I have the honour to submit herewith the Twenty-Seventh Report of The Liquor Control Board of Ontario for the twelve months fiscal period which ended the 31st of March 1953.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

On the Balance Sheet is shown a certification by the Auditors of the Board, Messrs. Dick, Bond, Hetherington and O'Loane, Chartered Accountants. The amount of fixed assets of \$1,375,485.97 represents the value, less depreciation of \$5,032,627.30, of the Board's real estate, together with all furniture, fixtures, machinery and equipment in the stores, warehouses and offices. The real estate consists of land and preliminary construction work situated on Fleet Street between Cooper and Freeland Streets, Toronto; land and warehouse building at 125 Fleet Street East, Toronto; land and warehouse at 210 Victoria Avenue, Fort William and land and store building at 28 Silver Street, Cobalt.

The Confiscated Stock item represents a balance due for forfeited liquor which was purchased by the Board after analytical examination and in accordance with the Provisions of Section 116(2) of The Act. The licence fees liability constitutes amounts deposited as transfer fees with the Board by sundry licencees whose transfer of ownership had not been approved by The Liquor Licence Board as of March 31, 1953.

The Reserve Account for insurance remained at \$1,000,000.00 but the Reserve Account for contingencies created to provide for anticipated expenditures in connection with the new building at Fleet and Cooper Streets, Toronto, was increased to \$3,500,000.00.

Contingent liabilities amounted to \$6,480,472.46. These items represent the value of undelivered orders to an extent of \$3,774,864.35 and also the amount of \$2,705,608.11 for Customs and Excise duties which are payable on the goods which were in bond in the warehouses on March 31, 1953.

These contingent liabilities have no reflection on the trading profits of the Board.

The Profit and Loss Account shows sales for the 12 months from Liquor Control Board stores of \$109,656,476.51.

The same account shows a gross trading profit of \$41,596,646.31 with total expenses including depreciation of \$8,520,639.63 which resulted in a net trading profit of \$33,076,006.68. The amount shown as other revenue of \$12,992,336.31 was derived from permit sales, fees and taxes on brewers and wine manufacturers and their products, from licence holders' fees and from fines. The item of \$2,000,000.00 is the sum previously referred to as being an additional contingent liability which was applied against this year's profits and which, when deducted, resulted in the net income carried forward to the Surplus Account of \$44,068,342.99. The expenses incurred by the Liquor Licence Board amounting to \$456,662.05 are included in the total expense amount.

For the purpose of comparison, the percentage that cost of stock sold, miscellaneous earnings and expenses and other revenue bear to the sales are given for the fiscal year 1951-1952 and the twelve months' period herewith reported upon.

The Surplus Account shows a balance at the commencement of the period of \$22,421,251.13, this being the amount carried forward from the previous year's operations which had not been transferred to the Provincial Treasurer. After adding the current year's net income of \$44,068,342.99 and deducting \$2,271.21 which represented sundry adjustments, an accumulative figure was produced of \$66,487,322.91. Thereupon, for the purpose of showing a surplus which would be available for transfer to the Provincial Treasurer, an amount of \$15,760,706.67 was deducted as being an appropriation for the purchase of merchandise and assets. Payments to the Treasury during the year were \$44,000,000.00. Therefore, the surplus profits on March 31, 1953, amounted to \$6,726,616.24 and, being a liability to the Provincial Treasurer, were carried forward to the Balance Sheet, as was the amount appropriated.

A statement showing the expenses of administration and operation for the twelve months is also attached. Individual percentages in comparison to the total sales are given for the 12 months and also for the preceding fiscal period. On March 31, 1953, the staff of The Liquor Control Board and The Liquor Licence Board numbered 1,615 employees, 131 of these being part-time or seasonally employed, compared with 1,566 permanent and 122 part-time at the previous year-end.

All Liquor Control Board stores, brewers' retail stores, breweries and wineries from which alcoholic beverages are sold in Ontario, as of March 31, 1953, are listed on Schedule I and a classification of permits and licences issued appears on Schedule II.

SALES

The sale of spirits, beer and wine from liquor stores during the 12 months amounted to \$109,656,476.51. The net value of beer sold from breweries and brewers' retail stores, exclusive of any charge for container, totalled

\$131,390,090.65. Sales of Ontario wine made direct to customers from licenced Ontario wine sales offices and, where permitted, from winery premises, amounted to \$4,836,000.83.

