complete annual PEA estimates from 1981, later in 2013.

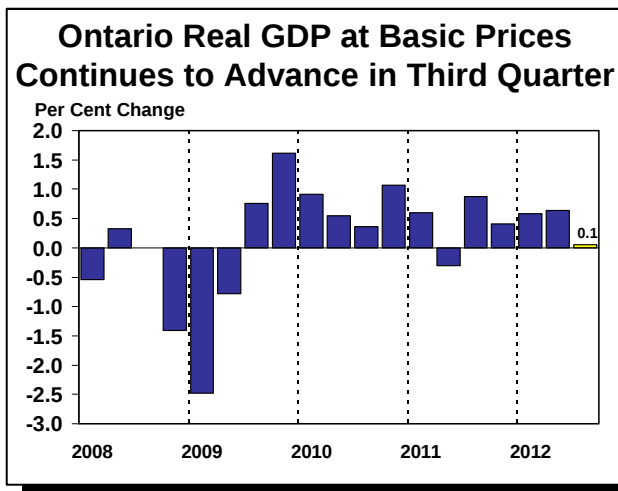
As a result of these changes, the Ontario Ministry of Finance will release revised Ontario Economic Accounts (OEA), consistent with Statistics Canada's new Canadian and Provincial Economic Accounts. These revisions to the OEA will require an extensive redesign of the methodologies and processes used to produce the quarterly estimates which could not be completed for this release.

This release of the OEA includes an estimate of real GDP (\$2002) on an industry basis for the third quarter of 2012. In addition, this release includes annual tables for 2007 to 2011 for real and current dollar GDP on an income and expenditure basis.

A complete, revised version of the Ontario Economic Accounts, including detailed, quarterly income and expenditure tables, will be released with the fourth quarter 2012 estimates in April 2013.

THIRD QUARTER (JULY-SEPTEMBER) 2012 SUMMARY AND RECENT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

- Ontario's real **Gross Domestic Product** (GDP) on an industry basis and at basic prices increased 0.1% in the third quarter of 2012, following gains of 0.6% in the second quarter and 0.6% in the first quarter. Output in the goods-producing sector declined by 0.9% while service sector output rose by 0.3% in the third quarter.
- **Employment** increased by 0.5% in the fourth quarter of 2012, following 0.2% gains in the second and third quarters.
- **Compensation of employees** (formerly "Labour Income") increased 0.6% in the third quarter of 2012, decelerating from the 1.0% and 0.9% gains in the second and first quarters.
- **Retail sales** rose 0.3% in the third quarter, after declining 1.0% in the previous quarter. Over the first ten months of 2012, retail sales were up 2.2% compared to the same period in 2011.
- Retail sales increased 0.5% in October, following no change in September.
- **Housing starts** decreased 12.2% in the fourth quarter, following a 3.8% decline in the third quarter. **Home resales** declined by 1.2% in the fourth quarter, following a 7.4% drop in the previous quarter.
- On an annual basis, Ontario housing starts* rose 14.1% in 2012, up for the third consecutive year.
 - Sales of existing Ontario homes decreased 2.1% in 2012, after rising 2.7% in 2011.
- *urban-area starts
- **International merchandise exports** (on a customs basis) declined 3.4% in the third quarter of 2012, following a 3.0% advance in the previous quarter. **Ontario international merchandise imports** fell by 3.8% in the third quarter, following a 0.9% decline in the second quarter.
- Merchandise exports declined by 0.4% in November while imports were up 3.5%.
- **The Consumer Price Index (CPI)** rose 0.8% (year-to-year) in the third quarter of 2012, the lowest rate of inflation since the fourth quarter of 2009. Lower energy prices contributed to the deceleration in consumer prices.



- The CPI was 0.7% higher in November than a year earlier, down from 1.0% in October. This was the fifth consecutive month of year-to-year increases of 1% or less.

ONTARIO PRODUCTION BY INDUSTRY

HIGHLIGHTS

Real GDP by industry advanced by 0.1% in the third quarter, following gains of 0.6% in the first and second quarters. Output in the goods-producing sector declined by 0.9%, but was more than offset by a 0.3% increase in service sector activity.

The financial (+0.2%), transportation and warehousing (+1.1%) and information and culture (+0.9%) sectors all contributed to the third quarter gain. Production was lower in the manufacturing (-0.8%) and utilities (-2.9%) sectors.

