I have the honour to submit herewith the Twenty-Sixth Report of the Board for the twelve months fiscal period which ended the 31st of March, 1952.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Balance Sheet, with certification inserted thereon by the Auditors of the Board, Messrs. Dick, Bond, Hetherington & O'Loane, Chartered Accountants, shows the amount of fixed assets to be \$1,438,011.39. This amount represents the value, less depreciation of \$4,011,046.74 of the Board's real estate, together with all furniture, fixtures, machinery and equipment in the stores, warehouses and offices. The real estate consists of land and preliminary construction work situated at Fleet and Cooper Streets, Toronto; land and warehouse building at 125 Fleet Street, Toronto; land, warehouse and store buildings at 210 Victoria Avenue, Fort William; and land and store building at 28 Silver Street, Cobalt.

The Confiscated Stock item represents a balance due for forfeited liquor which was purchased by the Board after analytical examination and in accordance with the Provisions of Section 116(2) of The Act. The licence fees liability constitutes amounts deposited as transfer fees with the Board by sundry licencees whose transfer of ownership had not been approved by The Liquor Licence Board as of March 31, 1952.

The Reserve Account for insurance remained at \$1,000,000.00 but an additional Reserve Account for contingencies was created of \$1,500,000.00 to provide for anticipated expenditures in connection with new building at Fleet and Cooper Streets, Toronto.

Contingent liabilities amounted to \$8,424,441.30. These items represent the value of undelivered orders to an extent of \$5,762,521.70 and also the amount of \$2,661,919.60 for Customs and Excise duties which are payable on the goods which were in bond in our warehouse on March 31.

These contingent liabilities have no reflection on the trading profits of the Board.

The Profit and Loss Account shows sales for the 12 months from Liquor Control Board stores of \$101,855,372.29.

The same account shows a gross trading profit of \$38,945,196.67, with total expenses including depreciation of \$7,568,391.50 which resulted in a net trading profit of \$31,376,805.17. This latter sum, together with other revenue of \$12,167,876.65 which was derived from permit sales, fees and taxes on brewers and wine manufacturers and their products, from licence holders' fees and from fines, resulted in a total net income of \$43,544,681.82. The amount of \$1,475,000.00 shown immediately under the Net Income is the previously referred to Reserve item, less \$25,000.00 already reserved, which, when deducted from the net income, resulted in the figure carried forward to the Surplus Account of \$42,069,681.82. The expenses incurred by The Liquor Licence Board amounting to \$431,630.64 are included in the total expense amount.

For the purpose of comparison, the percentage that cost of stock sold, miscellaneous earnings and expenses and other revenue bear to the sales are given for the fiscal year 1950-1951 and the twelve months' period herewith reported upon.

The Surplus Account shows a balance at the commencement of the period of \$22,350,323.18, this being the amount carried forward from the previous year's operations which had not been transferred to the Provincial Treasurer. After the addition of \$1,246.13, which represented sundry adjustments, the amount carried forward from the Profit and Loss Account of \$42,069,681.82 is added to produce a total amount of \$64,421,251.13 which is carried forward to the Balance Sheet. From this sum \$42,000,000.00 was remitted to the Provincial Treasurer. The Surplus of March 31, 1952, therefore, being a liability to the Provincial Treasurer, amounted to \$22,421,251.13.

A statement showing the expenses of administration and operation for the twelve months is also attached. Individual percentages in comparison to the total sales are given for the 12 months and also for the preceding fiscal period. On March 31, 1952, the staff of The Liquor Control Board and The Liquor Licence Board comprised 1,566 employees, 122 of these being part-time or seasonally employed, as against 1,503 permanent and 74 part-time at the previous year-end.

All Liquor Control Board stores, Brewers' Retail Stores, Breweries and Wineries from which alcoholic beverages are sold in Ontario, as of March 31, 1952, are set forth on Schedule I and a classification of permits and licences issued appears on Schedule II.

SALES

The sale of spirits, beer and wine from liquor stores during the 12 months amounted to \$101,855,372.29. The net value of beer sold from breweries and brewers' retail stores, exclusive of any charge for container, totalled \$121,293,461.35. Sales of Ontario wine made direct to customers from licensed

Ontario wine sales offices, and, where permitted, from winery premises amounted to \$4,859,383.07.

