I have the honour to submit herewith the Thirteenth Report of the Liquor Control Board of Ontario for the twelve months' fiscal period which ended the 31st of March, 1939.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Balance Sheet, certified to by Messrs. Brokenshire, Scarff & Co., Chartered Accountants, shows the amount of fixed assets to be \$125,115.30. This amount represents the value of the Board's real estate, consisting of the land and buildings situated at 154 Wellington St. W., Toronto, and 201 Victoria Ave., Fort William, occupied as warehouses, and, the value of all furniture, equipment and alterations in the various premises occupied by the Board, less depreciation, which, since the commencement of operations in June, 1927, has been provided to an extent of \$991,828.10.

Sales of permits during the twelve months amounted to a net figure of \$553,137.68, which with the amount unpaid from the previous year of \$33,995.62, and an advance sale of 1939-40 Permits of \$1,126.65 net, totalled \$588,259.95, of which \$585,000.00 was remitted to the Provincial Treasurer, in accordance with the requirements of the Liquor Control Act of Ontario, Section 18 (2).

The item of \$5,931.59 represents a balance due to the Provincial Treasurer for forfeited liquor, after the amount of \$5,000.00 had been remitted to the Provincial Treasurer, this liquor having been purchased by the Board after careful examination, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 132 (2) of the Act.

Contingent liabilities amounted to \$997,887.55. These items comprise the value of undelivered orders and, also, the amount of customs or excise duties which will have to be paid on the goods which were in bond on our premises March 31st, when the same are cleared. These items are not chargeable against, nor do they affect the operations of the Board for the period under review.

The Profit and Loss Account shows sales for the twelve months from Liquor Control Board stores of \$22,420,060.59.

The same account shows a gross trading profit of \$8,184,896.85 with total expenses including depreciation and items written off, of \$1,861,755.20 which resulted in a net trading profit of \$6,323,141.65. This latter sum, together with other revenue which amounted to \$3,252,879.39, resulted in a total profit of \$9,576,021.04, which is carried to the Surplus Account.

For the purpose of comparison, the percentage that the cost of stock sold, miscellaneous earnings and expenses and other revenue bear to the sales are given for the fiscal year of 1938 and the twelve months' period herewith reported upon.

The Surplus Account shows a balance at the commencement of the period of \$879,333.75, this being the amount of accumulated profits from previous years' operations which had not been transferred to the Provincial Treasurer. Added to this is the twelve months' profit of \$9,576,021.04, which, together with \$1,843.78 representing sundry adjustments, resulted in an amount of \$10,457,198.57. From this sum, \$10,410,000.00 was remitted to the Provincial Treasurer. The total payments to the Provincial Treasurer during the twelve months were, therefore:—

Besides the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Account, and the Surplus Account, statements showing Summary of Sales (Schedule 1) and the Expenses of Administration and Operation (Schedule II) for the twelve months are also attached. Individual percentages which these expenses bear to the total sales are given for the twelve months and also for the preceding fiscal period, on the expense statement. On March 31st, 1939, the staff comprised 873 employees, 44 of these being part-time or seasonally employed as against 809 permanent and 39 temporary employed one year previously.

In addition, all Liquor Board stores, brewers' warehouses, breweries and wineries privileged to sell alcoholic beverages in Ontario, as of March 31st, 1939, are set forth on Schedule III; a classification of permits and licenses issued appears on Schedule IV, and a summary of Authorities, Standard Hotel Licenses and Light Beer Permits issued, cancelled, suspended, surrendered and reinstated during the year, with the number operative on March 31st, is set forth on Schedule V.

SALES

The sale of spirits, beer and wine from liquor stores during the twelve months amounted to \$22,420,060.59. The net value of beer sold from breweries and brewers' warehouses, i.e., exclusive of any charge for containers, totalled \$25,192,225.40. Sales of native wines made direct to customers from Licensed native wine sale offices, and, where permitted, from the winery premises, amounted to \$2,025,700.27.

STORES

The number of liquor stores in operation on March 31st was one hundred and twenty-eight. Two new stores were opened during the period—Store No. 31, at Collingwood, on June 28th, 1938, and Store No. 129, at Geraldton, on July 21st, 1938.

Three stores were moved to new locations, as follows:—

No. 1—Toronto—from S.E. corner Church and Lombard to N.E. corner Church and Lombard Sts.