Sales of spirits, wine and imported beer from Liquor Control Board stores to licencees operating under The Liquor Licence Act amounted to \$6,538,718.97 and are included in the previously-mentioned total liquor stores sales figures.

As shown in this report, the Board paid to the Provincial Treasurer the sum of \$44,000,000.00 on account of profits, license fees, etc. The Board also created a liability for payments to the various municipalities of a proportion of the fees received from Licencees, such amount totalling \$877,619.25 which was distributed to 239 municipalities.

Additional to the above payments made by the Board, the Dominion Government received \$34,371,726.97 during the course of the year in Customs and Excise Duties and \$5,708,600.32 for Sales Tax on spirits, wines and imported beers purchased by the Board.

The Dominion Government also received approximately \$39,000,000.00 for malt duties and taxes on domestic beers and wines sold in Ontario, the total aggregating \$79,000,000.00.

Therefore, the grand total of revenue payments received by the respective Dominion, Provincial and Municipal Governments was \$124,000,000.00 as a result of levies on alcoholic beverages sold in Ontario during the year. This amount was exclusive of Dominion and Provincial Corporation and Municipal Realty taxes paid by the respective manufacturers and licence holders.

BREWERIES AND BREWERS' RETAIL STORES

The corporate names of one Ontario brewery and a Quebec brewery which is licensed to sell in Ontario were changed in the twelve months' period:

The Ranger Brewing Co., Limited, Kitchener, from Blue Top Brewing Co., Limited, as of April 15, 1952; and The National Breweries Limited, Montreal, Quebec, to Dow Brewery Limited, as of May 19, 1952.

On March 31, 1953, there were 21 Ontario and 2 Quebec breweries licensed to sell their products in Ontario, the number of Ontario breweries remaining unchanged from the previous year-end and the reduction in the number of Quebec breweries being caused by the above-stated amalgamation of the National and Dow Breweries.

There were no additional brewers' retail stores opened during the twelve months period, nor were there any stores closed.

One brewers' retail store moved to a new location:

March 25, 1953 — #47 32 Erie St., — to — 429 Huron St., Stratford.

The number of brewery retail stores in operation on March 31, 1953 was 171.

BEER SALES

The following table shows the gallonage of domestic beer sold in Ontario during the years 1949 to 1953 inclusive. Sales to other provinces and to destinations outside the Dominion are also tabled.

All brands of beer produced by the Ontario breweries and the Quebec breweries which are sold in this Province were periodically analysed, as in the past, thus ensuring that beer sold in Ontario is in conformity with the Regulations passed pursuant to The Food and Drugs Act of Canada.

The Board receives from its laboratory at the Toronto Warehouse, Fleet and Jarvis Streets, Toronto, current analytical reports of all brands of spirits, wine and beer.

WINERIES

The premises of all Ontario wineries were visited by the Board's Inspectors during the year, as were the plants of the seven Sacramental Wine Vendors.

On March 31, 1953, there were 17 wineries operating in Ontario. Branch Retail Stores numbered 47 and sales were conducted direct from the premises of 2 wineries, there being no change compared with March 31, 1952.

Last year 30,169 gallons of grape spirits were used for wine fortifications, while during the year under review 63,083 gallons were used for this purpose.

HOME-MADE WINE PERMITS

Regulations which became effective January 1, 1940 require that any person manufacturing more than 100 gallons of home-made wines must obtain a permit from the Board. Four were issued during the year ending March 31, 1953.

PERMITS

887,666 individual annual liquor permits were issued for the year ending March 31, 1953. Individual permits sold to non-residents, valid for a period not exceeding one month, numbered 102,848. In addition 2,680 special permits were issued to physicians, druggists, hospitals, etc.

1,863 special permits were issued to druggists during the year, their purpose being to allow druggists to purchase limited quantities of spirits for compounding medicine or for use as a solvent or preservative. They were also permitted to buy rubbing alcohol for resale. Officials of the Board conducted 845 inspections of drug stores during the year and these inspections included an examination of the records of sales of rubbing alcohol.