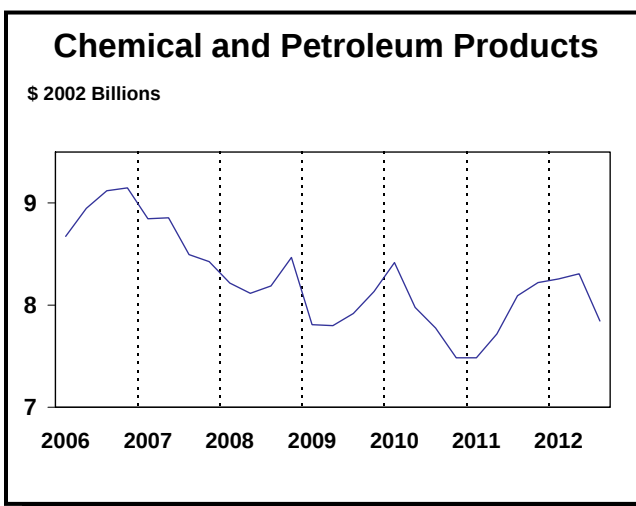
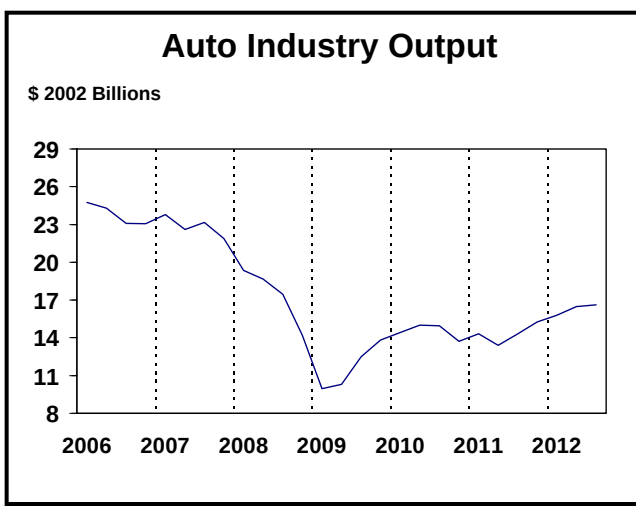
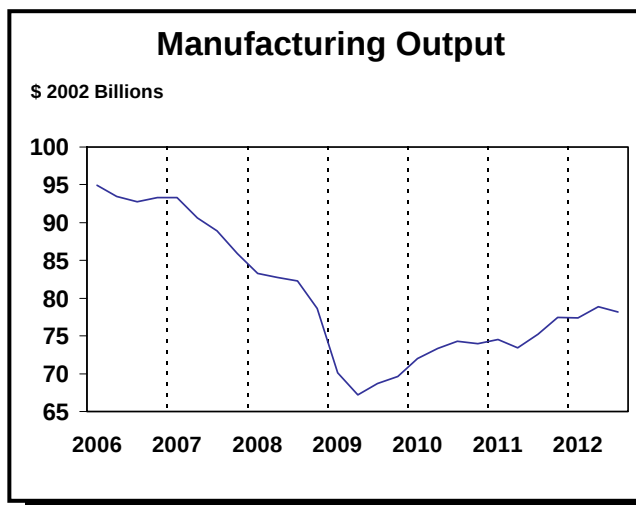
MANUFACTURING OUTPUT DOWN

The manufacturing sector's output declined by 0.8% in the third quarter, following a solid 1.9% second quarter gain.

Seven of eleven manufacturing industries reported lower production in the third quarter, with notable declines in chemical and petroleum products (-5.9%), transportation equipment (-1.0%), paper and printing (-4.5%) and plastic and rubber products (-2.0%).

Within the transportation equipment sector, auto industry output advanced 0.9% following four quarters of strong gains. Production in "other transportation equipment", primarily composed of the aerospace sector, decreased by 6.8%, the third consecutive quarterly decline.

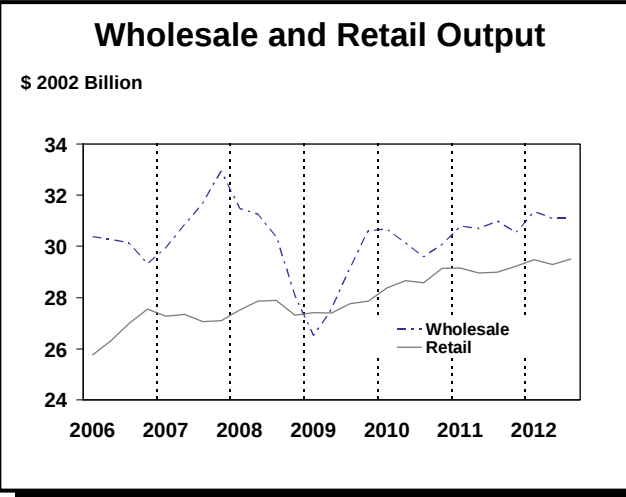
Partially offsetting these declines were gains in the food, beverage and tobacco (+2.1%) and primary metal and fabricated metal (+1.3%) product industries.



WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE ADVANCE

Wholesaling activity edged up 0.1% in the third quarter, after falling 0.8% in the previous quarter. Stronger activity was reported by wholesalers of machinery and equipment and farm products.

Production in the retail trade sector rose 0.7% reversing a 0.6% second quarter decline. Gains in furniture and clothing stores were moderated by lower motor vehicle and parts retailing.



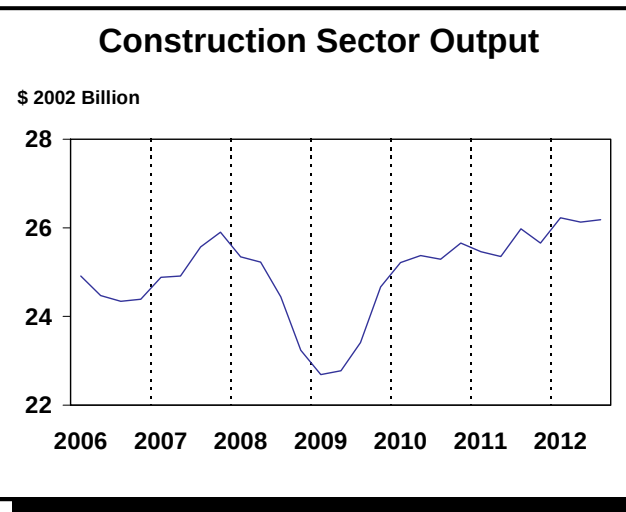
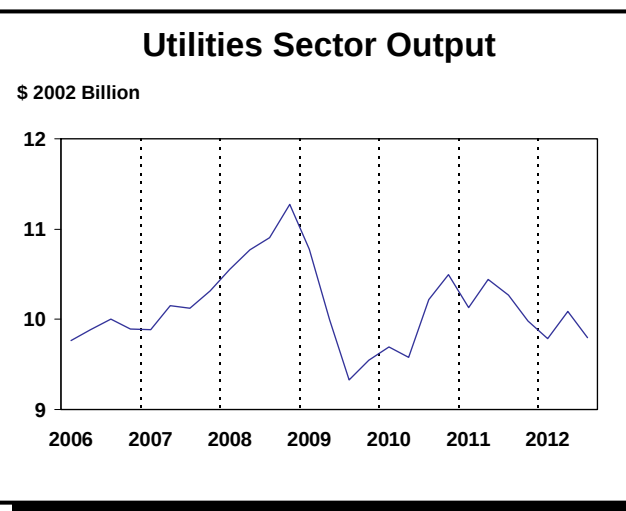
UTILITIES, CONSTRUCTION AND NATURAL RESOURCES

Utilities output fell by 2.9% in the third quarter, following a gain of 3.1% in the second quarter. Output of electric power utilities declined 3.9% while production in the natural gas and water distribution industry rose 0.7%.

Construction sector output rose 0.2% after falling 0.4% in the second quarter. A gain in non-residential and engineering construction (+0.4%) was partly offset by a decline in residential construction (-0.2%).

Mining output declined by 5.6%, following a 0.9% increase the previous quarter. Reduced output at copper, nickel, lead and zinc mines, contributed to the third quarter decline.

Output in the agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting industries declined by 0.8% in the quarter, as the dry summer hampered crop production.



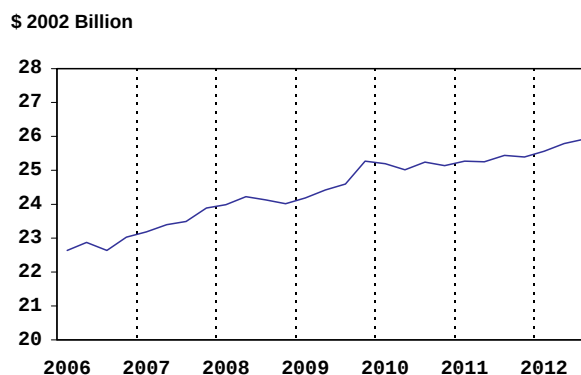
Note: Construction industry output is measured by the value added of the industry. Construction investment, as reported in the expenditure-based GDP accounts, measures the spending on new construction projects.

EDUCATION, HEALTH CARE AND PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

Education services increased 0.5% in the third quarter, the third consecutive quarterly gain.

Production in health care and social services advanced 0.6%, while public administration output declined 0.3%.