No. 91—Kirkland Lake—from 69 Duncan Ave. to Kirkland Street.

No. 92—Englehart—from 91 Fourth Ave. to Third Street.

BREWERIES AND BREWERS' WAREHOUSES

On March 31st, 1939, there were twenty-four Ontario and four Quebec breweries licensed to sell their products in Ontario.

Two Ontario Breweries were closed during the year—the City Club Breweries, Toronto, on September 30th, 1938, and Taylor and Bate Limited, Hamilton, on December 31st, 1938.

The corporate name of one Brewery was changed on April 30th, 1938, i.e., Jockey Club Brewing Corporation, Guelph, to the Ace High Brewery Limited.

The number of Province of Quebec breweries operating through Ontario Brewers' Warehouses remained unchanged from the previous year.

The gallonage of domestic strong beer sold in Ontario during the years 1935 to 1939 inclusive, as computed from the sales records of the Board and with respect to sales to destinations outside Ontario from the monthly reports of the Ontario brewers, was as follows:—

The number of Brewers' Warehouses in operation at the year end totalled one hundred and nine, seven warehouses being opened during the period—at the following locations:—

From June 15th to September 17th, a warehouse was operated at Jackson's Point.

WINERIES

The Board continued their direct interest in the affairs of the grape-growers and promoted the continuance of the agreement between the wine manufacturers and the growers, whereby, the manufacturers agreed to pay \$40.00 per ton for all blue grapes and \$50.00 per ton for other varieties.

Supervision of the quality of native wine has been maintained by the Provincial Department of Health through periodical analyses. During the year, 407 samples were tested. Fourteen were found to violate the Regulations and were withdrawn from sale. Forty-eight cultures of pure yeast were sent to various wineries.

A revision of the Board's Regulations with respect to native wine was approved by Order-in-Council and made effective January 1st, 1939. A number of Regulations having reference to the manufacture of native wine which previously had been approved pursuant to the Public Health Act of Ontario were repealed and then incorporated in the revised Regulations of the Board. This action will permit better enforcement of the Regulations in question and eventually further improvement in quality.

During the year under review, the following native wine licenses were purchased by other licensees and surrendered and in each case, the Board, in accordance with Regulation No. 106, authorized the operation of a Retail Sales Shop in an approved location by the licensee, who surrendered the license. Details are as follows:

During the year, the tonnage of grapes used in the manufacture of wine, concentrates, grape juice, and brandy, was 11,348 tons for wine; 1,307 tons for concentrates; 490 tons for grape juice.

One hundred and eighty-one tons of cherries also were used for wine making.

During the preceding year, 226,418 gallons of native wine were distilled into grape spirit for wine fortification, while during the year under review, 179,940 gallons were used for such purpose.

The sale of Canadian Brandy—a product of the Ontario grape—again increased. In the year ending March 31st, 1938, 13,791 gallons were sold, while 15,073 gallons were sold during the past year.

At the close of the year, there were twenty-three winery licenses operative, compared with twenty-nine at the end of the previous year, direct sale to customers being made from the premises of eight wineries and forty-one branch retail sales shops.

AUTHORITIES FOR THE SALE OF BEER AND WINE

Complete details by Municipalities of the number of Authorities which were issued, cancelled, suspended or surrendered during the year, together with reinstatements, are set forth on Schedule V.

On March 31st, 1939—the end of the fiscal year—there were one thousand, one hundred and sixty-seven Hotel Authorities in operation, two hundred and thirty-five Club Authorities, one hundred and twenty-four Military Mess Authorities and one Railway Authority.

Authorities were issued for six months to sixty-two Summer Hotels. Of these, eight were extended to an annual basis after payment of the required additional fee.

The fee for Hotel and Railway Authorities was continued at six cents per gallon of beer purchased and five per cent. of the value of wine bought, payable monthly with a minimum fee of \$300.00 per annum for full year Authorities and \$150.00 for the six months' Summer Hotel Authorities.

From April 1st, 1938, the fees for all Club Authorities were fixed on the same

basis as Hotel Authorities, with minimum fees of \$100.00 for Social Clubs and \$50.00 for Soldier and Labour Clubs.

The annual fees for Steamship Authorities and Military Mess Authorities were continued at \$50.00 and \$10.00 respectively.

Authorized Premises were visited regularly and Inspectors kept in close contact with Municipal and Provincial Police in reference to the operation of all authorized premises.

