I have the honour to submit herewith the Twenty-second Report of the Board for the twelve months' fiscal period which ended the 31st of March, 1948.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Balance Sheet, certified to by Messrs. Robertson, Robinson, McCannell & Dick, Chartered Accountants, shows the amount of fixed assets to be \$426,611.25. This amount represents the value of the Board's real estate, consisting of land on Fleet Street, Toronto, the land and buildings situated at 154 Wellington Street West, Toronto, 210 Victoria Avenue, Fort William, and 28 Silver Street, Cobalt, occupied as warehouses and stores, and the value of all furniture, equipment and alterations in the various premises of the Board, less depreciation, which, since the commencement of operations in June 1927 has been provided to an extent of \$1,379,847.99.

The item of \$35,068.89 represents a balance due for forfeited liquor which was purchased by the Board after analytical examination and in accordance with the provision of Section 132(2) of The Act.

The Reserve Account for insurance and contingencies was increased by \$200,000.00 as of March 31, 1948, bringing the total amount as shown to \$400,000.00.

Contingent liabilities amounted to \$5,798,070.08. These items comprise the value of undelivered orders to the extent of \$4,119,327.41 and also the amount of \$1,678,742.67 for Customs and Excise Duties which will have to be paid on the goods which were in bond on our premises March 31st, when the same are cleared. These items are not chargeable against, nor do they affect, the operations of the Board for the period under review.

The Profit and Loss Account shows sales for the twelve months from Liquor Control Board stores of \$76,454,339.27.

The same account shows a gross trading profit of \$29,169,150.48, with total expenses including depreciation of \$3,937,888.58 which resulted in a net trading profit of \$25,231,261.90. This latter sum, together with other revenue derived from permit sales, fees and taxes on brewers and wine manufacturers and their products, from licence holders taxes and from fines which amounted to \$11,804,460.16, resulted in a total net income of \$37,035,722.06. The expenses incurred by The Liquor Licence Board amounted to \$227,919.49. This item is chargeable against the profits of The Liquor Control Board as provided by Section 10 of The Liquor Licence Act, 1946. The net income of the Board was reduced thereby to \$36,807,802.57 which is carried to the Surplus Account.

For the purpose of comparison, the percentage that the cost of stock sold, miscellaneous earnings and expenses and other revenue bear to the sales are given for the fiscal year 1946-47 and the twelve months' period herewith reported upon.

The Surplus Account shows a balance at the commencement of the period of \$21,702,185.28, this being the amount carried forward from the previous year's operations which had not been transferred to The Provincial Treasurer. After the deduction of \$3,246.86 which represented sundry adjustments and the deduction of \$200,000.00 for the aforementioned insurance reserve account, the twelve months net income of \$36,807,802.57 is added to produce a total amount of \$58,306,740.99 which is carried forward to the Balance Sheet. From this sum \$37,000,000.00 was remitted to The Provincial Treasurer.

Besides the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Account and the Surplus Account, a statement showing the expenses of Administration and Operation for the twelve months is also attached. Individual percentages which these bear to the total sales are given for the twelve months and also for the preceding fiscal period. On March 31, 1948, the staff comprised 1,165 employees, 71 of these being part-time or seasonally employed, as against 1,101 permanent and 72 part-time at the previous year-end.

All Liquor Control Board Stores, Brewers' Retail Stores, Breweries and Wineries from which alcoholic beverages are sold in Ontario, as of March 31st, 1948, are set forth on Schedule II and a classification of permits and licenses issued appears on Schedule III.

SALES

The sale of spirits, beer and wine from liquor stores during the twelve months amounted to \$76,454,339.27. The net value of beer sold from breweries and brewers' retail stores, exclusive of any charge for containers, totalled \$89,365,375.35. Sales of Ontario wine made direct to customers from licensed Ontario Wine Sales Offices and where permitted, from winery premises, amounted to \$4,767,864.33.

Sales of spirits and wine to licencees operating under The Liquor Licence Act amounted to \$2,624,075.96 and are included in the previously mentioned total liquor stores sales figures.