Sales of spirits, wine and imported beer from Liquor Control Board stores to licencees operating under the Liquor Licence Act amounted to \$5,565,934.47 and are included in the previously-mentioned total liquor stores sales figures.

As shown in this report, the Board paid to the Provincial Treasurer the sum of \$42,000,000.00 on account of profits, license fees, etc. The Board also created a liability for payments to the various municipalities of a proportion of the fees received from licencees, such amount totalling \$830,013.50 which was distributed to 236 municipalities.

Additional to the above payments made by the Board, the Dominion Government received \$36,371,596.86 during the course of the year in Customs and Excise Duties and Sales and Excise Taxes on spirits, wines and imported beers purchased by the Board.

The Dominion Government also received approximately \$33,000,000.00 for malt duties and taxes on domestic beers and wines sold in Ontario, the total aggregating \$70,000,000.00.

Therefore, the grand total of revenue payments received by the respective Dominion, Provincial and Municipal Governments was \$112,000,000.00 as a result of levies on alcoholic beverages sold in Ontario during the year. This amount was exclusive of Dominion and Provincial Corporation and Municipal Realty taxes paid by the respective manufacturers and licence holders.

BREWERIES AND BREWERS' RETAIL STORES

The undernoted corporate names of three breweries were changed in the twelve months' period:

The Carling Breweries Limited, Toronto, from O'Keefe's Brewing Company (West Toronto) Limited, as of November 15, 1951; O'Keefe's Old Vienna Brewery Limited, Windsor, from O'Keefe's Brewery (Walkerville) Limited, as of November 15, 1951; The Carling Breweries Limited, Tecumseh, from Old Comrades Brewery Limited, as of February 4, 1952.

On March 31, 1952, there were 21 Ontario and 3 Quebec breweries licensed to sell their products in Ontario. The decrease in the number of Quebec breweries was accounted for by The Frontenac Breweries Limited changing their name and ceasing to operate in the Province of Ontario.

The usual analyses were made of all brands of beer produced by the Ontario and Quebec breweries which are sold in this province, the object of these analyses, as in the past, being to ensure that beer sold in Ontario is in conformity with the Regulations passed pursuant to The Food and Drugs Act of Canada.

The Board's laboratory at the Toronto Warehouse, Fleet and Jarvis Streets, Toronto, makes it possible to conduct on its own premises an analysis of all brands of spirits, wine and beer.

WINERIES

The Board continued the analytical examination of all Ontario wines, it being determined that all Ontario Wineries were conforming with the Regulations of the Board.

The premises of all Ontario Wineries were visited by the Board's Inspectors during the year, as were the plants of the seven Sacramental Wine Vendors.

On March 31, 1952, there were 17 wineries operating in Ontario. Branch Retail Stores numbered 47 and sales were conducted direct from the premises of 2 wineries.

The reduction in the number of wineries was caused by the purchase by The T. G. Bright & Co., Limited, of The Kitchener Wines Limited, on November 30, 1951, the former thereby acquiring an additional branch retail store.

Last year 19,047 gallons of grape spirits were used for wine fortifications, while during the year under review 30,169 gallons were used for such purpose.

HOME-MADE WINE PERMITS

Regulations require that any person manufacturing more than 100 gallons of home-made wines must obtain a permit from the Board. Six were issued during the year ending March 31, 1952.

PERMITS

855,874 individual annual liquor permits were issued for the year ending March 31, 1952. Individual permits sold to non-residents, valid for a period not exceeding one month, numbered 103,343. In addition, 2,627 special permits were issued to physicians, druggists, hospitals, etc.

1,847 special permits were issued to druggists, 4 of which were cancelled during the year. These special permits allowed druggists to purchase spirits in limited quantities for compounding medicine or for use as a solvent or preservative. They were also permitted to buy rubbing alcohol for resale. Officials of the Board conducted 931 inspections of drug stores during the year and these inspections included an examination of the records of the sales of rubbing alcohol which druggists are required to maintain.
