I have the honour to submit herewith the Twenty-third Report of the Board for the twelve months' fiscal period which ended the 31st of March, 1949.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Balance Sheet, with certification inserted thereon, by the Auditors of the Board, Messrs. Robertson, Robinson, McCannell & Dick, Chartered Accountants, shows the amount of fixed assets to be \$426,611.25. This amount, unchanged since the previous year-end, represents the value, less depreciation of \$1,499,465.46, of the Board's real estate, together with all furniture, fixtures, machinery and equipment in the stores, warehouses and offices. The real estate consists of land situated at Fleet Street, Toronto; land and warehouse buildings at 154 Wellington Street West, Toronto; land, warehouse and store buildings at 210 Victoria Avenue, Fort William; and land and store buildings at 28 Silver Street, Cobalt.

Current assets totalled \$23,093,524.60, being divided as follows:

Current liabilities of the Board are shown as \$1,626,224.00 being:

The item of \$36,220.01 represents a balance due for forfeited liquor which was purchased by the Board after analytical examination and in accordance with the provision of Section 132(2) of The Act.

The Reserve Account for insurance and contingencies was increased by \$200,000.00 as of March 31st, 1949, bringing the total amount as shown to \$600,000.00.

Contingent liabilities amounted to \$4,600,033.09. These items represent the value of undelivered orders to an extent of \$2,702,575.65, and also the amount of \$1,897,457.44 for Customs and Excise Duties which are payable on the goods which were in bond in our warehouses on March 31st, when the same

are cleared. These liabilities do not affect the trading profits of the Board for the period under review.

The Profit and Loss Account shows sales for the twelve months from Liquor Control Board Stores of \$82,908,658.19.

The same account shows a gross trading profit of \$31,714,003.68 with total expenses including depreciation of \$4,786,144.30 which resulted in a net trading profit of \$26,927,859.38. This latter sum, together with other revenue derived from permit sales, fees and taxes on brewers and wine manufacturers and their products, from licence holders' taxes and from fines which amounted to \$11,614,934.10, resulted in a total net income of \$38,542,793.48. The expenses incurred by The Liquor Licence Board amounted to \$249,191.76. This item is chargeable against the profits of The Liquor Control Board as provided by Section 10 of The Liquor Licence Act, 1946. The net income of the Board was reduced thereby to \$38,293,601.72 which is carried to the Surplus Account.

For the purpose of comparison, the percentage that the cost of stock sold, miscellaneous earnings and expenses and other revenue bear to the sales are given for the fiscal year 1947-48 and the twelve months' period herewith reported upon.

The Surplus Account shows a balance at the commencement of the period of \$21,306,740.99, this being the amount carried forward from the previous year's operations which had not been transferred to the Provincial Treasurer. After the deduction of \$4,334.95 which represented sundry adjustments and the deduction of \$200,000.00 for the aforementioned insurance reserve account, the twelve months net income of \$38,293,601.72 is added to produce a total amount of \$59,396,007.76 which is carried forward to the Balance Sheet. From this sum \$38,000,000.00 was remitted to the Provincial Treasurer. The Surplus Account on March 31st, 1949, therefore, being a liability to Provincial Treasurer, showed a balance of \$21,396,007.76.

Besides the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Account and the Surplus Account, a statement showing the expenses of Administration and Operation for the twelve months is also attached. Individual percentages which these bear to the total sales are given for the twelve months and also for the preceding fiscal period. On March 31st, 1949, the staff comprised 1,220 employees, 69 of these being part-time or seasonally employed, as against 1,165 permanent and 71 part-time at the previous year-end.

All Liquor Control Board stores, Brewers' retail stores, breweries and wineries from which alcoholic beverages are sold in Ontario, as of March 31st, 1949, are set forth on Schedule I, and a classification of permits and licenses issued appears on Schedule II.

SALES

The sale of spirits, beer and wine from liquor stores during the twelve months amounted to \$82,908,658.19. The net value of beer sold from breweries and brewers' retail stores, exclusive of any charge for containers, totalled \$100,392,231.08. Sales of Ontario wine made direct to customers from licensed Ontario Wine Sales Offices and, where permitted, from winery premises, amounted to \$4,510,185.47.