As shown in this report, the Board paid to the Provincial Treasurer the sum of \$37,000,000.00 on account of Profits, License Fees, etc. The Board also set aside for payment to the various municipalities a proportion of the fees received from Licencees, such amount totalling \$878,026.47 which was distributed to 205 municipalities.

Additional to the above payments made by the Board, the Dominion Government received \$29,206,424.55 during the course of the year in Customs and Excise Duties and Sales and Excise taxes on spirits, wines and imported beers purchased by the Board. The Dominion Government also received approximately \$30,000,000.00 for malt duties and taxes on domestic beers and wines sold in Ontario, the total aggregating about \$59,000,000.00.

Therefore, the grand total of revenue payments received by the respective Dominion, Provincial and Municipal Governments was approximately \$97,000,000.00 as a result of levies on alcoholic beverages sold in Ontario during

the year. This amount was exclusive of Dominion and Provincial corporation and municipal realty taxes paid by the respective manufacturers and licence holders.

STORES

The number of liquor stores in operation on March 31st, 1948, was 140. Included in this number are two stores—one in Toronto and one in Ottawa—which were opened during the year to accommodate licence holders, mail order customers and delivery orders. Four additional stores were also opened in various sections of the province.

BREWERIES AND BREWERS' RETAIL STORES

On March 31st, 1948 there were twenty-two Ontario and four Quebec breweries licensed to sell their products in Ontario, the number being unchanged since the previous year-end.

The corporate name of one brewery was changed on July 1st, 1947—that being—Carling Breweries (Walkerville) Limited, to—O'Keefe's Brewery (Walkerville) Limited, Windsor.

The policy of The Liquor Control Board to have periodical analyses made by the Chief Provincial Analyst of all brands of beer produced by Ontario brewers, as well as the products of the Quebec breweries sold in this province, was continued during the year under review. The analyses of the year indicated that all the samples examined conformed to the requirements of the Regulations passed pursuant to The Food and Drugs Act of Canada.

WINERIES

The products of all Ontario licensed wineries were analysed during the year for the Board by the Provincial Department of Health in order to ensure that they conformed to the Board's regulations. In addition 7 wineries availed themselves of the facilities of The Provincial Board of Health Laboratories and procured 22 cultures of yeast for wine-making.

The premises of all Ontario wineries were inspected by the Board's Inspectors during the year. The plants of the Sacramental Wine Vendors were included in those inspections.

On March 31, 1948, there were 20 wineries operating in Ontario. Sales were conducted direct from the premises of 5 wineries and from 44 branch retail sales offices, an addition of one branch retail sales office since the previous year-end. The new sales office was opened by The London Winery Limited at 693 Bayview Avenue, Leaside, on December 11th, 1947.

Last year 246,525 gallons of Ontario wine were distilled into grape-spirit for wine fortification while during the year under review 189,101 gallons were used for such purposes.

HOME-MADE WINE PERMITS

On January 1st, 1940, regulations became effective which required that any person manufacturing more than 100 gallons of home-made wines must obtain a permit from the Board. During the fiscal year herein reviewed, five of these permits were issued.

PERMITS

874,093 Individual Annual Liquor Permits were issued for the year ending March 31, 1948. Individual Permits sold to non-residents valid for a period not exceeding one month numbered 99,215. In addition 2,917 Special Permits were issued to physicians, druggists, hospitals, etc.

During the year, cancellations or full or part-time Prohibitory Orders were issued against 3,829 permittees. These restrictive measures were directed by the Board for various reasons which are detailed as follows:

1,669 Special Permits were issued to druggists, one of which was suspended and one cancelled during the year. These Special Permits allowed the druggist to purchase liquor in limited quantities for compounding medicine or for use as a solvent or preservative. It also accorded him the privilege of buying rubbing alcohol for resale. The premises of all holders of Druggists' Special Permits were subject to periodical inspections and these inspections included an examination of the records of the sales of rubbing alcohol which druggists are required to maintain.