PAYMENTS TO MUNICIPALITIES

In accordance with the Act and the governing Order-in-Council, the Board paid to the various municipalities 20% of the fees received from their local hotel authority holders. Three hundred and seven municipalities participated in this disbursement which totalled \$188,920.21, same being paid during May, 1939.

HOTELS

On March 31st, 1939, one thousand three hundred and twenty-four Standard Hotel Licenses were effective, of which one thousand one hundred and sixty-seven possessed an Authority to sell beer and wine; forty-six were holders of Light Beer Permits and one hundred and eleven held only the Standard Hotel License. There was no change in fees.

The Board receives a detailed annual report from its twenty-three Inspectors covering all Hotels in the Province, and in addition to these, conduct reports were received at least once a month. The same intensive inspection service has continued in operation with respect to all authorized premises, and further progress has been made towards the improvement of hotel accommodation throughout the Province. Special attention was given to the question of fire prevention and the safety of guests. Continued co-operation was received by the Board from the Officers of the Provincial Fire Marshal and the Provincial Department of Health in matters pertaining to the betterment of conditions in Hotels, which hereby is gratefully acknowledged.

PERMITS

From April 1st, 1938, to March 31st, 1939, there were 47,420 Individual Annual Liquor Permits issued. The sales of Single Purchase Permits totalled 3,136,171. Individual Permits sold to non-residents, valid for a period not exceeding one month, numbered 43. In addition, 1,999 Special Permits were issued to Physicians, Druggists, Hospitals, etc.

During the year, the Board continued to give full co-operation to municipal officers and departments administering relief.

In many municipalities relief authorities keep hotels and other authorized vendors of liquor supplied direct with up-to-date lists of persons on relief, and, in keeping with the Board's policy, every endeavour is made to prevent such persons from buying intoxicants.

In accordance with the requirements of the Act, the Board, after thorough investigation, deemed it advisable during the year to issue 3,259 Prohibitory Orders, an increase of 185 over the preceding year. Such action followed either notification relative to conviction for violation of the Act, or the receipt of a request or recommendation from some interested party, such as a relative, friend, magistrate, police officer, physician, relief officer, etc. These Prohibitory Orders comprised 603 full Board Orders which precluded the individual concerned from purchasing alcoholic beverages from any source. Included therein were 39 which resulted from Judges' Orders of Interdiction, and 54 from convictions for intoxication while in charge of a motor vehicle. In twenty-nine other cases, it was deemed advisable to afford the individual restricted purchasing privileges only, such as allowing the purchase for home consumption through a specified store of limited quantities per week or month.

The remaining 2,627 were Orders which cancelled the individual's privilege to purchase alcoholic beverages for home consumption.

With respect to the 2,627 cases referred to, 974 were the result of convictions having been registered under the Criminal Code of Canada for intoxication while in charge of an automobile. A further 829 followed the conviction of the individual for violation of the Liquor Control Act, and the premises of 540 of these were declared a "public place" within the meaning of the Act. The other Orders were issued as being in the best interests of all concerned according to the judgment of the Board from the available information at hand.

During the twelve months under review, after full investigation and consideration, it was decided to revoke 241 of the Prohibitory Orders which had been made effective at some prior date.

During the year, 1,600 Special Permits were issued to Druggists. These permits constituted authority for the druggist to purchase alcohol in limited quantities for compounding and pharmaceutical purposes and also accorded him the privilege of buying rubbing alcohol for re-sale. The premises of holders of Druggists' Special Permits were subject to periodical inspection, and, in addition, Druggists were required to file monthly with the Board a report of all rubbing alcohol sales.

Continued efforts were made to prevent the use of rubbing alcohol as a beverage and during the year the names of eighty addicts were posted with all druggists in the larger communities of the Province.

For failure to comply with the Board's Regulations, it became necessary during the year to cancel one and to refuse issuance of six Druggists' Special Permits.

GENERAL

The Board were favoured with the co-operation of all Police Departments in the Province during the year, for which due appreciation is hereby recorded.

The operations of the Board, as above reviewed, were administered by the late Edmond G. Odette, whose unfortunate death occurred on March 31st, 1939. A

most active and competent business executive, his passing has been keenly felt by a host of friends in all walks of life, and particularly by the undersigned, who enjoyed his friendship for many years.