Sales of spirits, wine and imported beer from Liquor Control Board stores to licencees operating under The Liquor Licence Act amounted to \$3,954,781.46 and are included in the previously-mentioned total liquor store sales figures.

As shown in this report, the Board paid to the Provincial Treasurer the sum of \$38,000,000.00 on account of Profits, License Fees, etc. The Board also created a liability for payment to the various municipalities of a proportion of the fees received from licencees, such amount totalling \$834,773.17 which was distributed to 217 municipalities.

Additional to the above payments made by the Board, the Dominion Government received \$28,742,312.94 during the course of the year in Customs and Excise Duties and Sales and Excise taxes on spirits, wines and imported beers purchased by the Board.

The Dominion Government also received approximately \$31,000,000.00 for Malt Duties and taxes on domestic beers and wines sold in Ontario, the total aggregating about \$60,000,000.00.

Therefore, the grand total of revenue payments received by the respective Dominion, Provincial and Municipal Governments was approximately \$98,-500,000.00 as a result of levies on alcoholic beverages sold in Ontario during the year. This amount was exclusive of Dominion and Provincial Corporation and Municipal Realty taxes paid by the respective manufacturers and licence holders.

BREWERIES AND BREWERS' RETAIL STORES

On March 31st, 1949, there were 23 Ontario and four Quebec breweries licensed to sell their products in Ontario, an increase of one compared to the previous year-end. Old Comrades Brewery Limited commenced operations on August 20th, 1948, at Tecumseh, Ontario.

The corporate name of one brewery was changed on June 21st, 1948, that being—Brading Breweries Limited, to—O'Keefe's Brewery (Ottawa) Limited.

In conformity with the practice of previous years, periodical analyses were made of all brands of beer produced by Ontario brewers, as well as the products of the Quebec breweries sold in this province. The analyses for the year ending March 31st, 1949, indicated that all the samples examined conformed to the requirements of the regulations passed pursuant to The Food and Drugs Act of Canada.

The construction of a completely equipped laboratory at the Central Warehouse, 154 Wellington Street West, Toronto, will, in future, make it possible for the Board to conduct on its own premises, an analysis of all brands of spirits, wine and beer.

WINERIES

The products of all Ontario licensed wineries were analysed by the Board's Analyst in order to ensure that they conformed with the Board's Regulations. Nine wineries availed themselves of the facilities of The Provincial Board of Health Laboratories and procured 29 cultures of yeast for wine-making.

The premises of all Ontario wineries were inspected by the Board's inspectors during the year. The plants of the six Sacramental Wine Vendors were included in these inspections.

On March 31st, 1949, there were 19 wineries operating in Ontario, a reduction of one, compared to the previous year, being occasioned by the purchase of The National Wine Company, by Chateau-Gai Wines Limited. The latter Company thereby acquired an additional Branch Retail Store which increased the number of these outlets to 45. Sales were also conducted direct from the premises of four wineries.

Last year 33,542 gallons of grape spirits were used for wine fortification, while during the year under review, 42,141 gallons were used for such purpose.

HOME-MADE WINE PERMITS

Regulations require that any person manufacturing more than 100 gallons of home-made wines must obtain a permit from the Board. During the fiscal year herein reviewed, four of these permits were issued.

PERMITS

817,538 individual annual liquor permits were issued for the year ending March 31, 1949. Individual permits sold to non-residents, valid for a period not exceeding one month, numbered 95,661. In addition 2,677 special permits were issued to physicians, druggists, hospitals, etc.

During the year cancellations or full or part-time prohibitory orders were issued against 4,224 permittees. These restrictive measures were directed by the Board for various reasons which are detailed as follows:

1,727 special permits were issued to druggists, one of which was cancelled during the year. These special permits allowed the druggist to purchase spirits in limited quantities for compounding medicine or for use as a solvent or preservative. It also accorded him the privilege of buying rubbing alcohol for resale. The premises of all holders of Druggists' Special Permits were subject to periodical inspections and these inspections included an examination of the records of the sales of rubbing alcohol which druggists are required to maintain.