Educational Services Output

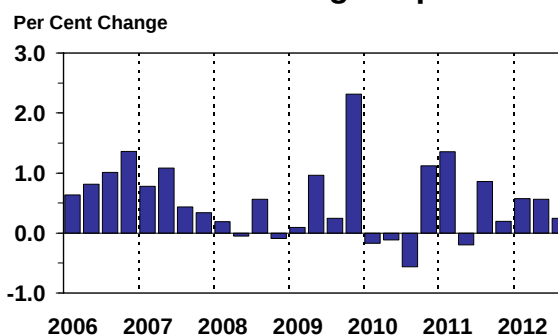


FINANCE, INSURANCE, REAL ESTATE AND LEASING*

Output in the finance, insurance, real estate and leasing sector rose 0.2% in the third quarter, the fifth consecutive quarterly gain. Third quarter growth was supported by gains in the banking industry.

*This sector (NAICS 5A) includes the finance, insurance, real estate and renting and leasing and management industries.

Finance, Insurance and Real Estate and Leasing Output

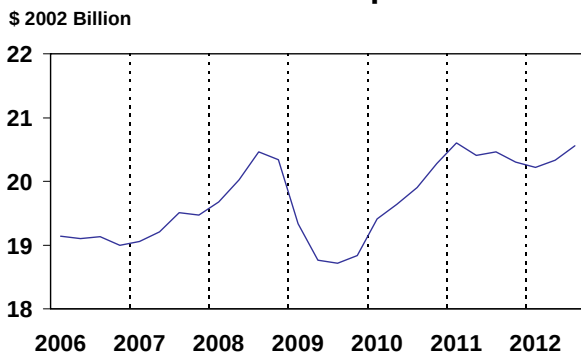


OTHER SERVICE SECTOR INDUSTRIES

In the transportation and warehousing sector, production advanced 1.1%, in part reflecting gains in transit and ground passenger transportation.

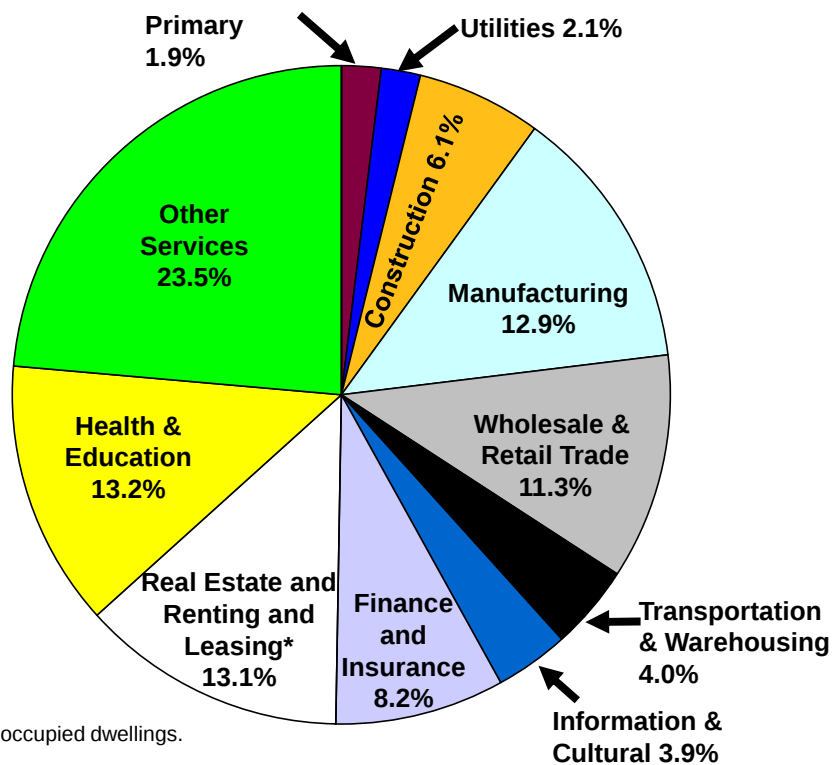
Output in the information and cultural sector advanced (+0.9%) while arts, entertainment and recreation output fell (-1.1%).

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Note to Users on Revisions to the GDP by Industry Estimates

The GDP by industry estimates published in the third quarter 2012 Ontario Economic Accounts are expressed in real 2002 dollars and are based on the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2002).

On December 14, 2012, Statistics Canada released revised annual Provincial Economic Accounts GDP by industry data for all provinces based on the updated NAICS 2007 classification system and expressed in 2007 dollars. These revised annual estimates are available on Statistics Canada's website (refer to CANSIM Table 379-0030).

The fourth quarter 2012 Ontario Economic Accounts, to be released in April 2013, will include GDP by industry estimates rebased to 2007 dollars and revised to the NAICS 2007 classification system.
